3. Director of Libraries Report / Library Updates

• PLA/ALA Updates

- PLA President-elect Sonia Alcántara-Antoine and PLA representatives were in Cambridge on November 30 and visited the Main Library.
- ii. Director of Libraries was in Washington, D.C., in November for Committee on Legislation duties, including creating ALA legislative priorities.
- iii. Trustee Roosevelt and Director of Libraries hosted the executive director of ALA for a dinner.
- iv. Trustee Woods would love to discuss what the Director of Libraries has learned in her work with PLA and ALA, and how it's translating to her job as Director of Libraries. This discussion will be put on a future Trustees meeting agenda to discuss.

New City Manager Updates

- Director of Libraries gave an update on getting to know the new City Manager and funding priorities. Director of Libraries asked the Trustees to amplify the work the Library is doing for the community.
- ii. Director of Libraries to work on communications about the Library's impact, and will forward to the Board for feedback.
- iii. Chair Langley mentioned as CMO is getting settled, if there's a way to communicate for the CMO what the Library does at the Branch level to show

- the scope of our work. Director of Libraries will mention to the City that we are happy to host more meet & greets at other branches.
- iv. Trustee Woods mentioned the idea of involving the Friends of the Cambridge Public Library and the Library Foundation in learning more about the library's strategic work. The Director of Libraries is hoping that when we have new Trustees, we could do a session for new board members, as well as the boards for the Friends of the Cambridge Public Library and Library Foundation, to meet managers of different departments/areas of the libraries.

Infrastructure/Facilities

- City recently power-washed main entrance into Central Square Branch and the City has stepped up wellness checks for community members who congregate in the area.
- ii. Director of Libraries will be meeting with Deputy City Manager and Assistant City Manager for Finance to discuss upgrades in the Lecture Hall.
- iii. Walk through of O'Connell for HVAC work scheduled for December 7 and bids to do work are due on December 15
- iv. House Architect is revising bid documents for Lewis Room work at the Central Square Branch Library and we now have approval to test ceiling paint. The roof leaks have been sealed!
- v. It is promising that City Councilors are thinking about the library for the public good for example at Central Square and Alewife.
- vi. Director McCauley mentioned that Alewife is building/expanding in a big way.
