### Welcome/Introduction

Brian spoke about his background and his feelings of what peace and social change means. He asked for input and thoughts from Commissioners. Some of the responses:

- Need to include youth as a way to “plant seeds”
- Recommendation that Brian (and others) read Creating a World that Works for All
- Need to address both the “teaching” (making people aware) functions, and the things that move the community actively in some way.
- Be aware of the “International Peace Day” (September?)
- Very important to keep the Peace Commissions presence in the neighborhoods – including the Peace Circles and building on inter-connectedness/intergenerational
- What is the relationship between oppression and peace?

**Director – reception**

After some discussion about the pros and cons of having a community reception for Brian earlier rather than later, Nancy Seymour, Gail and Betty volunteered to meet to consider the wisdom expressed during this discussion and to make a recommendation to the Commission at the May meeting. General sense seems to be sooner rather than later.

**Diego Garcia/Czech Republic (See the April Prep notes for details)**

Cathy shared the information that she had gathered a recent AFSC event on US Bases with speakers from the Czech Republic and the Diego Garcia Island.

Radhika agreed to write an article for the Chronicle about the U.S. involvement in the deportation of native people from Diego Garcia Island to make way for the construction of a military base. Brian will contact other networks to bring to their attention the ongoing struggle for restitution and return to the Island.

Brian will circulate information about the opportunity to sign an online petition in opposition to a U.S. Radar Military Base in the Czech Republic to the Commission's email list as well as the Disarmament Action lists, Cities for Peace network and the International Association for Peace Messenger Cities.
