The Decennial Review and an Order reauthorizing the NCD Commission was submitted to City Council on March 24, 2025. On March 31 the Council adopted an Order to study the actions of the district under the multifamily zoning amendments and report back to the Council in September 2026 along with the Mid Cambridge NCD.

#### **4. Wyman Road NCD (proposed). Petition received and verified (see agenda)**

#### 5. Amendments to Ch. 2.78, Art. III.

On October 2, 2023, the City Council amended the enabling ordinance for landmarks and NCDs.

Significant amendments affecting the Historical Commission include:

- Amended purpose statement for administration of landmarks and Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC must consider City Council goals in considering applications for certificates for landmarks and in the Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC review of Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income at landmarks or in Harvard Square CD to be advisory only.
- NCD commissions no longer need a CHC representative, except in the first 3 years.

Significant amendments affecting NCD Study Committees include:

- Petition requirements raised to 30 for landmarks and 100 for NCDs
- Establishment of new NCD study committees subject to Council approval.
- New NCD study report requirements: inclusion of all public comments and a review of current research on the impact designation has on housing and renovation costs.
- Changes to notification requirements for hearings on petitions and reports.

Significant amendments affecting NCD commissions include:

- Amended purpose statement.
- Expanded NCD commission membership with new qualifications.
- Commissions must consider City Council goals in considering projects.
- Advisory review of ADA compliance, accessibility, climate resiliency, and renewable energy features
- Commissions may not consider the appropriateness of the size and shape of new construction or additions. The Law Department has provided an opinion that this provision applies to the CHC's administration of the Harvard Square NCD.
- Commissions may not impose dimensional and setback requirements in addition to those required by the zoning ordinance in the case of new construction or additions
- No jurisdiction over Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income
- Sunset review of existing NCDs every 10 years and new NCDs 10 years after adoption
  - Half Crown-Marsh (2024, 2034)
  - Mid Cambridge (2026, 2036)
  - Avon Hill (2028, 2038)
  - Harvard Square (2030, 2040).

#### IV. Landmarks and Preservation Restrictions

1. Shell Spectacular Sign, Memorial Drive. Communicating with Shell Oil Corporation and station manager on the deteriorated condition of the illumination of the Shell Sign (a Cambridge

landmark.) The long-term lease by 7-11 Corporation requires their maintenance and upkeep of the sign. The former contractor, Back Bay Sign, is no longer in business, but owners have been in touch with a new company and are ordering custom parts for the sign.

2. Designation proceedings, with date of expiration of one-year hold:

Case L-148: 17 Story St. (aka 127 Mt Auburn St.) (8/14/2026). Petition to initiate a landmark designation study of the property containing the Harriet Jacobs house accepted on August 14, 2025. Ongoing.

Case L-149: 84 Magazine St., by Thomas & Martha Sieniewicz, owners (1/7/2027). Request to consider initiation of landmark study of 1867 house approved. Ongoing.

**Case L-150: 9 Wyman Rd., by petition of registered voters. Commission met on May 7 and declined to initiate a study.**

Potential Landmarks and NCDs:

- Eric Hill is generating a list of potential landmarks for proactive designation of significant buildings and sites in underrepresented communities.
- Eric held initial consultations with new owners at Thomas Leighton House (1834) at 22 Winter Street in East Cambridge, a vernacular Federal/Greek Revival period house built for the manager of New England Glass Company. The new owners originally sought to convert to offices, renovating the house and raising the roof, adding dormers.

3. Preservation Restrictions.

Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). Public posting of park rules still required.

## V. Project Review

1. Continuing review. 106 indicates a joint review with MHC under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. Harvard and MIT projects reviewed under their respective protocols so indicated. **Projects in bold have been actively engaged during the last reporting period.**

Auburn Street; Athenaeum Press (215 First Street) reno and expansion; Irving & Casson-A.H. Davenport factory redevelopment; Hooper-Lee-Nichols house sale; 1740 Mass. #### VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

1. Orchard Street NRD (Cambridge and Somerville). A summer intern prepared a draft Area Form for MHC in 2022. The Somerville Historic Preservation Commission participated. Waiting for the Somerville Historic Preservation Commission staff to offer consent.
2. Harvard and MIT 106 agreements. No developments.
3. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge. Eric Hill continually updates the survey for new buildings and compiles MHC forms when necessary.

#### VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed in 2016; as of January 15, 2024, 1,505 remained in stock. The Office of Equity & Inclusion ordered copies of BOC to pass out to visiting dignitaries, as the City Manager was very impressed with the book
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstating an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).

2. Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see <http://cambridge.dlconsulting.com/cgi-bin/cambridge?a=p&p=home&e>. The post-1923 Chronicle is password-protected because of copyright issues.
3. BIPOC Revolutionary soldiers and Indigenous Cambridge residents (ongoing): Sarah Burks, working with Leslie Brunetta, has identified about 15 Black revolutionary soldiers, far more than the three traditionally recognized.
4. Sarah Burks has determined that the house at 27 Grant Street was constructed by Darby Vassall on Linnaean Street in 1829 with materials from a “ten-footer” shed brought from Beacon Hill and moved to its present location in 1865.

#### X. Preservation Projects

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year. A recent assessment indicates that patination should be renewed next year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. Contractor Leo Greene returned in September to repair headstones and catch up on deferred maintenance.

## XII. Historic Site Markers (Barb Cahill).

1. Marker Inventory
  - Data consolidation of all 200+ markers (ongoing)
  - Cartograph data is now syncing with the Historic Markers GIS layer.
  - Data review and clean-up of all the marker inventory is in progress. (ongoing)
  - Identifying property owners and placement of missing or stored blue ovals (ongoing).
  - Blue Ovals in storage will be installed over the summer. Focusing on property owners and placement of missing or stored AAHT markers (ongoing).
  - **Focusing on African American Heritage Trail markers, property owners, and placement of missing or stored AAHT markers (ongoing)**
2. Blue Ovals (Bicentennial Markers)
  - **6 of the 15 blue ovals in storage have been drilled and prepped for installation.**
  - **Old Stone Wall marker will be installed soon.**
  - **The remaining blue ovals need permission from the property owners.**
3. History Stations
  - History Stations have been inventoried, and all panel bolts have been tightened.
  - **A Summer Youth crew will be conducting maintenance this season.**
2. African American Trail Markers
  - The CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers has resumed.
  - Preparing an RFP for prototype design.
  - **Review and update of the AAT marker texts and images is underway (20% complete). Preparing to share updated drafts with a review committee.**
3. Winthrop Park Indigenous Marker
  - FY23 Participatory Budgeting project awarded \$180,000 for Native American and African American markers (see below). With financial support from the Mayor's Office, we retained Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon to consult on this project. The City Council appropriated \$30,000 in CPA funds toward the project in September 2024.
  - **Final editing, image selection, and 90% design completed and approved and sent to Mirage, the designer**
  - **CHC staff presented a full-scale mock-up of the marker to the Winthrop Park Trust on March 12, 2026. The Trustees were happy with the design and content. The CHC and the Trustees agreed upon the placement of the marker on the Winthrop St side of the park, behind the fence railings and just to the left of the entrance to the park at Winthrop St and JFK St.**
  - **Fabricators and have been sent a request for quotes.**
4. New and Existing Markers and Projects
  - Louis and Elizabeth Agassiz marker replacement. Harvard University has developed a contextual Quincy Street marker. CHC has provided edited content and images. Harvard has agreed to retain Roll-Barresi Associates for design and installation. **Harvard had been communicating with the CHC regarding the Memorandum of Understanding for the project**
  - Sennott Park marker (CS). \$20,000 CPA funds appropriated. No developments.
  - Working with DPW to reorganize the vestibule of City Hall, which has become a catch-all space for various plaques and commemorations.

- **Revolutionary cannon carriages.** A contract for replacement of the three cannon carriages on the Common has been awarded to Hensen Wheelworks of South Dakota. **The DPW has removed one of the cannons with its carriage to the Mooney St facility. They will be removing the remaining carriages shortly. DPW will secure the carriages to pallets and will help load them onto Hansen's vehicle.**
- Bronze plaques and statues in Cambridge Common: A recent assessment indicates that patination should be renewed next year. (ongoing)
- **Longfellow Bust in Longfellow Park:** DPW has agreed to fund replacement of the deteriorated fiberglass bust. Robert Shure of Skylight Studios fabricate a new one from its collection of Caproni Bros. molds. **Skylight Studios has sent their quote, so the PO can be processed.**
- Indigenous Land Acknowledgment Plaque. A plaque requested by the previous mayor E. Denise Simmons, recognizing that Cambridge occupies the traditional and unceded territory of the Massachusett people, who are the original stewards of this land, has been designed and fabricated and is ready to be installed.
- **Ann Remington Ellery marker.** A marker provided by an outside group has been installed next to the gravestone of this wife of a signer of the Declaration of Independence. **The dedication will be on Monday, June 1<sup>st</sup>.**

6. City portrait collection. **The City Manager's office has requested that we re-evaluate the city's portrait collection and how it is displayed in City Hall, with the object of bringing more portraits out of storage.**
7. Cambridge Women's Heritage Project (Sarah Burks). The new website is working now. See [Cambridge Women's Heritage Project](#). While the Women's Commission staff has been laid off, Meta and Sarah will continue working on this project with volunteers and IT.
8. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)
  - The project received a \$20,000 grant from the Mass Humanities oral history initiative for recording equipment, public programs, and an exhibit.
  - Received \$3,500 from the Cambridge Community Foundation for general operating expenses and for projects including the bookmarks, continuation of oral history gathering, and design of an exhibit of historic photographs collected by Project members and oral history participants.
9. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:
10. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her report on the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020, and Larchwood streetscape in 2019. Presently working on a submission for Hubbard Avenue. **The Trump administration has cancelled this program.**
11. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (2021). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers "to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized." CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. Recommendations included contextualization rather than removal. No developments.
12. Mayor's Summer Youth Program (BC). **Hoping to have a crew doing marker maintenance.**
13. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie has been reappointed as CHC representative on the committee.
14. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. His work is featured on the CHC website.

15. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui initially facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community. A committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts steers the project and advises on other issues. Sarah Burks is working with the Manager's office and a consultant on training on Indigenous history and land acknowledgement.
16. University Park history. In 2022 an intern researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally African American community middle-class in West Cambridge. We still hope to complete research this summer.
17. Hubbard Avenue community study. GSD landscape architecture student Darius Bottorff had been studying the development of the Black community on Hubbard Avenue in North Cambridge and hopes to secure a grant to continue throughout the school year.
18. Municipal Records Management. After decades of advocacy, we have joined with the City Clerk and IT to explore a centralized approach to digital records management. The City Clerk has hired the city's first records manager position and an archivist.
19. Participatory Budgeting. Working through the African American Trail and Indigenous signage projects from previous years. No FY27 PB projects involve the CHC.
20. Central Square Urban Design Study Working with Community Development Department (CDD) on a Design Guide.
21. Cambridge 400 (Sam). History Cambridge and the Manager's office have taken the lead in planning a commemoration of the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Cambridge in 2030.
22. Boards and Commissions Improvement Project (Sarah). Organizing standard procedures for recruitment and appointments. The recognition event on April 29 attracted about 100 people.

#### XV. Budgets, Personnel, and Facilities.

1. The City Council unanimously approved the Commission's proposed FY27 budget.
2. We have hired Ashley Barrington, a Cambridge resident who most recently worked at the Harvard Art Museums, as a part-time Archives Assistant. This position is funded for the next year by a Mass. Cultural Resources Council grant, which we have received annually for many years.
3. Eric met with two future interns/volunteers: Anouk Borrás, who will be interning this summer to assist with researching and documenting early Modern buildings and other preservation projects; and Charles Johnson, a CRLS High School student and Eagle Scout who will be working on a project this summer.
