



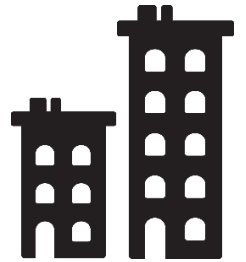

Housing Rights and Information for Renters

The COVID-19 pandemic has placed financial strain on many people, and the City of Cambridge has resources and programs to protect tenants and provide housing support. If you are a renter in Cambridge, you have many rights and resources available to you.

Rental Assistance

- If you are behind in rent, call the **Cambridge Multi-Service Center** at **617-349-6347** for assistance.
- The City's **Housing Stabilization Program** provides short term financial assistance to individuals and families in Cambridge who are experiencing housing instability.

Eviction Information

The **City's Temporary Emergency Order on Eviction Enforcement** remains in place. This means:

- Landlords cannot forcibly evict tenants from their units. **You do not need to leave your unit because your landlord tells you to or gives you a notice to quit.**
- If you receive an eviction notice from your landlord, there is a court process that must be followed. **Seek legal advice and services, and do not leave your home.**

- **The City's 2020 Tenants Rights and Resources Notification Ordinance** requires landlords to provide materials about basic tenant rights and resources if any notice to quit, notice of nonrenewal, or expiration is served.
