2. Avon Hill NCD (Allison Crosbie). **No meeting in September.**
Staff approvals of Certificates of Non-Applicability: 3, YTD: 12
3. Half Crown-Marsh NCD (Eric Hill). **September 9.**
Consider Draft Decennial Review Report for Half Crown-Marsh NCD and make recommendations. The Commission unanimously voted to reaffirm the existing Half Crown-Marsh NCD without modifications, as originally established by the City Council on July 30, 2007. The CHC approved the report on September 12, and on September 30 the City Council accepted the report. The Council has until March 31, 2025, to renew, amend, or abolish the district.
Staff approvals of Certificates of Non-Applicability: 7, YTD: 15
4. Amendments to Ch. 2.78, Art. III.

On October 2 the City Council amended the enabling ordinance for landmarks and NCDs.

Significant amendments affecting the Historical Commission include:

- Amended purpose statement for administration of landmarks and Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC must consider City Council goals in considering applications for certificates for landmarks and in the Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC review of Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income at landmarks or in Harvard Square CD to be advisory only.
- NCD commissions no longer need a CHC representative, except in the first 3 years.

Significant amendments affecting NCD Study Committees include:

- Petition requirements raised to 30 for landmarks and 100 for NCDs
- Establishment of new NCD study committees subject to Council approval.
- New NCD study report requirements: inclusion of all public comments and a review of current research on the impact designation has on housing and renovation costs.
- Changes to notification requirements for hearings on petitions and reports.

Significant amendments affecting NCD commissions include:

- Amended purpose statement.

- Expanded NCD commission membership with new qualifications.
- Commissions must consider City Council goals in considering projects.
- Advisory review of ADA compliance, accessibility, climate resiliency, and renewable energy features
- Commissions may not consider the appropriateness of the size and shape of new construction or additions. **The Law Department has provided an opinion that this provision applies to the CHC’s administration of the Harvard Square NCD.**
- Commissions may not impose dimensional and setback requirements in addition to those required by the zoning ordinance in the case of new construction or additions
- No jurisdiction over Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income
- Sunset review of existing NCDs every 10 years and new NCDs 10 years after adoption
 - Half Crown-Marsh (2024, 2034)
 - Mid Cambridge (2026, 2036)
 - Avon Hill (2028, 2038)
 - Harvard Square (2030, 2040).

IV. Landmarks and Preservation Restrictions

1. Designation proceedings, with date of expiration of one-year hold:

Case L-147: 43-45 Mt. Auburn Street (9/6/2025). Consider petition to initiate a landmark study for the building (1846 double house, 1928 clubhouse addition). Petition accepted, initiating landmark study period. **No developments.**

2. Potential Landmarks and NCDs: Eric Hill is generating a list of potential landmarks for proactive designation of significant buildings and sites in underrepresented communities.
3. Preservation Restrictions.

Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Attorney Stefan Nagel, an easement specialist, advised that the restriction may not expire after all (may not be a Ch. 184 restriction).

V. Project Review

Ave and adjacent parkland; potential removal of Spanish-American War monument; **Dawes Island improvements.**

VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

1. Orchard Street NRD (Cambridge and Somerville). A summer intern prepared a draft Area Form for MHC in 2022. The Somerville Historic Preservation Commission participated. Leo Barron, a summer intern is advancing the project this summer. Waiting for the Somerville Historic Preservation Commission staff to offer consent.
2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
3. MIT 106 agreement. No developments.
4. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge. Eric Hill continually updates the survey for new buildings and compiles MHC forms when necessary.

VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed in 2016; as of January 15, 2024, 1,505 remained in stock
2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstating an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).

VIII. Archives and Collections (Viv Williams and Meta Partenheimer)

1. Cambridge Digital Architectural Survey and History (C-DASH) (Meta Partenheimer)
 - Digital Projects Archivist continues QC and file-renaming scans (ongoing)

- New file additions are being scanned almost daily (ongoing)
 - Researching and supplementing files as needed (ongoing)
 - Consultant for the project, Paul Cote, continues to bulk upload scans to the production server on a regular basis. **Paul has crafted an image screener for problematic files and is creating documentation to avoid incompatible files. He and the DPA have re-viewed Phase 3 and drafted a proposal for Phase 4. They meet weekly to discuss issues and progress**
2. Social Media Team (Meta Partenheimer): Near-daily Instagram posts, semi-weekly blog posts, and occasional Facebook posts, highlighting collections and newly digitized items. **Planning for Black Business Month theme and Lucius Paige feature in August.**

This year's theme was Archives Road Trip, prompting displays that featured traffic planning, the travel industry, and various vacationing histories. We featured 12 repositories and drew in 100+ attendees. In addition to table displays of primary source facsimiles, we were able to provide activities that were accessible to a range of age groups, including a scavenger hunt, cyanotype printing, coloring sheets, and on-demand birth certificates. Featured organizations included Arthur and Elizabeth Schlesinger Library, Cambridge Black History Project, City Clerk's Office, Cambridge Department of Public Works, Harvard Art Museums Archives, Harvard Plate Stacks Collections, History Cambridge, Lesley University Archives, Longfellow House-Washington's Headquarters National Historic Site, MIT Libraries' Distinctive Collections, and Mt. Auburn Cemetery.**
- 11. Cambridge Fire Dept. collections. CFD Capt. Steve Persson (ret.) has amassed a lifetime collection of CFD records and memorabilia that he intends to bequeath to the CHC. 3. **Miscellaneous research projects: Working with professor at William & Mary on Harriet Turner, a free woman of color from Virginia who lived and owned property in Cambridge. Died ca1890 with substantial property. Historic markers in Virginia say she led 12 enslaved persons to Canada. Also researching Ann Wales Abbot, 23 Berkeley St., for researcher who located her portrait at P.E.M., a teacher, board game designer, and author of poetry and children’s literature who a Boys Aid Club which later evolved into the Cambridge Social Union and the Abbot Industrial School, whose instructor went on to direct the Rindge MTS.**

Staff was contacted by the owners of 26 Clinton Street, who uncovered a cannonball when landscaping in their garden. The owners allowed the CHC to receive the cannonball and we are working with the National Park Service to understand more about it.

X. Capital Projects

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African-American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. Fannin-Lehner Preservation Consultants has updated a 2016 conditions assessment report but will no longer be available for annual maintenance. **Leo Greene, a former Fannin employee, has spent two weeks repairing headstones and catching up on deferred maintenance.**

6. Historic Site Markers.

- Sennott Park; \$20,000 CPA funds appropriated.
- **CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers ~~on hold for lack of staff~~ resuming this month (see Personnel)**
- FY23 Participatory Budgeting project awarded \$180,000 for Native American and African American markers (see below)
- **Harvard University has requested an evaluation of the Louis and Elizabeth Agassiz marker on Quincy Street**
- Winthrop Park marker replacement. With financial support from the Mayor's Office, we have retained Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon to consult on this project. **A draft of a longer essay on the topic is nearly complete, and we are looking at a condensation and illustrations for the marker. City Council appropriated \$30,000 in CPA funds toward the project.**
- **City Council appropriated \$100,000 in FY23 to hire a staff person to oversee marker projects. A new Historic Marker Administrator is now on board**
- Indigenous street signs project (Sarah Burks). Prototypes have been prepared and locations chosen; interviews with AP, WBZ radio, Boston Globe, boston.com, and The Beacon (Mass. Municipal Association).
- **Blue oval marker commemorating Elias Howe and the invention of the sewing machine has been installed at The Engine, 750 Main Street.**

6. City portrait collection. At Mayor Simmons' request most of the mayoral portraits on the second floor have been placed in storage.

8. Cambridge Women's Heritage Project (Sarah Burks). Committee meetings have re-started.

9. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)

- The project has received a \$20,000 grant from Mass Humanities for the oral history initiative;

in addition to helping purchase recording equipment, the grant will fund public programs about the oral histories and an exhibit.

- Eight new bookmarks celebrating the lives and contributions of Black Cantabrigians are now available. Please contact Paula Paris, Chandra Harrington, or Kit Rawlins for a copy of this new series..
- Received \$3500 grant from Cambridge Community Foundation to help the project meet general operating expenses and for projects including the bookmarks, continuation of oral history gathering, and design an exhibit of historic photographs collected by Project members and oral history participants.
- At its meeting on Friday, March 22, the group agreed to create and publish a 2025 calendar illustrated with family and church photos. Important dates in both local and national Black history will be included, including birth or death dates of people on the original African American Trail, Bookmark honorees, and other Black Cantabrigians.

10. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:
11. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her submission of the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers firm in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020, and Larchwood streetscape in 2019.
12. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge “to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals - particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities - should be newly recognized.” CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. No developments.
13. Mayor’s Summer Youth Program (KR).
14. CambridgeSide Open Space Advisory Committee meeting (AC). Allison Crosbie is representing the CHC on this committee, which was formed to advise the developers of the CambridgeSide mall on improvements to the Lechmere Canal Park. Still working out the details of the improvements. Not landmark eligible IMO.
15. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie has reapplied to continue as CHC representative.
16. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. The products of his work are featured on the CHC website.
17. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community. The project to rewrite the history plaques at Winthrop Park from an Indigenous perspective has resumed. Meanwhile a participatory Budgeting project allocated funds to commemorate Indigenous place names and other features of the landscape. We are developing relationships and forming a committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts to steer the Participatory Budgeting project forward and to draft text for a new historic marker. The group meets monthly and we hope it will become a long term advisory committee like the Cambridge Black History Project.
18. University Park history. In 2022 summer intern Henry Schmitt researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge. We hope to create a blog post on this topic.
19. Revolution 250 (Kit). Prepared timeline of Revolutionary War events in Cambridge. Cambridge, Somerville, and Charlestown representatives have discussed event-sharing. **The City has**

received \$65,000 for Rev250 promotion from the state tourism board. Powder Alarm events in Somerville and Cambridge, September 1 and 2—planned and organized by the Cambridge250th group. Cambridge events included:

- **Longfellow House-Washington’s HQ NHS: Colonial era militiamen (reenactors) who taught youngsters to load and fire a (wood) musket and drill;**
- **History Cambridge: Presentation on the cause and meaning of the Powder Alarm and exhibit talk about Revolutionary-era printers;**
- **Friends of the Longfellow House: Sponsored a walking tour focused on Cambridge’s role in the Powder Alarm.**
- **September 4, moderated a panel discussion on events leading to the Powder Alarm, held at the Cambridge Public Library**

20. Municipal Records Management. After literally decades of advocacy, we have been authorized to join with the City Clerk and IT to explore a centralized approach to digital records management for the city. **The Clerk’s Office has been assigned the city’s first records manager position**
21. Participatory Budgeting. Preliminary citizen proposals for FY ’24 include redrafting historical markers to be more inclusive; recognizing the contributions of local women; and installing a memorial celebrating saxophone player Johnny Hodges.
