









As MIT rises, so does its city

AMBRIDGE - Over the past 150 years, MIT has produced dozens of Nobel laureates, and even designed the computer that guided the Apollo to the moon, accomplishments befitting one of the world's top science and engineering schools.

But it has also had a tangible impact closer to home: transforming a swath of this city's industrial riverfront with its ever-expanding campus.

Over the last decade, MIT's academic footprint has increased by more than 2.7 million square feet, its largest building boom since the federally funded post-
