3. Board of Survey proceedings.

The Riverview, 221 Mt. Auburn Street (1962). Board of Survey convened on July 7 and voted to order demolition. Demolition will commence about December 2.

- 4. Demolition definition. CHC staff meets regularly with ISD staff to discuss definitions of demolition to account for changes in construction practices. A revised draft now operational includes the following triggers:
 - Relocating a building, or
 - removing 50% or more of the area of the exterior walls or roof (framing), or
 - removing a roof (including but not limited to raising the overall height of a roof, rebuilding roof to a different pitch, or adding additional stories to a building), or
 - removing 50% or more of floor framing, or
 - removing 50% or more of the foundation, or
 - removing 25% or more of the volume above grade of a building

1. Mid Cambridge NCD (Allison Crosbie). November 20.

Case MC-7293: 60 Ellery Street. Demolish building and construct 6-story building. Continued for further review.

Staff approvals of Certificates of Non-Applicability: 22, FYTD: 152.

Membership: Seven vacancies. Preliminary interviews of twenty-two candidates completed; ten shortlisted candidates will meet with City Manager's office.

2. Avon Hill NCD (Allison Crosbie). No meeting in November.

3. Half Crown-Marsh NCD (Eric Hill). No meeting in November:

The Decennial Review and an Order reauthorizing the NCD Commission was submitted to City Council on March 24, 2025. On March 31 the Council adopted an Order to study the actions of the district under the multifamily zoning amendments and report back to the Council in September 2026 along with the Mid Cambridge NCD.

4. Amendments to Ch. 2.78, Art. III.

On October 2, 2023, the City Council amended the enabling ordinance for landmarks and NCDs.

Significant amendments affecting the Historical Commission include:

- Amended purpose statement for administration of landmarks and Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC must consider City Council goals in considering applications for certificates for landmarks and in the Harvard Square NCD.
- CHC review of Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income at landmarks or in Harvard Square CD to be advisory only.
- NCD commissions no longer need a CHC representative, except in the first 3 years.

Significant amendments affecting NCD Study Committees include:

- Petition requirements raised to 30 for landmarks and 100 for NCDs
- Establishment of new NCD study committees subject to Council approval.
- New NCD study report requirements: inclusion of all public comments and a review of current research on the impact designation has on housing and renovation costs.
- Changes to notification requirements for hearings on petitions and reports.

Significant amendments affecting NCD commissions include:

- Amended purpose statement.
- Expanded NCD commission membership with new qualifications.
- Commissions must consider City Council goals in considering projects.
- Advisory review of ADA compliance, accessibility, climate resiliency, and renewable energy features
- Commissions may not consider the appropriateness of the size and shape of new construction or additions. The Law Department has provided an opinion that this provision applies to the CHC's administration of the Harvard Square NCD.
- Commissions may not impose dimensional and setback requirements in addition to those required by the zoning ordinance in the case of new construction or additions
- No jurisdiction over Affordable Housing Overlay projects or projects with a majority of units permanently reserved for households at or below 100% of Area Median Income
- Sunset review of existing NCDs every 10 years and new NCDs 10 years after adoption
 - o Half Crown-Marsh (2024, 2034)
 - o Mid Cambridge (2026, 2036)
 - o Avon Hill (2028, 2038)

o Harvard Square (2030, 2040).

IV. Landmarks and Preservation Restrictions

- 1. Designation proceedings, with date of expiration of one-year hold:
 - Case L-147: 43-45 Mt. Auburn St. (9/6/2025). Landmark study for 1846 house, 1928 clubhouse addition. **Final report to be sent to City Council for consideration on Dec. 10.**
 - Case L-148: 17 Story St. (aka 127 Mt Auburn St.) (8/14/2026). Petition to initiate a landmark designation study of the property containing the Harriet Jacobs house accepted on August 14. Ongoing.
- 2. Potential Landmarks and NCDs:
 - Eric Hill is generating a list of potential landmarks for proactive designation of significant buildings and sites in underrepresented communities.
 - Eric held initial consultations with new owners at Thomas Leighton House (1834) at 22 Winter Street in East Cambridge, a vernacular Federal/Greek Revival period house built for the manager of New England Glass Company. The new owners originally sought to convert to offices, renovating the house and raising the roof, adding dormers.
 - Contacted by the owners of 84 Magazine Street, who restored the house decades ago and are interested in landmarking. Eric Hill is working with owners and volunteer Cecelia Halle on drafting a landmark evaluation memo for consideration in January.
- 3. Preservation Restrictions.

Shady Hill Square (expires 2040). A requirement for public posting of park rules needs to be fulfilled. Attorney Stefan Nagel, an easement specialist, advised that the restriction may not expire after all (may not be a Ch. 184 restriction).

V. Project Review

- 1. Continuing review. 106 indicates a joint review with MHC under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. Harvard and MIT projects reviewed under their respective protocols so indicated. Projects in bold have been actively engaged during the last reporting period.
 - a. Public projects: Harvard Square plaza under construction; flagpole replacement at Flagstaff Park on hold; **B&M RR's Tower A and bascule bridges at North Station (106);** Fire Headquarters renovation; Palmer Street upgrade; Memorial Drive "road diet" project; new Portland Loos; City Hall interior accessibility; Broad Canal replacement bridges (106; MassDOT); Eliot Bridge reconstruction (106); funds appropriated for replacement of cannon carriages on Cambridge Common and new Washington Elm marker.
 - b. Private projects: Cambridge Gas-Light Co. building, 727 Mass. Ave.; Teddy Shoe building, 544 Mass. Ave.; former Ashton Valve Co. factory, 175 First St; 17 Fresh Pond Parkway; Sacred Heart complex affordable housing under construction; façade restoration at former Porter Theater, 2000 Mass. Ave.; 2161 Mass. Ave.; 3 Phillips Place; hotel project at 127 Mt. Auburn Street; The Riverview; Harvard Crimson office reno; Athenaeum Press (215 First Street) reno and expansion; Cambridge Skating Club alterations; Irving & Casson-A.H. Davenport factory redevelopment; potential sale of the Hooper-Lee-Nichols House by History Cambridge; 29 Follen Street development; 17 Berkeley Street alterations: 1740 Mass. Ave. multi-family development; 108-110 Auburn Street development .
 - c. Institutional projects: Met Storage adaptive reuse (MIT); Cooper-Frost-Austin house accessibility; possible demo of Forbes mansion and second Forbes house (BB&N School); Dance Complex master planning; St. Augustine Church reno; 1627 Mass. Ave. (HRI); 38-40 Banks Street development (Harvard Chabad); 23 Church St. restoration; Margaret Fuller Neighborhood House restoration and expansion (CRA); Rosovsky Hall renovation (Harvard Hillel); 1124 Mass. Ave (Sigma Chi fraternity); Wadsworth House accessibility, exterior

restoration; **New School of Music, 25 Lowell Street;** Eliot/Kirkland Houses Renewal (HU); **renovation planning at** St. Mary's, **St. Francis,** and Sacred Heart parishes; Harvard Epworth accessibility; Greenleaf House reno and addition (HU); Engineering Sciences Lab concrete restoration (HU); Carpenter Center concrete and roof repairs (HU); Roosevelt Towers project (CHA); First Parish belfry restoration; **Harkness Commons reno (HU)**.

- VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.
 - 1. Orchard Street NRD (Cambridge and Somerville). A summer intern prepared a draft Area Form for MHC in 2022. The Somerville Historic Preservation Commission participated. Waiting for the Somerville Historic Preservation Commission staff to offer consent.
 - 2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
 - 3. MIT 106 agreement. No developments.
 - 4. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge. Eric Hill continually updates the survey for new buildings and compiles MHC forms when necessary.

VII. Publications

- 1. Building Old Cambridge. Four thousand copies were printed in 2016; as of January 15, 2024, 1,505 remained in stock
- 2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print. A recent Council Order requested a report on the feasibility of reinstituting an oral history program that would focus on the Black community (not feasible with present funding and staffing).
- VIII. Archives and Collections (Janin Escobedo-Garcia and Meta Partenheimer)
 - 1. Cambridge Digital Architectural Survey and History (C-DASH), (Meta)
 - New file additions (ongoing)
 - DPA and consultant meet weekly to discuss progress (ongoing)
 - Determining workflow and tools for ongoing file additions (ongoing)
 - Phase Four underway. Developer/consultant, Paul B. Cote, continues to update documentation, track/document Omeka health stats, and liaise with Omeka staff on customizations.
 - ITD systems admin team has completed their review of CDASH structure in anticipation of transferring responsibility of integrity checks and file system backups to ITD.
 - Paul has written a proposal for Phase Five. He is investigating fixes for sideways images, created workflows to fix integrity issues, and has begun work on a next generation file renamer. Sam has identified monies for the next stage of the project.
 - 2. Social Media Team (Meta Partenheimer): Near-daily Instagram posts, semi-weekly blog posts, and occasional Facebook posts, highlighting collections and newly digitized items. Highlights include a tribute to Mary Leno, examples of adaptive reuse in Cambridge, and blog on WWII rationing and salvaging that was given a plug by American Ancestors
 - Sam has put together a content calendar to support selling the publications that CHC
 carries in office for the holiday season. We hope to add in some reels (short form content) and some additional interaction components (call to action) on the stories in
 hopes of engaging the public and increasing our reach.

- 2. Cambridge Public Library. The CPA-funded Cambridge Chronicle scanning project is online; see http://cambridge.dlconsulting.com/cgi-bin/cambridge?a=p&p=home&e. The post-1923 Chronicle is password-protected because of copyright issues.
- 3. BIPOC Revolutionary soldiers and Indigenous Cambridge residents (ongoing): Sarah Burks, working with Leslie Brunetta, has identified about 15 Black revolutionary soldiers, far more than the three traditionally recognized.
- 4. Sarah Burks has determined that the house at 27 Grant Street was constructed by Darby Vassall on Linnaean Street in 1829 with materials from a "ten-footer" shed brought from Beacon Hill and moved to its present location in 1865.

X. Capital Projects

- 1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal, so we keep postponing from year to year. A recent assessment indicates that patination should be renewed next year.
- 2. Old Burying Ground. Recent research on African American burials may indicate a section reserved for them. Contractor Leo Greene returned in September to repair headstones and catch up on deferred maintenance.

2. History Stations

- History Stations have been inventoried, and all panel bolts have been tightened.
- A panel at the Porter Square History Station came off the wall during the high winds in February. We will coordinate with the DPW to reinstall the panel.

2. African American Trail Markers

• The CPA-funded project to replace deteriorated African American markers has resumed. An RFP for design and fabrication services is ready to send to Purchasing.

3. Winthrop Park Indigenous Marker

- FY23 Participatory Budgeting project awarded \$180,000 for Native American and African American markers (see below). With financial support from the Mayor's Office, we retained Indigenous historian Elizabeth Solomon to consult on this project. The City Council appropriated \$30,000 in CPA funds toward the project in September 2024.
- Mirage Design completed the concept design and presented two concepts to the CHC team on May 8th. The CHC team has chosen the direction for the design phase. Mirage presented the refined design, incorporating CHC's feedback, to the team on June 5th.
- Final editing and image selection completed. CHC is in the process of obtaining permissions for use and high-resolution copies of all selected images. Mirage is in the process of creating the final layout.
- 4. New and Existing Markers and Projects
 - Louis and Elizabeth Agassiz marker. Harvard University has developed a contextual replacement (ongoing).
 - Sennott Park marker (CS). \$20,000 CPA funds appropriated. No developments.
 - Working with DPW to reorganize the vestibule of City Hall, which has become a catch-all space for various plaques and commemorations.
 - Cannon carriages. The three cannon carriages in Cambridge Common need to be replaced with more robust versions. Historians at the USS Constitution have provided plans and specs for bidding purposes. We have received an appropriation of \$60,000 in CPA funds to cover the new construction of the carriages and shipping. **Technical specs are ready for submittal to purchasing.**
 - Washington Elm marker at Mason and Garden Streets. The new marker has been installed.
 - Bronze plaques and statues in Cambridge Common: A recent assessment indicates that patination should be renewed next year. (ongoing)
 - Longfellow Bust in Longfellow Park: Robert Shure of Skylight Studios is preparing a proposal for clean-up and resurfacing of the Longfellow Bust (ongoing).

- **6.** City portrait collection. At Mayor Simmons' request most of the mayoral portraits on the second floor have been placed in storage.
- 7. Cambridge Women's Heritage Project (Sarah Burks). The new website is working now. See <u>Cambridge Women's Heritage Project</u>. While the Women's Commission staff has been laid off, Meta and Sarah will continue working on this project with volunteers and IT.
- 8. Cambridge Black History Project (aka Black Trailblazers, formerly African American Heritage Alliance; Leslie Brunetta, Melvin Downes, Chandra Harrington, Diahanne Lucas, Frank Lucas, Paula Paris, Kit Rawlins, Jim Spencer, Karen Ambush Thande)
 - The project received a \$20,000 grant from the Mass Humanities oral history initiative for recording equipment, public programs, and an exhibit.
 - Received \$3,500 from the Cambridge Community Foundation for general operating expenses and for projects including the bookmarks, continuation of oral history gathering, and design of an exhibit of historic photographs collected by Project members and oral history participants.
- 9. Survey of Architectural History in Cambridge (Eric Hill). Misc. MHC Form B survey forms:
- 10. Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS). Allison Crosbie won second place in a national competition for her submission of the Gray Gardens subdivision designed by the Olmsted Brothers firm in 1924. Previous submissions include Lewisville in 2021, the former Harvard Botanic Garden at Linnaean and Garden streets in 2020, and Larchwood streetscape in 2019. Presently working on a submission for Hubbard Avenue.
- 11. Cambridge Advisory Committee on City Art, Memorials and Markers (CACCAMM) (CS and SB). This committee reviewed public monuments, memorials, and markers throughout Cambridge "to determine whether any of these commemorate those who were linked to the slave trade or engaged in other similarly shameful acts, (and) to determine which individuals particularly women, people of color, and those from other historically marginalized communities should be newly

- recognized." CHC staff created a web page for the committee, managed meetings, and conducted an inventory of existing memorials and markers. No developments.
- 12. Mayor's Summer Youth Program (CS). Supported Mayor's program on Harriet Jacobs.
- 13. Harvard Square Advisory Committee (AC). Allison Crosbie has been reappointed as CHC representative on the committee.
- 14. Inner Belt history. Volunteer Steve Kaiser has spent several years researching and writing about the history of the Inner Belt in Cambridge. His work is featured on the CHC website.
- 15. Cambridge Indigenous History Project. Mayor Siddiqui initially facilitated contacts with the local Indigenous community. A committee of Indigenous residents, historians, advocates, and language experts steers the project and advises on other issues. Sarah Burks is working with the Manager's office and a consultant on training on Indigenous history and land acknowledgement.
- 16. University Park history. In 2022 summer intern Henry Schmitt researched the history of the 1920s subdivision of University Park, a traditionally middle-class African American community in West Cambridge. We still hope to complete research on this topic.
- 17. Hubbard Avenue community study. GSD landscape architecture student Darius Bottorff had been studying the development of the Black community on Hubbard Avenue in North Cambridge and hopes to secure a grant to continue throughout the school year.
- 18. Revolution 250 (Kit). Projects include relocating a marker in East Cambridge to a more prominent position (complete); updating a walking tour brochure; supporting research into and commemorating overlooked populations, including Black soldiers, women and children, and Indigenous fighters from various Tribal communities; and an online StoryMap (ongoing). Projects underway include the replacement Washington Elm marker at Garden Street and the cannon carriage replacements on the Common
- 19. Municipal Records Management. After decades of advocacy, we have joined with the City Clerk and IT to explore a centralized approach to digital records management. The City Clerk has hired the city's first records manager position and an archivist.
- 20. Participatory Budgeting. Working through the African American Trail and Indigenous signage projects from previous years. No FY26 PB projects involve the CHC.
- 21. Mass Ave. Planning Study (MAPS) recommendations and report conducted by CDD and their consultant team (Eric Hill). Provided feedback and discussed potential incentives for preservation of significant buildings along upper Mass. Ave.
- 22. Central Square Urban Design Study (C³). Working with Community Development Department (CDD) on a C³ Design Guide, a supplement to the forthcoming Central Square rezoning. Staff has worked to amend a map of significant buildings in Central Square and generated a slideshow showcasing the architectural landmarks worthy of preservation as well as highlighting some significant buildings that once existed in Central Square.
