The Decennial Review report and an Order reauthorizing the NCD Commission was submitted to City Council on March 24, 2025. Councilor Azeem exercised his Charter Right. On March 31, the Council adopted an Order filed by Councillor Azeem to study

the actions of the district under the multifamily zoning amendments and report back to the Council in September, 2026 along with the Mid Cambridge NCD.

Applicants for Half Crown-Marsh NCD Commission membership have been submitted to the Manager's Office.

4. Amendments to Ch. 2.78, Art. III.

On October 2, 2023 the City Council amended the enabling ordinance for landmarks and NCDs.

Significant amendments affecting the Historical Commission include:

- Amended purpose statement for administration of landmarks and Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC must consider City Council goals in considering applications for certificates for landmarks and in the Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC review of Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income at landmarks or in Harvard Square CD to be advisory only.
- NCD commissions no longer need a CHC representative, except in the first 3 years.

Significant amendments affecting NCD Study Committees include:

- Petition requirements raised to 30 for landmarks and 100 for NCDs
- Establishment of new NCD study committees subject to Council approval.
- New NCD study report requirements: inclusion of all public comments and a review of current research on the impact designation has on housing and renovation costs.
- Changes to notification requirements for hearings on petitions and reports.

Significant amendments affecting NCD commissions include:

- Amended purpose statement.
- Expanded NCD commission membership with new qualifications.
- Commissions must consider City Council goals in considering projects.
- Advisory review of ADA compliance, accessibility, climate resiliency, and renewable energy features
- Commissions may not consider the appropriateness of the size and shape of new construction or additions. The Law Department has provided an opinion that this provision applies to the CHC's administration of the Harvard Square NCD.
- Commissions may not impose dimensional and setback requirements in addition to those required by the zoning ordinance in the case of new construction or additions
- No jurisdiction over Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income
- Sunset review of existing NCDs every 10 years and new NCDs 10 years after adoption
 - Half Crown-Marsh (2024, 2034)
 - Mid Cambridge (2026, 2036)
 - Avon Hill (2028, 2038)
 - Harvard Square (2030, 2040).

IV. Landmarks and Preservation Restrictions

1. Designation proceedings, with date of expiration of one-year hold:

Case L-147: 43-45 Mt. Auburn Street (9/6/2025). Consider petition to initiate a landmark study for the building (1846 double house, 1928 clubhouse addition). Petition accepted, landmark study period initiated. Discussed development opportunities with the owner in December. Discussions will resume in March and a staff recommendation will be submitted to the Commission in late spring.

2. Potential Landmarks and NCDs: Eric Hill is generating a list of potential landmarks for proactive designation of significant buildings and sites in underrepresented communities.

Eric held initial consultations with new owners at Thomas Leighton House (1834) at 22 Winter Street in East Cambridge, a vernacular Federal/Greek Revival period house built for the manager of New England Glass Company. The new owners originally sought to convert to offices, renovating the house and raising the roof, adding dormers.

3. Preservation Restrictions.

Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Attorney Stefan Nagel, an easement specialist, advised that the restriction may not expire after all (may not be a Ch. 184 restriction).

V. Project Review

1. Continuing review. 106 indicates a joint review with MHC under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. Harvard and MIT projects reviewed under their respective protocols so indicated. **Projects in bold have been actively engaged during the last reporting period.**

2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
3. MIT 106 agreement. No developments.
4. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge. Eric Hill continually updates the survey for new buildings and compiles MHC forms when necessary.

VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed in 2016; as of January 15, 2024, 1,505 remained in stock
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstituting an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).

 - New file additions are being scanned almost daily (ongoing)

2. Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see

3. BIPOC Revolutionary soldiers and Indigenous Cambridge residents (ongoing): **Sarah Burks, working with Leslie Brunetta, has identified about 15 Black revolutionary soldiers, far more than the three traditionally recognized.**

X. Capital Projects

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African-American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. Contractor Leo Greene has spent several weeks repairing headstones and catching up on deferred maintenance.

1. Institutional Preservation Grants and Affordable Housing Preservation Grants: see attached.
Available balance: \$495,661.03.

In light of the SJC ruling in the case of *Caplan vs. Town of Acton* we no longer accept grant applications for restoring stained glass windows containing religious iconography.

XII. Historic Site Markers.

Barbara Cahill, an experienced designer and project manager, has joined the staff to manage the Commission's many historic site markers. Initial priorities include creating an inventory and database, resuming work on the African American trail markers, implementing the Indigenous marker at Winthrop Park, and installing the remaining blue oval markers. Longer range projects include planning for replacement of the Bicentennial-era history stations and clearing up requests for new markers.

1. Marker Inventory
 - Data consolidation of all 200+ markers (ongoing)
 - The new inventory application, Cartegraph, has been set up for the marker inventory. An iPad is used to photograph and geolocate all the markers and other objects the Commission owns or takes responsibility for (ongoing).
 - **Cartegraph data is now syncing with the Historic Markers GIS layer.**
 - **A demonstration was provided to the Council for the Arts on how the Historical Commission uses Cartegraph for the Marker inventory.**
2. History Stations
 - History Stations have been inventoried, and all panel bolts have been tightened.

- A panel at the Porter Square History Station came off the wall during the high winds in February. We will coordinate with the DPW to reinstall the panel in the next few months.
- 2. African American Trail Markers
 - The CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers has resumed. An RFP for design and fabrication services is almost ready to send to Purchasing.
- 3. Winthrop Park Indigenous Marker
 - FY23 Participatory Budgeting project awarded \$180,000 for Native American and African American markers (see below)
 - With financial support from the Mayor's Office, we have retained Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon to consult on this project. A draft essay on the topic is complete, and we are looking at condensation and illustrations for the marker. The City Council appropriated \$30,000 in CPA funds toward the project in September 2024.
 - **Mirage Design has been retained to design the new marker, with a kickoff meeting held on April 1.**
 - **The CHC team has identified the images to be used on the marker and are collecting high-resolution images for production. (ongoing)**
 - **Mirage Design is in the process of concept design. Design options will be presented on May 8th.**
- 4. New and Existing Markers
 - **Harvard University has requested an evaluation of the Louis and Elizabeth Agassiz marker on Quincy Street (ongoing).**
 - Sennott Park marker (CS). \$20,000 CPA funds appropriated. No developments.
 - Meeting with Fred Good, Cambridge resident who created software for QR code and historic marker program. Offering free pilot program to see pros and cons of instituting this for all current and future markers.
 - **The Lechmere Point Tombstone Marker has been relocated to Centanni Park, where it can be more easily viewed.**
 - **All of the 1880 (Centennial) tombstone markers have been inventoried. We've requested DPW to powerwash them all for the Rev250 celebrations.**
 - **The Goffe marker on Mass Ave. was observed to be moving, and we were not sure if it had come off its brackets. DPW excavated and found that the brackets were secure but allowing the marker to flex, so a steel shim was used to secure it.**
 - **Preservation Award Plaques. Plaques for 2023 and 2024 have finally been received and delivered to recipients. Plaques for the 2025 event are on hand. We are ordering the 2026 plaques from our long-term vendor, who offers an affordable price but has production issues.**
 - Working with DPW to reorganize the vestibule of City Hall, which has become a catch-all space for various plaques and commemorations.
- 5. Participatory Budgeting Projects
 - Indigenous street signs project (Sarah Burks). The signs were unveiled on Friday, November 29th. **Additional signs are being installed.** The proponents of the budget initiative are evaluating other opportunities to create signage commemorating the Indigenous history of Cambridge.

6. City portrait collection. At Mayor Simmons' request most of the mayoral portraits on the second floor have been placed in storage.
7. Cambridge Women's Heritage Project (Sarah Burks). New Harvard Square publication is out. A volunteer is working on developing online biographies from CHC files. Assisted a Mayoral intern with a project on elected officials.
8. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)
 - The project received a \$20,000 grant from the Mass Humanities oral history initiative for recording equipment, public programs, and an exhibit.
 - Received \$3,500 from the Cambridge Community Foundation for general operating expenses and for projects including the bookmarks, continuation of oral history gathering, and design of an exhibit of historic photographs collected by Project members and oral history participants.
9. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:
10. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her submission of the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers firm in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020, and Larchwood streetscape in 2019.
11. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and

SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge “to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized.” CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. No developments.

12. Mayor’s Summer Youth Program (KR). Not active in 2024.
13. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie has been reappointed as CHC representative on the committee.
14. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. The products of his work are featured on the CHC website.
15. **Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community. The project to rewrite the plaques at Winthrop Park from an Indigenous perspective is underway. Meanwhile, a Participatory Budgeting project allocated funds to commemorate Indigenous place names (see above). We have formed a committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts to steer the project. The group meets monthly and we hope it will become a permanent advisory committee like the Cambridge Black History Project.**
16. University Park history. In 2022 summer intern Henry Schmitt researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge. We hope to create a blog post on this topic.
17. Revolution 250 (Kit). Sarah and Kit met with the Cambridge 250th committee to discuss how best to use a \$65,000 grant the Massachusetts Office of Travel and Tourism awarded to Cambridge. Projects include relocating a marker in East Cambridge to a more prominent position (**complete**); updating a walking tour brochure; supporting research into overlooked populations, including Black soldiers, women and children, and Indigenous fighters from various Tribal communities; and an online StoryMap.
18. Municipal Records Management. After literally decades of advocacy, we have been authorized to join with the City Clerk and IT to explore a centralized approach to digital records management for the city. The City Clerk has hired the city’s first records manager position and will soon advertise for an archivist.
19. Participatory Budgeting. Working through the African American Trail and Indigenous signage projects from previous years. **No FY25 PB projects involve the CHC.**

XV. Budgets, Personnel, and Facilities.

1. CHC’s FY26 budget of \$759,870 has been approved by the Manager and Budget Office and will be presented to the City Council in April. A reduction from \$1,091,870 in FY25 reflects the reallocation of benefits to another budget line.
2. Viv Williams, the Commission’s archivist, has resigned as of February 21st to take a position at the Boston Public Library. **We’ve received more than 70 applications for the position; interviews are underway.**
3. **Assistant Director Kit Rawlins will retire in the next few months. The AD position will be restructured to include more responsibility for the preservation grants program.**
4. **Chandra, Sarah and I have interviewed eleven candidates for appointment to the Commission. Deputy City Manager Owen O’Riordan will join us to interview a short list of six candidates.**
