FIRST SESSION

The following are matters which the Chair reasonably anticipates will be discussed, and for which public testimony may be taken. Application #170651** Fat Heady, LLC, d/b/a Whitney's Cafe, 37 JFK Street, Common Victualler All Alcohol License #99534, has applied for an Alteration of Premises to include an outdoor patio on public property. The proposed premises description is: Approximately 750 sq. ft. with 1 entrance, 2 exits, and 2 floors. Approximately 253 sq. ft. patio on public property in the parking lane. This is a re-hearing of the application the matter was previously heard and decided by the Board on September 14, 2022. However, after the meeting it was discovered the licensee failed to notice abutters in the manner required by law.
