

Diaper Circle Donations

Residents with unused diapers can drop them off at the main branch of the Cambridge Public Library for collection by Diaper Circle (diapercircle.org). Diaper Circle is a local nonprofit that partners with area cities, hospitals, and family organizations to distribute diapers to families in need. Over the past decade, the organization has provided nearly 550,000 diapers throughout the community.

Why Diaper Donations are Important:

- 1 in 2 families face diaper need (the inability to afford diapers)
- WIC and SNAP (food stamps) do not cover diapers
- babies often outgrow a size before a package is finished

What We Accept:

- new, unopened packs of diapers
- opened packs of diapers
- loose diapers (clean, of course!)
