Problem: Congestion on Cambridgepark Drive During the Evening Commute


- Alewife area has suffered congestion for a number of years
 - Regional traffic (82% of traffic on Alewife Brook Parkway is through traffic)
 - Commuters
 - Local residents
 - MBTA parking garage access
- Recently, drivers have reported increasing levels of congestion
 - Increased queue lengths on Cambridgepark Drive
 - Gridlock/blocking the box at intersections on Cambridgepark Drive
 - Delays exiting area parking garages
 - Dangerous driver behavior, including wrong-way driving leading to pedestrian crash



MassDOT Improvements at Route 2 and Route 16

Project purpose: perform minor widening, eliminate a merge condition, and improve throughput capacity and vehicle queue storage

- Widen the departure of Route 2 westbound to provide three travel lanes
- Widen the existing left turn lane on Route 2 eastbound to Alewife Brook Parkway (Route 16) northbound
- Widen the right turn lane from Alewife Brook Parkway southbound to Route 2 westbound to provide double right turn lanes
- Slight widening to existing roadways to provide 2-11 foot lanes with 2 foot shoulders
- Signal timing changes

Future Planning Context

- Envision Cambridge

Possible Issues for Investigation

- Complete Route 2/Route 16 signal coordination
- Cut-through traffic from Route 2 exit
- Operation of intersections at Cambridgepark Drive / Alewife Brook Parkway/ Rindge Avenue
- Use of MBTA garage entry/exits
- Other traffic management measures (e.g. Police details)

Long Term: Continued Changes in Mode Share

- Encourage participation in Alewife Transportation Management Association
- Strategies to make it easier to walk, bike, and take transit
 - Improve transit in Alewife area (e.g. bus priority, commuter rail station)
 - Bicycle-pedestrian bridge
 - Partner with area businesses on future Hubway locations

- Signal timing improvements
- Tests of potential traffic management strategies
