Your Cambridge Public Library card offers access to ProQuest African American Heritage, a database exclusively devoted to African American family history research.

As a consequence of slavery, research in this area can be more challenging than other genealogical inquiries. ProQuest African American Heritage helps individuals address these unique issues by bringing together records and sources critical to African American family research.

Highlights include freedman and slave records, church records, legal records, North Carolina cohabitation records, North Carolina and West Virginia marriage records, U.S. Colored Troops Records (1861-1865), and registers of slaves and free persons of color from select states and counties.

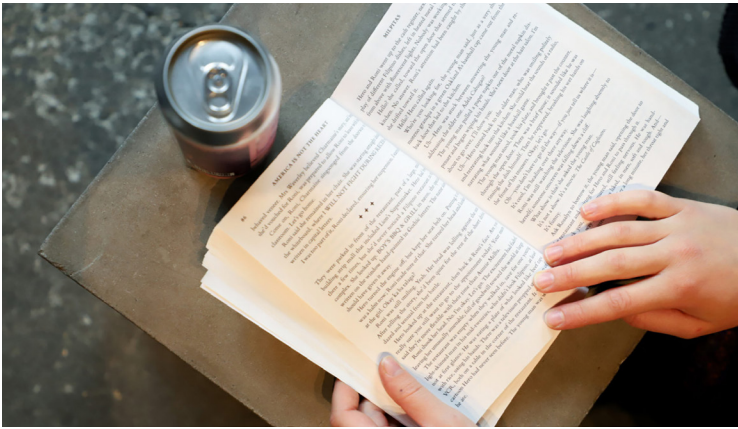
