



Carl Barron Plaza Gateway - General Information

- Artwork that responds to the character of Central Square
- Opportunity to shape the public's experience of a threedimensional form
- Reflect the multi-cultural character of Central Square

Carl Barron Plaza Gateway -Background

- Central Square is a cultural and business district
- Cultural offerings, diverse community, and transit hub

Carl Barron Plaza Gateway – Opportunity

- Paint a two-dimensional design on a large-scale, threedimensional ribbon arch
- Budget: Approx. \$50,000

Carl Barron Plaza Gateway - Artwork Requirements

- General contractor sets up ribbon sections and supplies paint
- Artist selects colors and coordinates with the GC
- Three-coat system:
- 1. RD Monoguard (GC),
- 2. RD Monoguard (artist) Brush, roll, or spray
- 3. Hydrograph HP finish (GC)




Grand Junction Multi-Use Path -Opportunity

- Two opportunities available


1.

- Continuous stretch of approximately 200-300 linear feet of fencing.
- 2. Creating a series of shorter murals at selected points along the path.
- Both offer comparable scope and square footage for artwork.



CALL TO ARTISTS
The City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, invites you to submit your qualifications to be eligible for a \$100,000 public art commission for The Foundry, an adaptive reuse project to build a community center for creativity and collaboration.
Submit your qualifications online to the Cambridge Arts artist registry by September 17, 2018 to be considered for this commission.
Garbridge Arts, the official arts agency for the City, is seeking qualifications from artists or artist teams
Cambridge Arts, the official arts agency for the Lty, is seeking qualifications from artists or artist teams interested in creating a public artwork integrated into the renovation of the Foundry, a historic industrial building that will become a center for arts, entrepreneurship, and technology through a partnership of the City of Cambridge and Cambridge Redevelopment Authority.

Cambridge Arts seeks artists with public art experience. The \$100,000 commission will cover all services from design through final installation/implementation, including artist fee, travel, community meetings, fabrication, insurance, transportation, installation, and coordination with consultants and City staff.

From this RFQ, three finalists will be selected by an art jury and paid to submit concept proposals. Final selection of one artist or team will be made by a stakeholder group based on in-person proposal presentations and interviews.
