

Public Library has been a place of learning and community where all are welcome to expand their horizons. Through the Main Library and six neighborhood branches — Boudreau, Central Square, Collins, O'Connell, O'Neill, and Valente — the Library operates as a unified system to offer free library services and programs to residents. Each year, the Library circulates over one million items, welcomes 900,000 visitors, and hosts over 2,000 free community programs. The system is funded primarily through property taxes as a department of the City of Cambridge and receives additional support from the Cambridge Public Library Foundation and Friends of the Cambridge Public Library.
