

**CITY OF CAMBRIDGE
ORDER RESCINDING**

TEMPORARY EMERGENCY ORDER BY COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND CITY MANAGER TO CLOSE ALL TANNING, NAIL SALONS, HAIR SALONS, BARBER SHOPS, BODYWORK THERAPY AND MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS, TATTOO AND BODY-PIERCING PARLORS, EYEBROW THREADING ESTABLISHMENTS, SPAS, MARTIAL ARTS, GROUP DANCE AND EXERCISE ACTIVITIES, HEALTH CLUBS, SPAS AND FITNESS CLUBS WHETHER CONDUCTED IN A PERMITTED ESTABLISHMENT OR IN A PRIVATE RESIDENCE ISSUED ON MARCH 20, 2020

(RESCINDED EFFECTIVE MIDNIGHT 12:00 A.M. ON TUESDAY, MAY 26, 2020)

WHEREAS, in response to the outbreak of the 2019 novel coronavirus (“COVID-19”) in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, on March 23, 2020, Governor Charles D. Baker issued an Order (the “March 23, 2020 Executive Order”) ordering businesses, other than those that provide COVID-19 essential services as defined in the March 23, 2020 Executive Order as amended (“COVID-19 Essential Businesses”), to close their brick and mortar operations and operate only by remote means, which was extended through subsequent Executive Orders to May 18, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, the Commissioner of Public Health and the City Manager issued a “Temporary Emergency Order to Close all Tanning, Nail Salons, Hair Salons, Barber Shops, Bodywork Therapy And Massage Establishments, Tattoo And Body-Piercing Parlors, Eyebrow Threading Establishments, Spas, Martial Arts, Group Dance And Exercise Activities, Health Clubs, Spas And Fitness Clubs Whether Conducted in a Permitted Establishment or in a Private Residence (“Establishments”),” finding that the continued operation of such Establishments will likely contribute to the spread of COVID-19 among the staff and patrons of such establishments;

WHEREAS, in response to a sustained decline in the number of new cases and deaths linked to COVID-19, Governor Baker’s Administration issued on May 18, 2020 a plan entitled “Reopening Massachusetts” (the “Reopening Plan”) whereby businesses in Massachusetts, including, among others, hair salons and barbershops, may begin reopening in phases, with hair salons and barbershops permitted to reopen on May 25, 2020;

NOW THEREFORE, the Cambridge Commissioner of Public Health and the City Manager hereby order as follows:


1. Effective midnight (12:00 a.m.) on Tuesday, May 26, 2020 (the “Date of Revocation”), the “Temporary Emergency Order to Close all Tanning, Nail Salons, Hair Salons, Barber Shops, Bodywork Therapy And Massage Establishments, Tattoo And Body-Piercing Parlors, Eyebrow Threading Establishments, Spas, Martial Arts, Group Dance And Exercise Activities, Health Clubs, Spas And Fitness Clubs Whether Conducted in a Permitted Establishment or in a Private Residence” is hereby **RESCINDED AND REVOKED**.
2. As of the above Date of Revocation, all Establishments listed above shall be permitted to operate in accordance with: 1) the Four Phases¹ and other requirements set forth in Governor Baker’s Reopening Plan posted on the Commonwealth’s web site at: <https://www.mass.gov/doc/reopening-massachusetts-may-18-2020/download>; and the General Business Guidance and Sector Specific Protocols and Best Practices posted on the Commonwealth’s web site at: <https://www.mass.gov/info-details/reopening-massachusetts>.

¹Pursuant to Governor Baker’s Reopening Plan, only hair salons and barbershops are permitted to reopen in Phase I on May 25, 2020 (May 26, 2020 in the City of Cambridge).

3. All Establishments listed above shall continue to follow any and all guidance or orders pertaining to mitigating the spread of COVID-19 issued from time to time by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the City of Cambridge, including its Public Health, Public Works and Inspectional Services Departments.



TEMPORARY EMERGENCY ORDER BY COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND CITY MANAGER TO CLOSE ALL TANNING, NAIL SALONS, HAIR SALONS, BARBER SHOPS, BODYWORK THERAPY AND MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS, TATTOO AND BODY-PIERCING PARLORS, EYEBROW THREADING ESTABLISHMENTS, MARTIAL ARTS, GROUP DANCE AND GROUP EXERCISE ACTIVITIES, HEALTH CLUBS, SPAS, GYMNASIUMS AND FITNESS CLUBS WHETHER CONDUCTED IN A PERMITTED ESTABLISHMENT OR IN A PRIVATE RESIDENCE

WHEREAS, COVID-19, also known as Coronavirus, has become a pandemic and a public health emergency world-wide, including in the City of Cambridge (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, national governments around the world, as well as state and local governments, have promulgated emergency orders and continue to do so in an effort to restrict public gatherings of people to slow the spread of this highly infectious disease; and

WHEREAS, the continued operation of tanning salons, nail salons, hair salons, barber shops, bodywork therapy and massage establishments, tattoo and body-piercing parlors, eyebrow threading establishments, martial arts, group dance and group exercise activities, health clubs, spas, gymnasiums and fitness clubs, whether conducted in a permitted establishment or in a private residence in the City ("Establishments") will likely contribute to the spread of COVID-19 among the staff and patrons of such establishments;

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Health and the City Manager have determined that the continued operation of the Establishments in the City poses a present and imminent danger to public health, safety, or general welfare of the people of Cambridge so that it has become necessary to take extraordinary actions for the purposes of emergency management and emergency functions to protect the public; and

WHEREAS, immediate action is needed to prevent, minimize, or mitigate damage to public health, safety, or general welfare of the people which may otherwise result from COVID-19; and


WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Health and the City Manager have statutory and regulatory authority to take emergency public health measures including ordering the temporary closure of private businesses;

NOW THEREFORE, the Cambridge Commissioner of Public Health and the City Manager hereby order that all tanning salons, nail salons, hair salons, barber shops, bodywork therapy and massage establishments, tattoo and body-piercing parlors, eyebrow threading establishments, martial arts, group dance and group exercise activities, health clubs, spas, gymnasiums and fitness clubs, whether conducted in a permitted establishment or in a private residence in the City of Cambridge shall be closed by no later than **12:01 AM on Monday, March 23, 2020** except as otherwise ordered by the Governor of Massachusetts or the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

This Order shall remain in effect until further notice.
