LEGAL NOTICE MID CAMBRIDGE NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION DISTRICT COMMISSION

At this time, The City of Cambridge ("City") will not be holding any non-essential public meetings due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and the City Manager's closure of all City buildings to non-essential business. On April 3, 2020, Governor Baker signed into law Chapter 53 of the Acts of 2020, An Act to Address Challenges Faced by Municipalities and State Authorities Resulting from COVID-19 ("Act"), which extends all permitting deadlines for permits issued by City multi-member boards and commissions until after the State of Emergency is lifted. In light of the extensions provided for in the Act and the closure of City buildings, at this time the City's boards and commissions will be rescheduling all public hearings in accordance with the extensions permitted under the Act. Applicants will receive notice of the new hearing date once the hearing is rescheduled, and notice will be sent to any necessary parties, advertised and posted, as required by applicable laws.
