Disability Reframed is a FREE, ongoing community film series exploring the portrayal of disability in film. The film series provides a forum for the disability community and wider public to:

- ★ explore popular culture
- \star share a love of cinema
- \star celebrate disability culture
- \star socialize and share experiences of diversity and discovery
- ★ challenge the way people with disabilities are portrayed in pop culture

The series is run by a partnership between the City of Boston Mayor's Commission for Persons with Disabilities and the Cambridge Commission for Persons with Disabilities.

Disability Reframed film screenings:

- ★ are held every 6-8 weeks year-round
- ★ mix major feature films with small independent films and documentaries
- \star alternate between Boston and Cambridge venues
- \star are followed by an informal discussion, often led by a guest host
