Notes: The titles below are as written on the document (or the top document if there is more than one folded together); or on the envelope (which may contain one or more document[s]). Capitalization may not be exactly as on the document or envelope. "Cambridge Water Works" and name of facility are sometimes omitted to avoid redundancy. The documents are of various sizes folded to approximately 4 1/4" X 9 1/4". The envelopes are also approximately this size.

Where documents and envelopes are numbered, they are listed (and filed) chronologically by document number. These numbers do not necessarily track chronologically by date. Where they are not numbered, they are listed (and filed) alphabetically by the name of an individual or company associated with the document(s), or by the subject (if no individual or company name is indicated). Occasionally, two envelopes or documents may exist with the same document number.

Some spelling errors were corrected. The ones not corrected are indicated with (sic). Questionable words are indicated with parentheses and a question mark, i.e. (account?). Abbreviations are as is on the envelope or document. Some additional information is indicated with parentheses, such as the location of some businesses. Some commas have been added for clarity. Dates are spelled out, not abbreviated.
