Case L-133: 137 Allston St., Saint Augustine's African Orthodox Church. Consider petition of registered voters to initiate a landmark study.

Public Hearings: Alterations to Designated Properties

Case 4232 (continued): 169 Spring St., by Dana Sajdi. Construct roof and side additions, alter windows and doors, and replace siding.

Case 4264: Burnham Hall, 99-2 Brattle St., by Lesley University. Construct fence to enclose HVAC equipment on north side of building.

Case 4265: 27 Garden St., by Longy School of Music of Bard College. Replace free-standing sign.

Case 4266: 57 JFK St., by Crimson Galeria, LP c/o Raj Dhanda. Relocate main entrance and create new tenant entrance on Winthrop St., relocate ramp to interior, rebuild steps on JFK St., construct addition, extend storefront glazing.

Case 4267: 118 Spring St., by Maria Sousa & Jose Andrade. Exterior renovations including windows, siding, trim, and new rear decks and stairs.

Case D-1548: 15 Gurney St., by 15 Gurney Street LLC. Demolish house (1922).
