Background

The Cambridge Traffic, Parking, and Transportation Department has received a petition from a group of Cambridge residents, requesting that we add "Parking by Permit Only" signs in the Cambridge Highlands. The City is conducting a survey to gauge neighborhood interest in this change.

Streets Included

If approved, the City will add "Parking by Permit Only" signs to the following streets:

- Normandy Ave
- Griswold Street
- Loomis Street

- South Normandy Ave
- Sunset Road
- Normandy Terrace

If we make this change, all residents who park on the street will need to purchase Resident Parking Permits and visitors will need to use Visitor Parking Permits. (Learn more about these on the other side of this flyer.)



Cambridge Parking Permit Information

If there is neighborhood support, the City of Cambridge will add "Parking by Permit Only" signs in the Cambridge Highlands neighborhood.

Permits cost \$25 and require proof of Cambridge residency. If you apply for a Resident Parking Permit, your vehicle must be registered with the Massachusetts RMV in your name, at your Cambridge address.

You must apply for a new Resident and/or Visitor Parking Permit each year. Permits expire every year on March 31.

Resident Parking Permits

- An individual may have no more than four vehicles with Resident Parking Permits.
- You may only use a Resident Parking Permit on a vehicle intended for personal use.
- If you get a new car or your license plate changes, you must apply for a new permit.

Visitor Parking Permits

- All households are eligible for one Visitor Parking Permit
- Visitor Parking Permits may only be used in a specific zone near your home.
- Residents of Cambridge may not use Visitor Parking Permits.
- Vehicles using a Visitor Parking Permit must move after 24 hours.
- A vehicle using a Visitor Parking Permit cannot park in the same area for more than three days out of the week (excluding Sundays).

Other permit types

- Contractors may park vehicles with commercial license plates in "Parking by Permit Only" locations for up to three days without a permit. A Visitor Parking Permit is not required. Anyone working for more than three days should apply for a Street Occupancy Permit.
- If you are hosting a one-day event at your home, you can submit a Parking Consideration Application requesting that guests be able to park near your home without permits.
- We issue temporary parking permits, extended visitor parking permits, permits for rental vehicles, permits for moving trucks, and more. Learn more about these options under "Unique Circumstances" at www.cambridgema.gov/parking-permits
