### Provenance and Collection Description

The Cambridge Ephemera Collection was donated to the Cambridge Historical Commission by Charles M. Sullivan, Executive Director. Mr. Sullivan began accruing the ephemera in the collection beginning in 2002, largely through the online auction site on eBay, and continues to collect items on an ongoing basis. The initial ephemera acquired was related to buildings in Cambridge, as the focus of the Commission is on the architectural history of the city, but over time the contents broadened to include items related Cambridge industry and business, Cambridge institutions and organizations, and Cambridge local history. The collection is now primarily composed of five main series: Industry and Business, Institutions and Organizations, Photographs, General Interest, and Published Materials. Within these the user will find a range of ephemera including advertisements, company newsletters and promotional materials, business invoices, programs and bulletins from area churches and schools, publications on Cambridge and its residents, city guidebooks and maps, photographs of Cambridge sites, homes, and businesses, and published works featuring Cambridge industry, organizations, and residents. The contents of the collection thus address a range of historical Cambridge topics and complement the existing archival materials held at the Commission, as well as the oral history projects underway there. This collection would be useful to individuals studying companies and businesses active in Cambridge in the mid-19th century to the mid-20th century, as well as those with interest in photographs and other ephemera documenting general Cambridge history during that time period.

### Historical Sketch

As evidenced in this collection, the city of Cambridge has a rich industrial history. Beginning in the years after the Civil War, Cambridge's industrial base grew quickly due to the availability of cheap land, rail transportation, and close proximity to the capital city of Boston. Iron works, brick works, and glass factories, as well as furniture-making, shoemaking, and slaughterhouses flourished in East Cambridge and in Cambridgeport during the last quarter of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Central Square emerged as the lively downtown center of the city. As the 20<sup>th</sup> century dawned, Cambridge began to manufacture radios, furniture, office supplies, and office machinery. Automobile components suppliers also cropped up in the area when Ford opened a plant on Memorial Drive in 1914. By 1920, Cambridge was likened to other major American industrial cities like Detroit, Michigan and Toledo, Ohio.

The relocation of MIT from Boston to Cambridge proved to have notable impact on this thriving industrial landscape. When MIT arrived in 1916, the school focused on civil and mechanical engineering, but had little influence on its

surroundings until after World War II when radar technology was first developed there. Polaroid, founded by Edwin Land in 1937, became a major manufacturer of cameras and film. It was around this time that an industrial decline hit Cambridge, much earlier in New England than in the industrial cities in the Midwest to which it was once compared. Other factors were at work as well: Cambridge industrial buildings were beginning to deteriorate, and the workforce was substantially unionized. The industrial manufacturing prevalent in the city for nearly 75 years was gradually hollowed out and replaced by technical enterprises.

### **Arrangement Note**

The Cambridge Historical Commission maintains an archive of material on Cambridge buildings, organizations, and people. The primary collection is the Inventory of Cambridge Buildings, which documents every building in the city. Other collections include materials on Cambridge businesses and industries, transportation in all its forms, local government, biographical files, ethnic and minority groups, social history, and more. The arrangement for this collection is intended to complement the organizational structure of the Commission's collections; in most cases there are folders for each company, business, or site, labeled with its address whenever possible. Photocopies of the materials can be found in the corresponding files in the Commission's various inventories as cross-references to this archival collection. Folders are arranged alphabetically within series and sub-series unless otherwise noted. This is an open collection that will be updated on an ongoing basis.

## Scope and Content

### Series I: CAMBRIDGE INDUSTRY AND BUSINESS (1798-2013, bulk dates 1870-1942)

The materials in this series include items used in the daily work of Cambridge companies and businesses, namely letterhead, envelopes, menus, catalogs, and invoices. Promotional materials produced by the companies and businesses like advertisements, calendars, company newsletters and yearbooks, and novelty stamps and postcards also are included. Larger companies like Dover Stamping and Manufacturing, Elliott Addressing Machine Company, General Radio Company, and Simplex Electric Heating Company are well represented, while medium-size Cambridge companies like Crest Manufacturing Company and Henderson Brothers appear as well. Ephemera from several restaurants, hotels, theaters, and other small businesses owned and run by Cambridge residents can be found in this series. Oversize materials are stored separately as indicated and include several Fitchburg Railroad timetables from the 1860s as well as a Cambridge Railroad Company Driver's License issued by the City of Boston in 1884. Series II: CAMBRIDGE INSTITUTIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS (1818- circa 1969, bulk dates 1868-1903)

This series contains articles, bulletins, programs, and illustrations issued by and related to Cambridge churches, schools, and hospitals. The materials are also comprised of pamphlets and other ephemera from several Cambridge organizations, and clubs, such as the Middlesex Cycle Club and the Cambridge Toboggan Club, and local points of interest like Mount Auburn Cemetery and Fresh Pond Reservoir. Ephemera from Cambridge colleges and universities are also featured; the largest amount of items relates to Harvard University. Oversize materials are stored separately as indicated, and include an 1818 handwritten estimate for the construction of the Cambridge Powder Magazine, issued by Quarter-Master General Amos Davis, as well as a 1903 Charles River Park Cycle Track and Athletic Field Program with accompanying color bicycle maps of Massachusetts. An added historical note: the Sanatory Gymnasium was connected to the Sargent School for Physical Education, represented in Series V; the Henry Wadsworth Longfellow School at 359 Broadway is now a Cambridge Rindge and Latin high school extension. See the folder list below for all institutions, organizations, and Cambridge sites represented in this series.

Series IV: CAMBRIDGE GENERAL INTEREST (circa 1748-1971)

This series is broken down into several subseries; all are combined into topical folders, and items are arranged chronologically with undated materials at back unless otherwise noted.

*City of Cambridge Documents and Publications (1818-1946)*

Contains publications issued by the city of Cambridge or about the city of Cambridge on topics including laws and ordinances, schools, playgrounds, public recreation, water supply, neighborhood development, and fire prevention. This series contains *Statistical View of the Population of Massachusetts from 1765-1840* as well, which covers changes to the Cambridge population during that time period. The earliest dated item is an 1818 letter from Cambridge Overseers of the Poor to the Town of Waterford Overseers Poor regarding an unpaid account. There is also a copy of *The Charter and*

*Ordinances of the City of Cambridge*, which includes the Municipal Register for 1857. There are also several Cambridge ballots and petitions from city elections held in 1877, 1939 and 1940 and a Cambridge City Employees Fifteenth Annual Ball dance booklet from 1921. The final item is a Massachusetts Department of Public Works' logbook for the Commercial Avenue drawbridge in Cambridge, which lists the opening and closing times for each vessel that passed from July 1, 1946 to October 23, 1950.

#### *Historical Cambridge (circa 1811-1962)*

Includes booklets and pamphlets written on the history of Cambridge, as well as publications with historical photos of Cambridge sites such as the Longfellow House, and industrial buildings like the General Radio Company Manufacturing Building, as well as compilations such as *Views in Cambridge*. The *Cambridge. Illustrations of public buildings, Harvard College, and historical places of interest. Theatre diagrams of Boston and Cambridge* was published as a companion piece to the *Cambridge Blue Book*. Oversize materials include the sheet music for "Stick to the Dear Old Flag" by Harry Taylor and the "8<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts March and Two-Step" by James S. White, as well as an article on the Washington Elm from *Gleason's Pictorial Drawing-Room Companion*.

This subseries also includes a nineteenth-century cover addressed to "Captain David B. Edwards, Schooner Lady Clinton, Cambridge, Mass"; Cambridge was an active port for coastal shipping until the 1930s, and Edwards and the *Lady Clinton* had most likely sailed out of Southold, New York. Additional documentation on this item is included in the folder.

#### *Cambridge Residents (1748-1940)*

Consists of materials related to Cambridge residents and publications written by, about, or in reference to them. Included is *The Cambridge of 1776*, which incorporates fictitious *The Diary of Dorothy Dudley*, an autobiography written by Elizabeth Cummings Qualey, sister of E.E. Cummings, and a memoir by Thomas A. Watson, assistant to Alexander Graham Bell. There is also a pamphlet containing a genealogy of the Fuller family, as well as an auction sale catalog for the private library of William Whiting Nolen. Oversize materials include illustrated articles on the lives of Louis Agassiz and Henry Wadsworth Longfellow from *Gleason's Pictorial Drawing-Room Companion*, and a letter written by E.B. Bisco of Cambridgeport, to her brother, Thomas C. Bisco of Vermont in 1832. A small set of land leases and contracts belonging to the Dana family can be found among the oversize materials as well; these range from 1822 to 1831 and feature the signatures of siblings Edmund Trowbridge Dana (1779-1859), Elizabeth Ellery "Betsey" Dana (1789-1874), and Sarah Ann Dana (1791-1866).

This subseries also contains a small collection of financial papers belonging to the Hildreth family. A.E. Hildreth (1809-1882) was president of the Bates Manufacturing Company and at one time of the Cambridge Gas Light Company as well, and a longtime Cambridge resident. The papers are dated 1882-1889, beginning just after Hildreth's death; many reference his wife Eliza Parker Hildreth or one of their nine children or another family member. Materials include a certified copy of a letter written by A.E. Hildreth granting Power of Attorney to Edwin A. Hildreth, along with handwritten estate and executor documents, and a set of transaction receipts from the Boston banking firm R.L. Day & Company. There are also utility bills paid to the city of Cambridge and to Cambridge Gas-Light Company, bank slips to the First National Bank of Cambridge and the National Bank of Redemption in Boston, city and state tax materials, and miscellaneous checks, invoices, and financial documents.
