***NOTE: This report covers crime statistics through the first half of 2026. The report's release was delayed due to the 4th of July holiday, during which a homicide occurred in Cambridge. Due to the serious nature of this incident, details have been included in the following report, but the homicide itself is not yet counted in the final numbers as it occurred on July 4, outside of the first-half 2026 coverage period. The homicide will be counted in the totals of next month's report.**



Part I Total Crime

An analysis of the serious crime statistics for the first half of 2026 points to a notable decrease of 13% in the Part One index total for Cambridge when compared with 2025. During the first six months of the year, there were 1,453 serious crimes reported in the City. For the same time period in 2025, the combined total for Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny & Auto Theft was 1,677 incidents. When measured against the five-year average, a 4% drop in the crime index has been registered.

Further analysis of the crime totals for the first six months of 2026 indicates that violent crimes recorded an 8% decrease when compared with last year. There was one homicide, 18 rapes, 31 robberies, and 153 aggravated assaults recorded from the beginning of the year through June 29, 2026.

Likewise, the numbers indicate that property crimes have dropped 14% so far in 2026 with crime totals registering significantly under the 2025 amount. The 34% decrease in shoplifting and the 21% reduction in larcenies from motor vehicles during the first six months of the year are the key trend indicators in 2026 that have driven the downward curve in the property crime index. This winter was colder and snowier than recent years, which also undoubtedly contributed to the reduction in reported crimes during the first few months of 2026.

When analyzing the serious crime totals of June 2026 versus the previous month of May 2026, there was a 15% increase in the number of index incidents, with 37 more crimes reported in June.

Part I Property Crime

Analysis of property crime totals through June 2026 reveals a 14% decrease when measured against the same time in 2025 and a 4% drop below the five-year average of 1,302.

Overall, the majority of the property crime categories recorded decreases when measured against the first six months of 2025. However, a 27% decrease in larceny from the person, a 27% drop in commercial breaks, a 21% decline in larceny from motor vehicles, and a substantial reduction of 34% in shopliftings (down 205 incidents) led to the overall reduction in property crimes so far this year. The only increase worth noting at this time is a 15% rise in bicycle thefts (up 27 incidents), which has heated up substantially in the past few months with the warmer weather.

Part I Violent Crime

From January 1st to June 29th, 2026, there were 203 violent crimes recorded in Cambridge, 18 incidents (8%) below last year's total of 221 incidents and four incidents (2%) below the 207 crimes forecasted for the first six months of the year.

There were 18 rapes reported in Cambridge through June 29th, which is 14% or three incidents below the 21 reported during the first six months of 2025.

The trend observed during the past few years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults and street robberies occurring in Central Square may slowly be starting to re-emerge after a delayed start in 2026. Forty-seven of the 153 aggravated assaults year-to-date (or 31%) have been reported in Central Square, as well as seven of the 24 street robberies (or 29%).

MURDER

No Patterns

- The second homicide of 2026* occurred during the early morning hours of July 4th. Preliminary investigation suggests that the victim, Xavier Bautista, 32, from Cambridge, was shot shortly before 4:30am in the area of Broadway & Norfolk St. His body was located by a pedestrian at around 5:30am and he was pronounced deceased on scene by Paramedics. The investigation is being conducted by the Cambridge Police, Mass. State Police, and Middlesex District Attorney's Office.
- The first homicide of the year in Cambridge was reported on January 6, 2026. At approximately 7:52pm, officers responded to a Norfolk Street apartment complex for a report of a stabbing. One victim was located with serious injuries and was transported to a local hospital, where he later died. Victor Rivas, 51, of South Boston was arrested and charged with assault and battery with a dangerous weapon in connection with this incident. The preliminary investigation suggests that there was an altercation inside an apartment between the defendant and the male victim, who are believed to be known to each other. Both parties sustained injuries during the altercation.
- The last reported homicide in Cambridge prior to the January 2026 incident took place on January 13, 2025, shortly before 11:30pm. This was the first homicide reported in the City in over a year. One victim, 21-year-old Angel Nieves of Springfield and formerly of Cambridge, was located with multiple gunshot wounds outside of a residence on Clifton Street. He was transported to a local hospital where he was later pronounced deceased.
- There were no murders recorded in Cambridge in 2024. This has happened only four other times in the past 20 years—in 2004, 2007, 2010, and 2022.

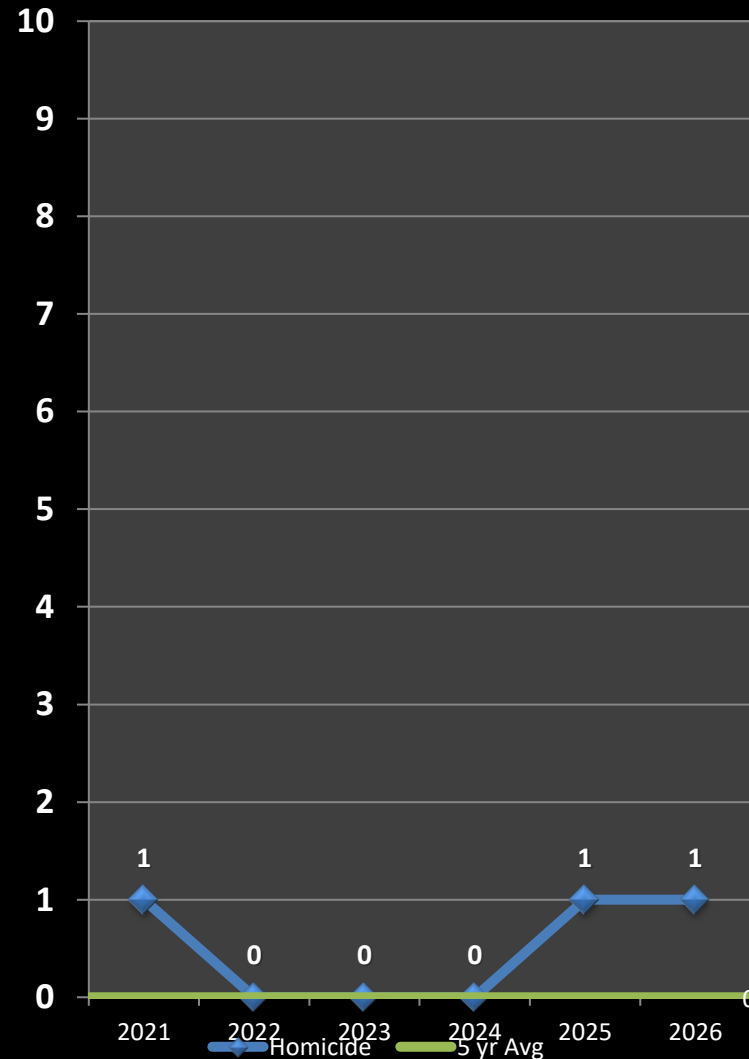

RAPE

No Patterns

- There have been 18 rapes reported in Cambridge so far in 2026, which is three less than both the number reported during the first six months of 2025 and the five-year weighted average of 21.
- The rapes reported so far in 2026 have been categorized as nine domestic assaults, five acquaintance rapes, two contact incidents, and two blitz incidents.
- The total number of reported rapes tends to fluctuate from year to year, but the number of stranger-to-stranger rapes reported each year in Cambridge—typically between 5 and 15—remains extremely low.

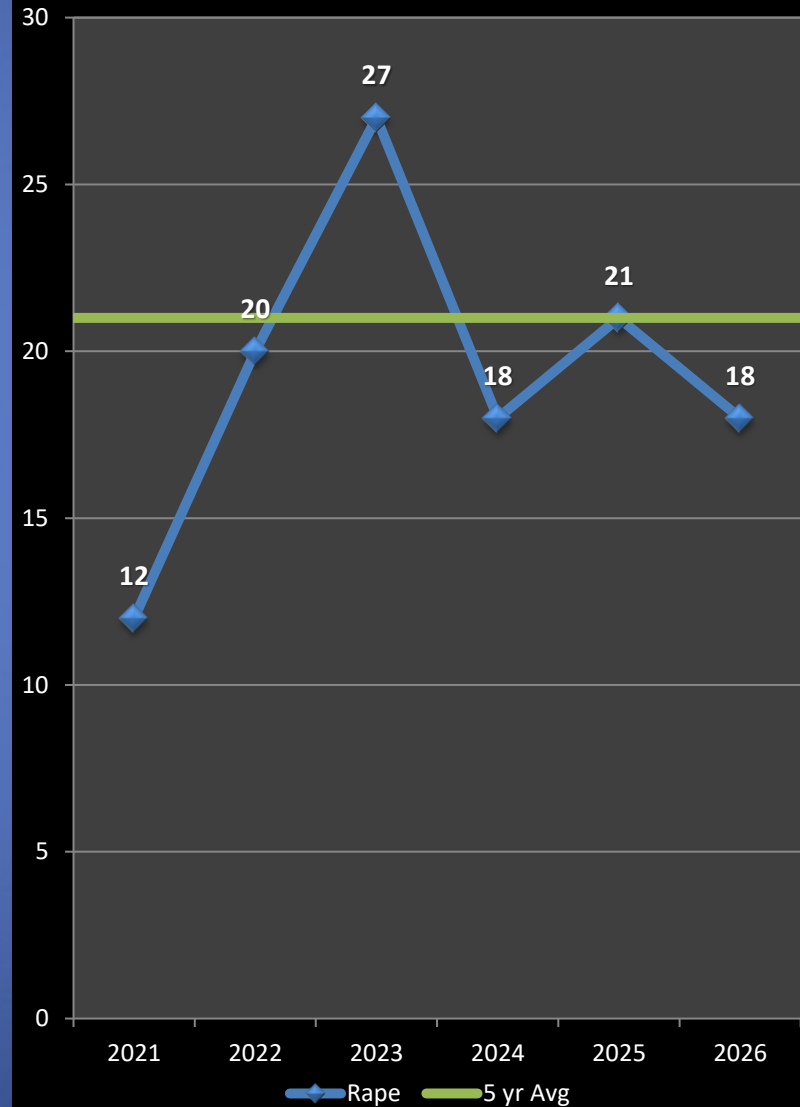

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

No Patterns

- The total of 153 aggravated assaults reported through June 29, 2026, is 7% less than that reported during the first six months of 2025. Conversely, the total reported through 6/29 is 9% above the five-year average of 140.
- The 153 aggravated assaults reported so far in 2026 are comprised of the following classifications: 40 each of domestic altercations and unprovoked scenarios; 12 shop owner/patron assaults; 11 between acquaintances; 10 traffic & parking assaults; nine affray/brawls; eight assaults on police officers; seven psychotic episodes; four each of juvenile assaults and assaults between unhoused parties; three landlord/neighbor assaults and workplace assaults; and one each of bar assaults and third lover situations.
- After a few slow months, the trend observed during the past few years of a high percentage of aggravated assaults taking place in Central Square appears to gradually be emerging again in 2026. Forty-seven of the 153 assaults year-to-date (or 31%) have taken place in that business district thus far. In June, nine assaults took place in Central Square, followed by four in Harvard Square.
- There have been two confirmed shots fired incidents and one fatal shooting in Cambridge through 7/4 of 2026. Through the same time period in 2025, there were five shots fired incidents, with three resulting in gunshot wounds (two non-fatal and one homicide) and two resulting in no injuries.
NOTE: The shooting on 5/11/26 resulted in two non-fatal injuries on the roadway of Memorial Dr (which is under State Police jurisdiction) and one shot fired into a residence on Memorial Dr with no injuries (which is under Cambridge Police jurisdiction). The suspect in this incident was taken into custody by State Police.

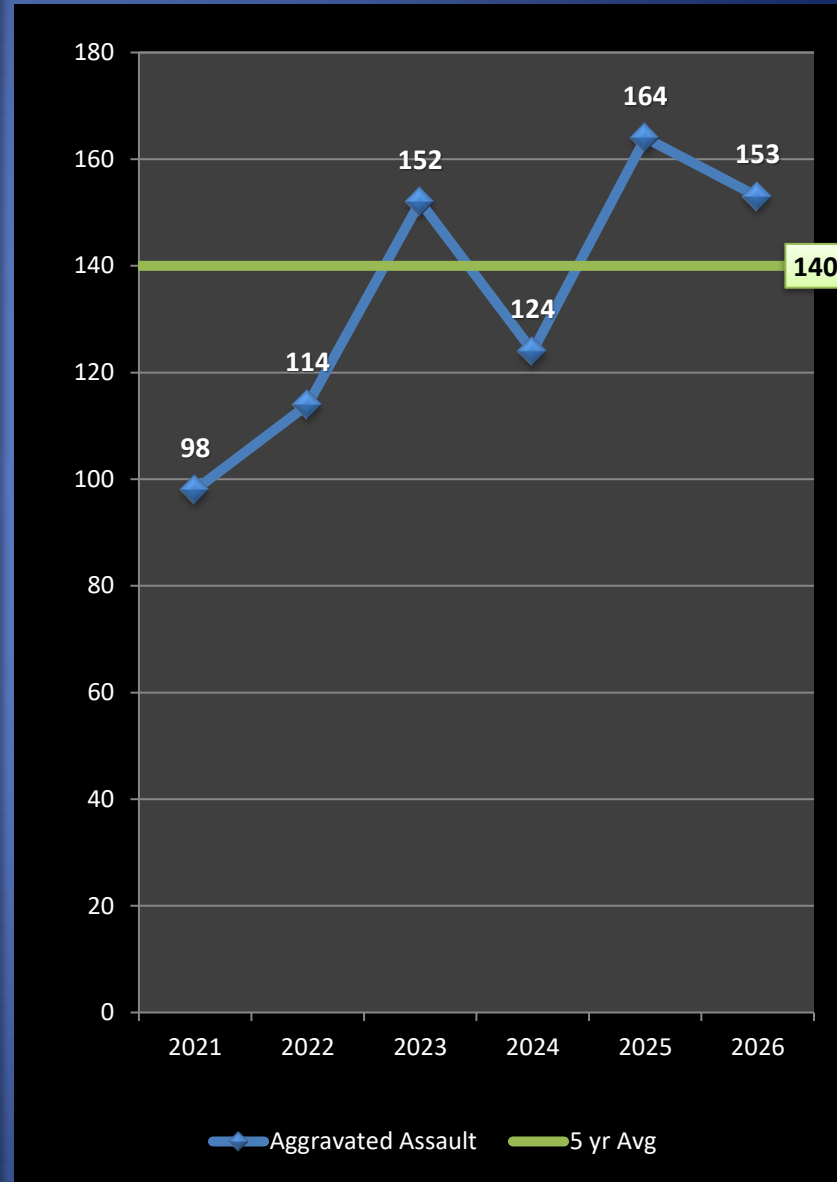

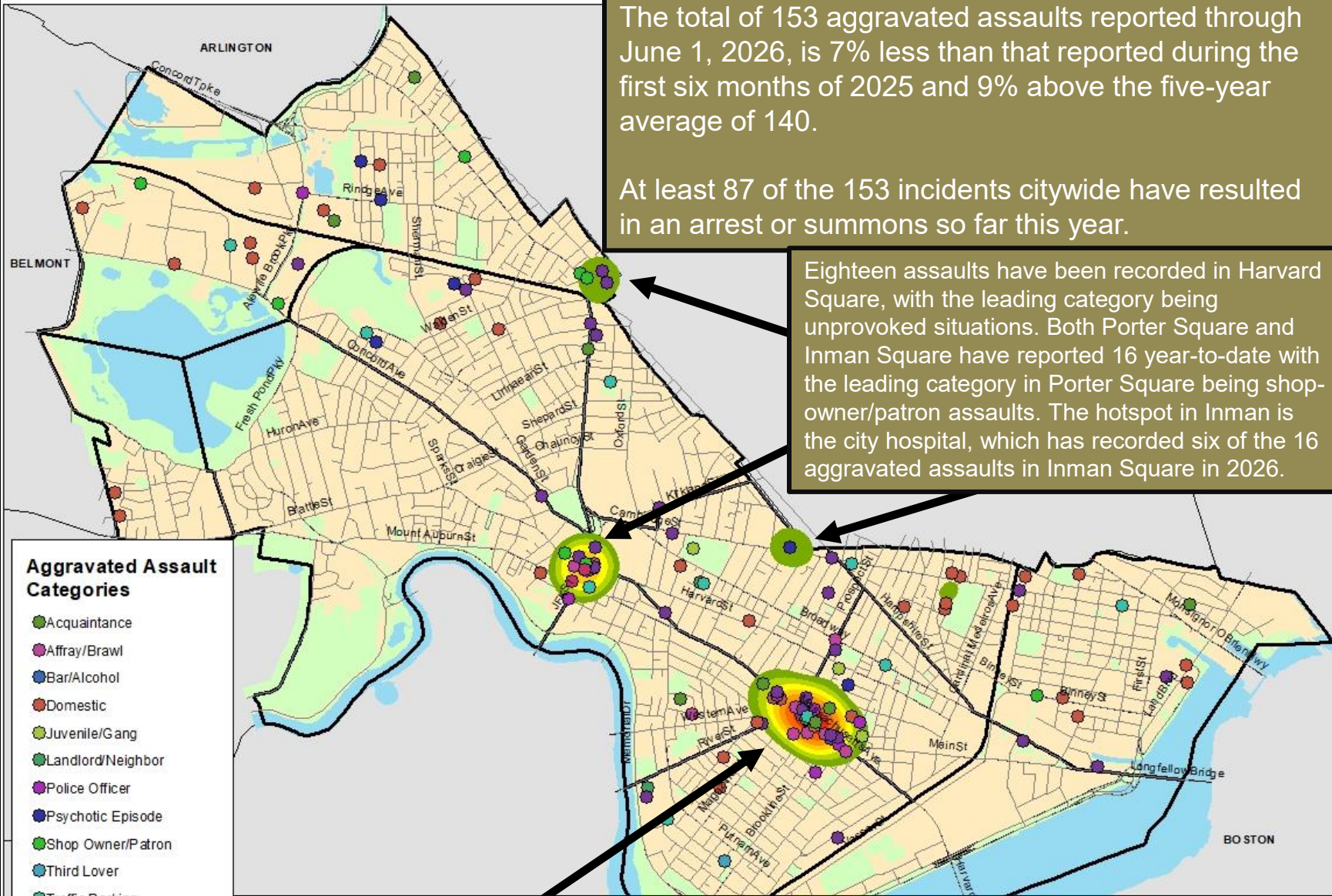




Geographic Breakdown of Aggravated Assaults: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

The total of 153 aggravated assaults reported through June 1, 2026, is 7% less than that reported during the first six months of 2025 and 9% above the five-year average of 140.

At least 87 of the 153 incidents citywide have resulted in an arrest or summons so far this year.

Eighteen assaults have been recorded in Harvard Square, with the leading category being unprovoked situations. Both Porter Square and Inman Square have reported 16 year-to-date with the leading category in Porter Square being shop-owner/patron assaults. The hotspot in Inman is the city hospital, which has recorded six of the 16 aggravated assaults in Inman Square in 2026.

Central Square has recorded 47 assaults year-to-date, with unprovoked assaults being the top category, accounting for 14 of the incidents, followed by affrays with seven and both domestic assault and assault on police officers with six each.

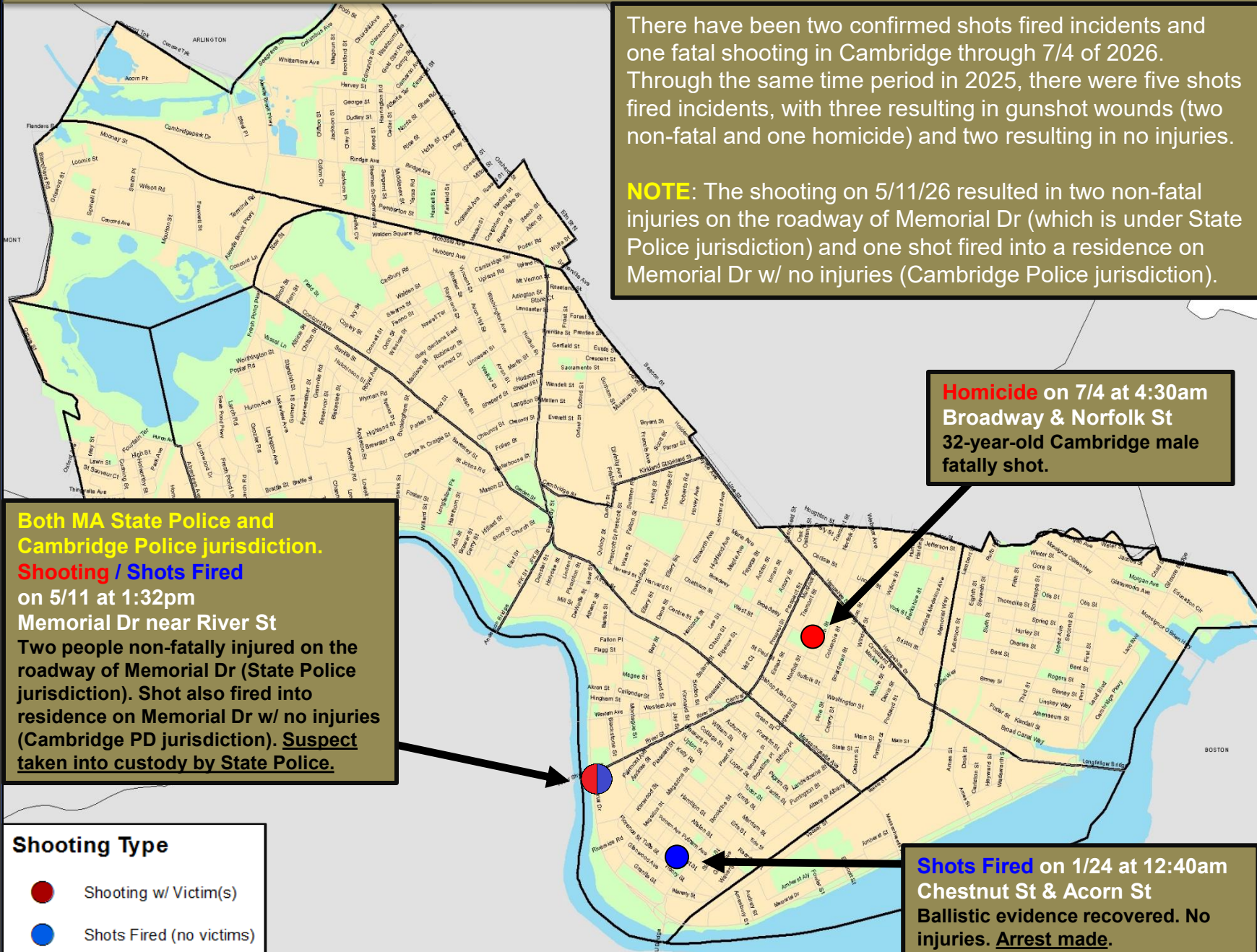


Shootings & Shots Fired in Cambridge: 1.1.26 – 7.4.26

There have been two confirmed shots fired incidents and one fatal shooting in Cambridge through 7/4 of 2026. Through the same time period in 2025, there were five shots fired incidents, with three resulting in gunshot wounds (two non-fatal and one homicide) and two resulting in no injuries.

NOTE: The shooting on 5/11/26 resulted in two non-fatal injuries on the roadway of Memorial Dr (which is under State Police jurisdiction) and one shot fired into a residence on Memorial Dr w/ no injuries (Cambridge Police jurisdiction).

Robbery

No Patterns

- The five-year average for overall robbery in Cambridge through the first half of the year is 46 incidents. In 2026, 31 total robberies have been recorded to date, which translates to a 33% drop below the projected total and an 11% decrease below the 35 robberies reported through 6/29 in 2025.
- Seven commercial robberies have been reported year-to-date in 2026, down three incidents (-30%) from the first half of 2025 and down five (-42%) from the five-year average of 12. All seven robberies so far have been unrelated, but four of the seven involved shoplifting incidents at stores that escalated into robberies. This was a frequent scenario throughout much of 2025 as well.
- Street robberies year-to-date in 2026 are down ten incidents (-29%) below the five-year average of 34 and are down one incident (-4%) below the 25 street robberies reported during the same time frame in 2025. No street robbery patterns have emerged anywhere in Cambridge year-to-date, although two unprovoked incidents in Central Sq in April targeted the same victim.
- The trend observed during the past few years of a high percentage of street robberies occurring in Central Square may very slowly be starting to re-emerge after a delayed start in 2026. However, this activity is still far below the level seen in recent years. Only seven of the 24 street robberies (or 29%) year-to-date have been reported in this area, compared to 62% at the end of 2025.

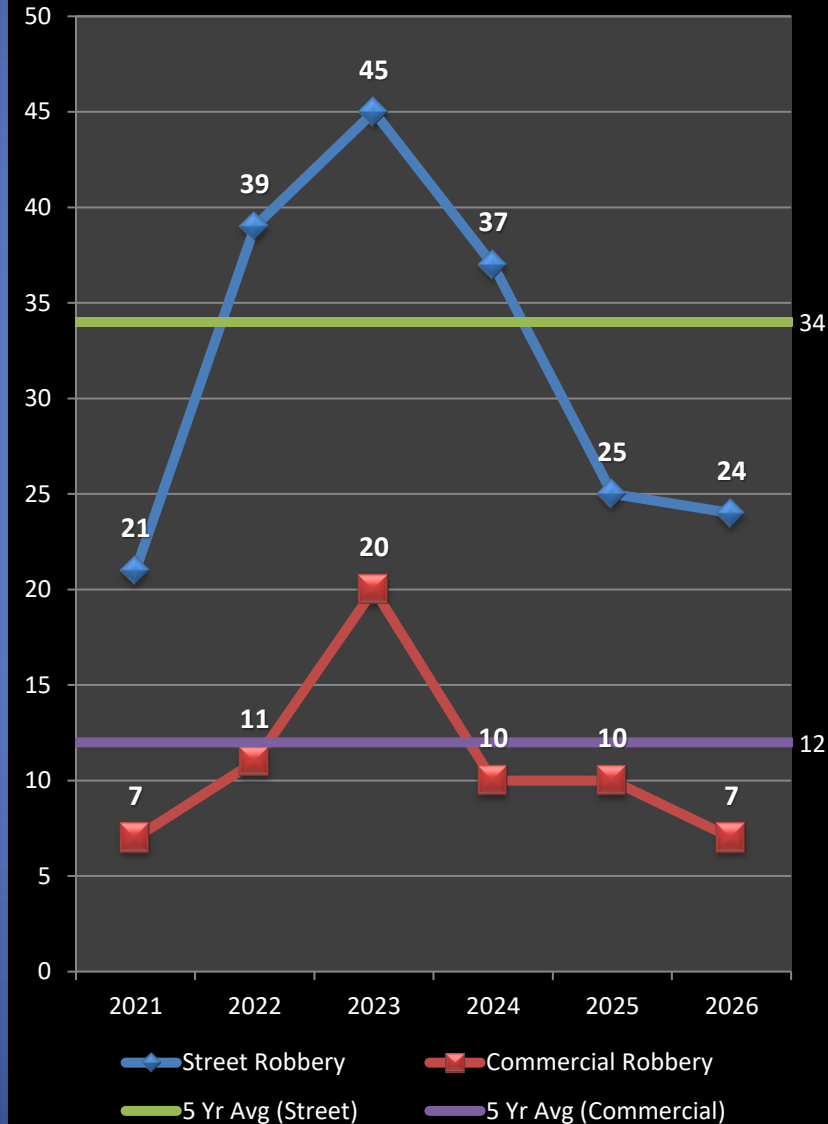

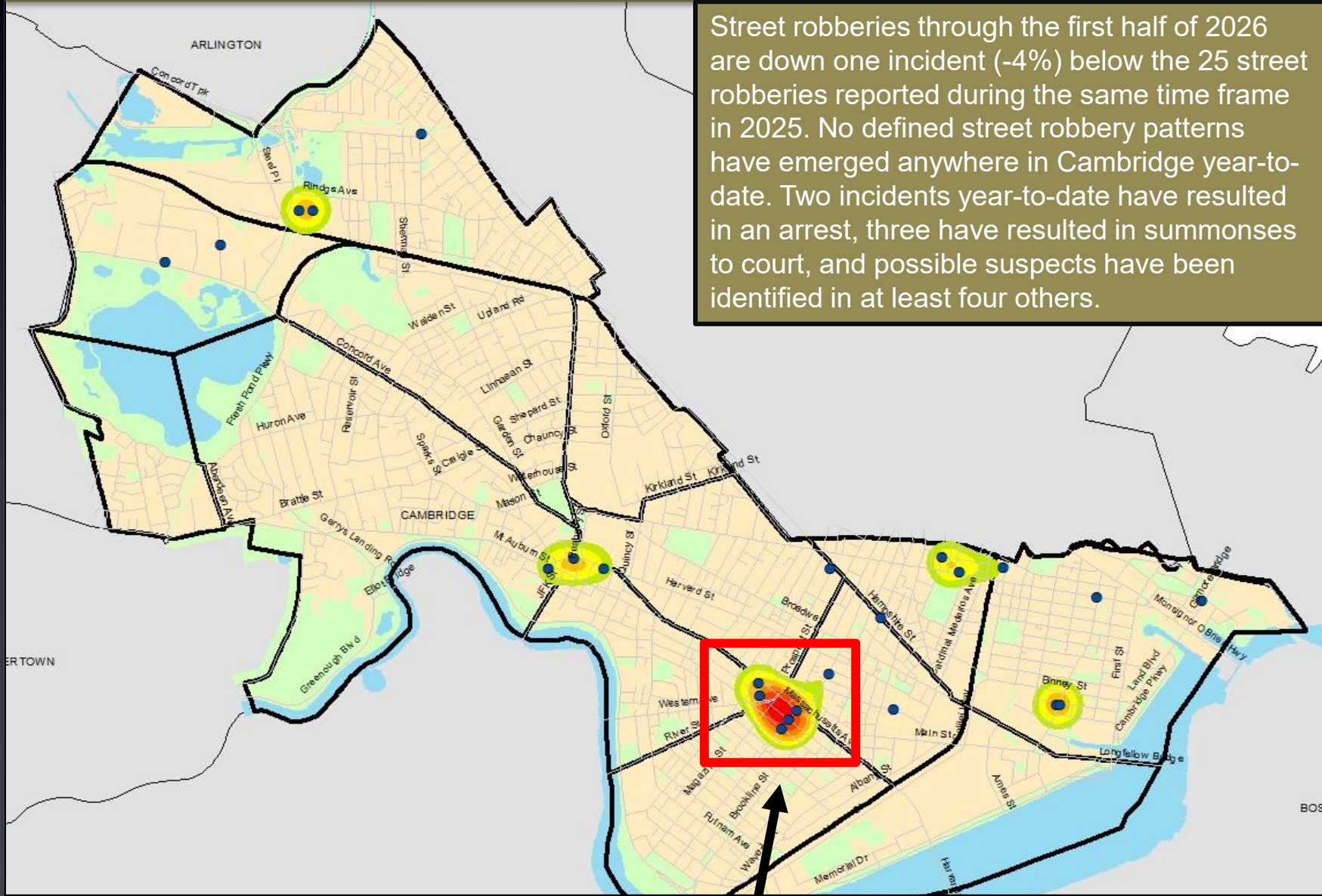




Geographic Breakdown of Street Robberies: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

Street robberies through the first half of 2026 are down one incident (-4%) below the 25 street robberies reported during the same time frame in 2025. No defined street robbery patterns have emerged anywhere in Cambridge year-to-date. Two incidents year-to-date have resulted in an arrest, three have resulted in summonses to court, and possible suspects have been identified in at least four others.



Although the highlighted Central Square area is still the main hotspot for street robberies citywide through the first half of 2026, this is not nearly the problem area that it has been in recent years. Seven of the 24 street robberies (or 29%) year-to-date have been reported in this area, which is down from 62% at the end of 2025. No new incidents were reported in this area in June.

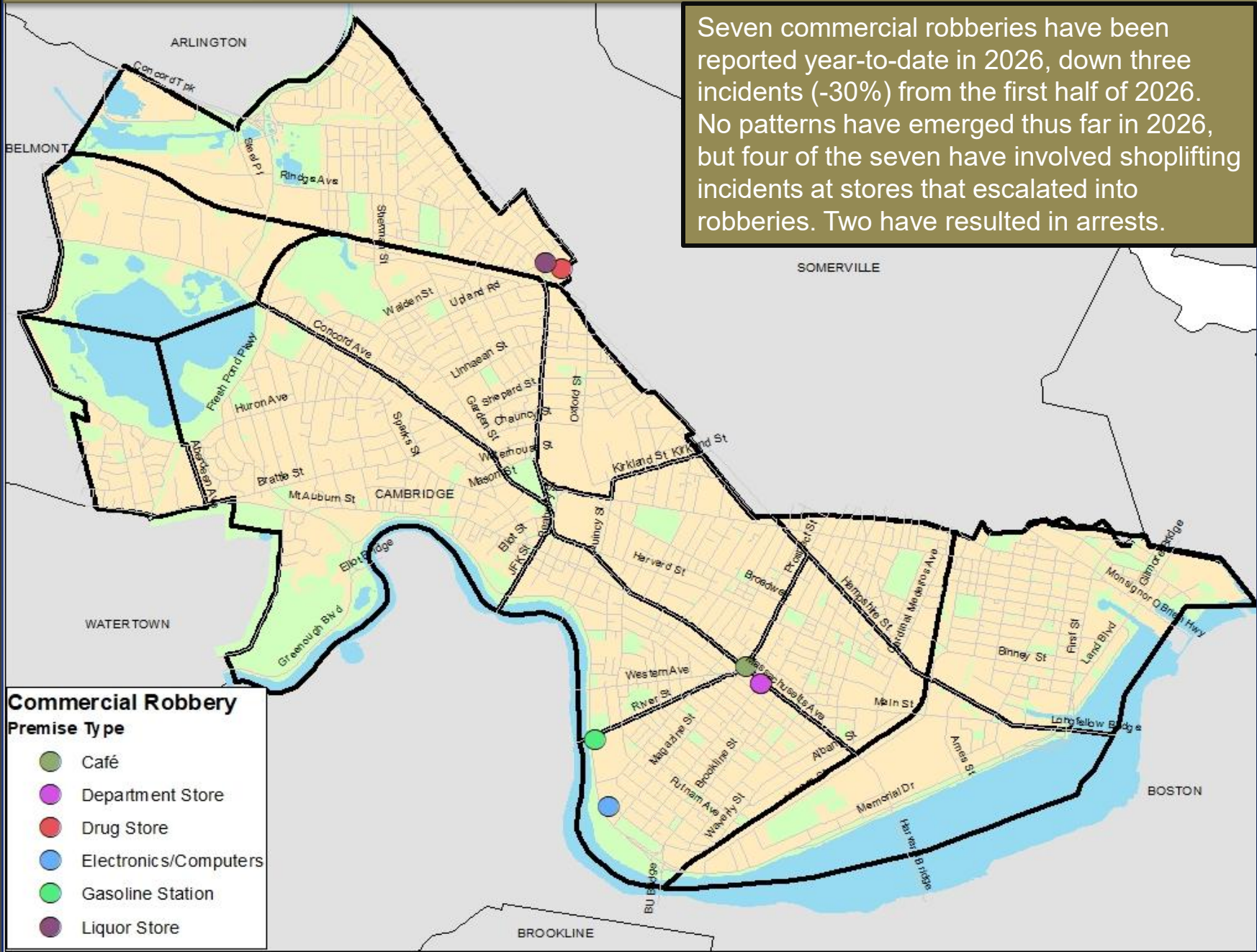


Geographic Breakdown of Commercial Robberies: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

Seven commercial robberies have been reported year-to-date in 2026, down three incidents (-30%) from the first half of 2026. No patterns have emerged thus far in 2026, but four of the seven have involved shoplifting incidents at stores that escalated into robberies. Two have resulted in arrests.

Burglary

No Patterns

- The property index crime of burglary, the combination of residential and commercial breaks, recorded a decrease of 3% (three incidents) through June 29th of 2026 when compared to the 105 incidents reported during the first half of 2025. The total of 102 burglary incidents reported thus far in 2026 is also 13% (15 incidents) below the five-year average of 117.
- Housebreaks through June 29th increased by 11 incidents (20%) from 54 in 2025 to 65 in 2026.
- Of the 65 housebreaks that have occurred so far in 2026, the North Cambridge neighborhood has reported the most with 14 incidents, followed by the Cambridgeport and Peabody neighborhoods with 12 and 11, respectively.
- Commercial breaks are down by 14 incidents (27%), dropping from 51 incidents in the first half of the year in 2025 to 37 in 2026.
- There are no defined patterns of residential or commercial burglaries anywhere in the city at the present time.

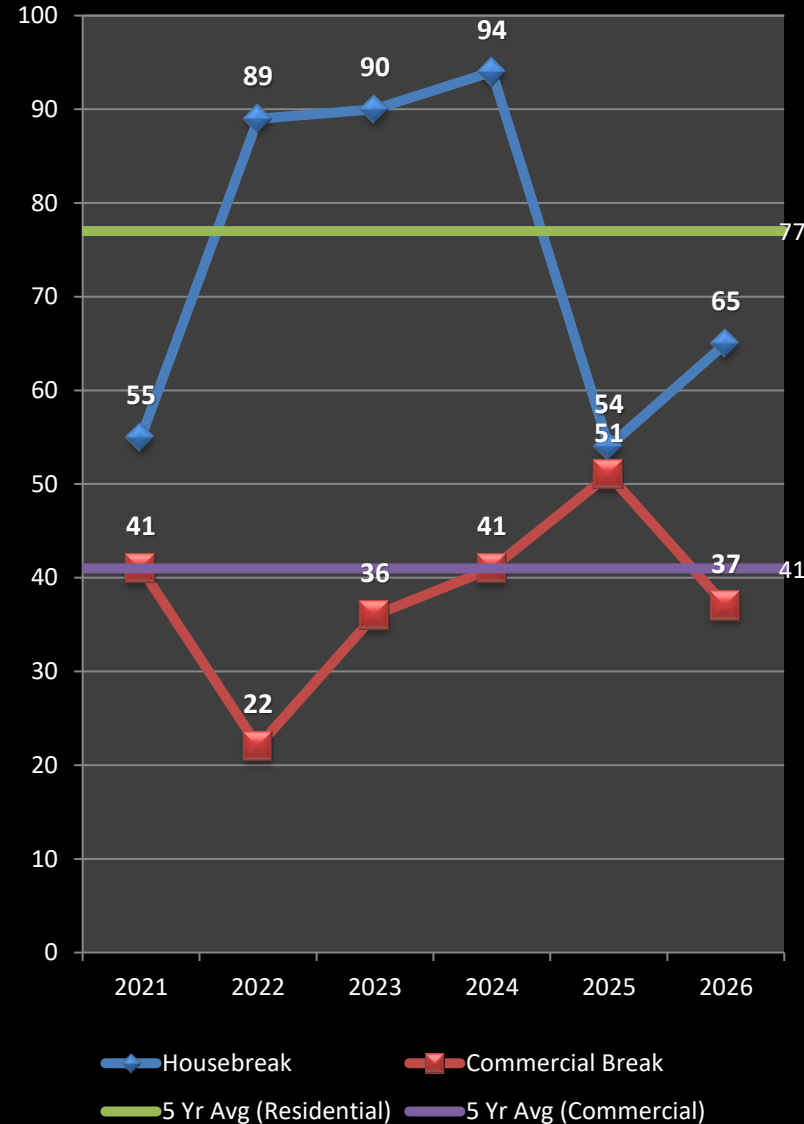

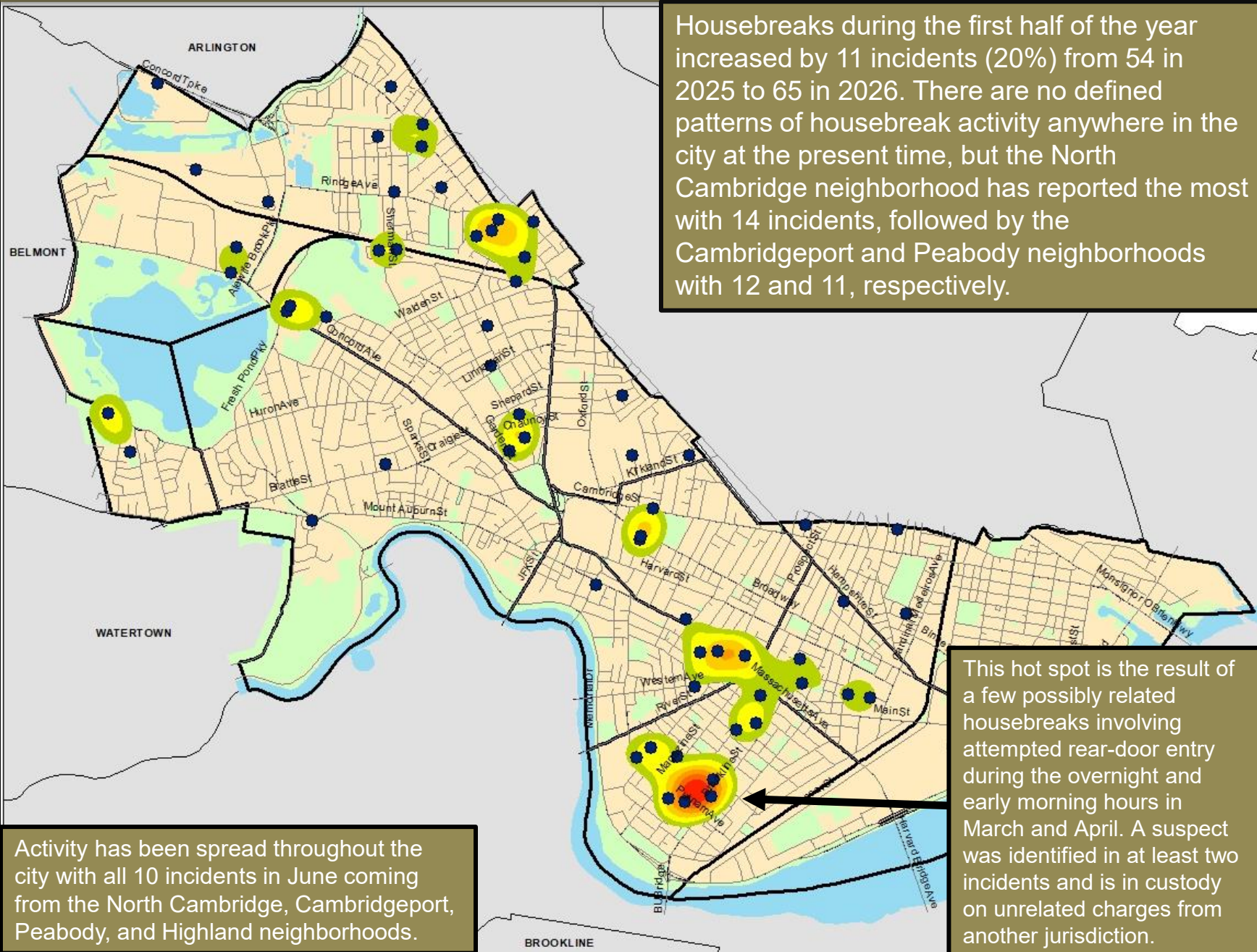




Geographic Breakdown of Housebreaks: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

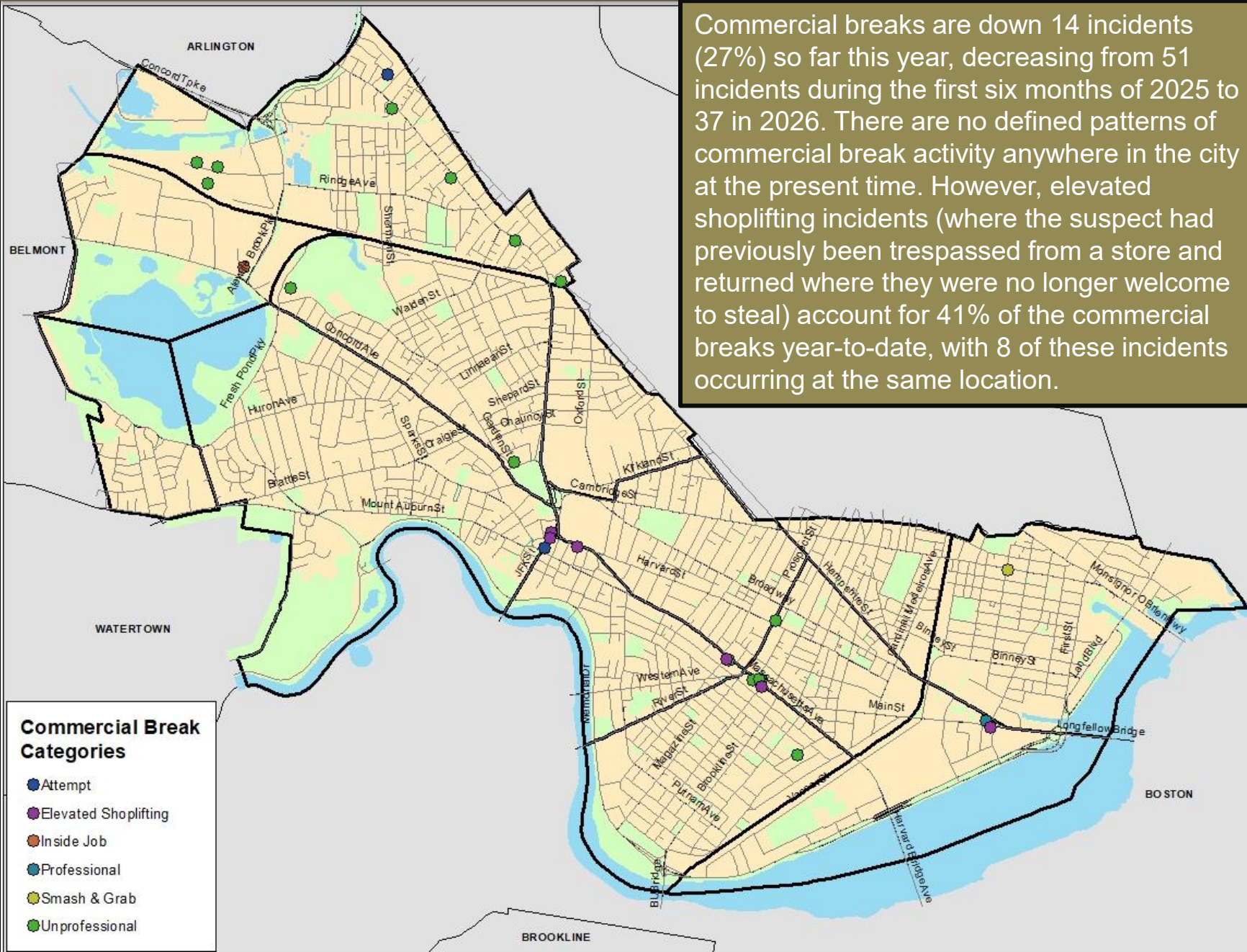
Housebreaks during the first half of the year increased by 11 incidents (20%) from 54 in 2025 to 65 in 2026. There are no defined patterns of housebreak activity anywhere in the city at the present time, but the North Cambridge neighborhood has reported the most with 14 incidents, followed by the Cambridgeport and Peabody neighborhoods with 12 and 11, respectively.

Activity has been spread throughout the city with all 10 incidents in June coming from the North Cambridge, Cambridgeport, Peabody, and Highland neighborhoods.

This hot spot is the result of a few possibly related housebreaks involving attempted rear-door entry during the overnight and early morning hours in March and April. A suspect was identified in at least two incidents and is in custody on unrelated charges from another jurisdiction.



Geographic Breakdown of Commercial Breaks: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26



Commercial breaks are down 14 incidents (27%) so far this year, decreasing from 51 incidents during the first six months of 2025 to 37 in 2026. There are no defined patterns of commercial break activity anywhere in the city at the present time. However, elevated shoplifting incidents (where the suspect had previously been trespassed from a store and returned where they were no longer welcome to steal) account for 41% of the commercial breaks year-to-date, with 8 of these incidents occurring at the same location.



LARCENY

No Patterns

- Overall larceny through June 29th of 2026 has registered at 1,112 incidents, 15% below the same time in 2025. The total of 1,112 larcenies reported in 2026 is also 2% below the five-year average of 1133 incidents.
- The larceny from motor vehicle total through June 29th, 2026, is 114 incidents, 21% below the same time frame in 2025. This is also 28% (44 incidents) below the five-year average of 158 incidents.
- Through June 29th, 2026, there were 27 larcenies from the person reported in Cambridge, down 27% (10 incidents) when compared to 2025. Harvard Square has recorded the most incidents so far this year with nine reports, followed by Central Square with seven.
- There were 94 larcenies from buildings reported in the first half of 2026. This total is 10 incidents (+12%) above the same time in 2025 and one incident (1%) below the five-year average. There was a rise in thefts from lockers at health clubs in the Central & Porter Sq areas in the month of March, which dropped off in April and has fluctuated each month since.
- Larcenies from residences are down four incidents (2%) in 2026 when compared with 2025. Package thefts have accounted for 148 (or 71%) of the 208 larcenies from residences reported so far this year. Mid-Cambridge has seen the most with 29, followed by North Cambridge with 26.
- There have been 205 larcenies of bicycles reported so far in 2026. This total is 27 incidents (15%) above the first half of 2025 and 1 incident (0%) above the five-year average of 204. The top neighborhood for bike thefts so far in 2026 is North Cambridge with 52 incidents.

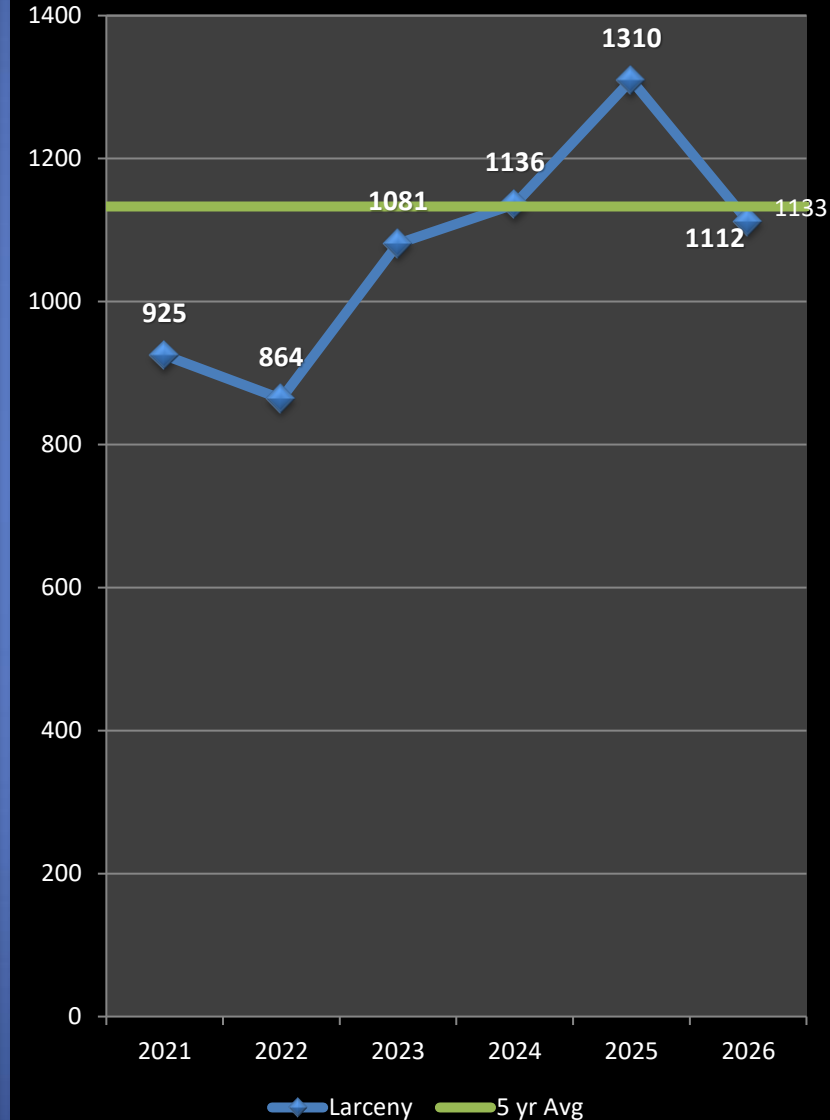

LARCENY From MV

No Patterns

- The larceny from motor vehicle (LMV) total through the first six months of 2026 is 114 incidents, which is 21% (31 incidents) below the same time period in 2025. The 114 thefts from vehicles reported so far this year also indicate a decrease of 44 incidents (-28%) below the 158 car breaks forecasted for this time period.
- The neighborhoods with the most larcenies from motor vehicles in the first half of 2026 were North Cambridge and Mid-Cambridge with 34 and 23 incidents, respectively.
- Comparing the last four weeks (June) to the previous four (May), there was a significant decline in the number of incidents reported, with 10 fewer reported during June. The year started out with fewer LMVs than expected, due to the cold weather and winter storms, and they remain low as we reach the halfway point of the year.
- Of the 114 incidents reported so far in 2026, 49 vehicles (43%) were entered through an unlocked door and 55 vehicles (48%) were entered via unknown means.

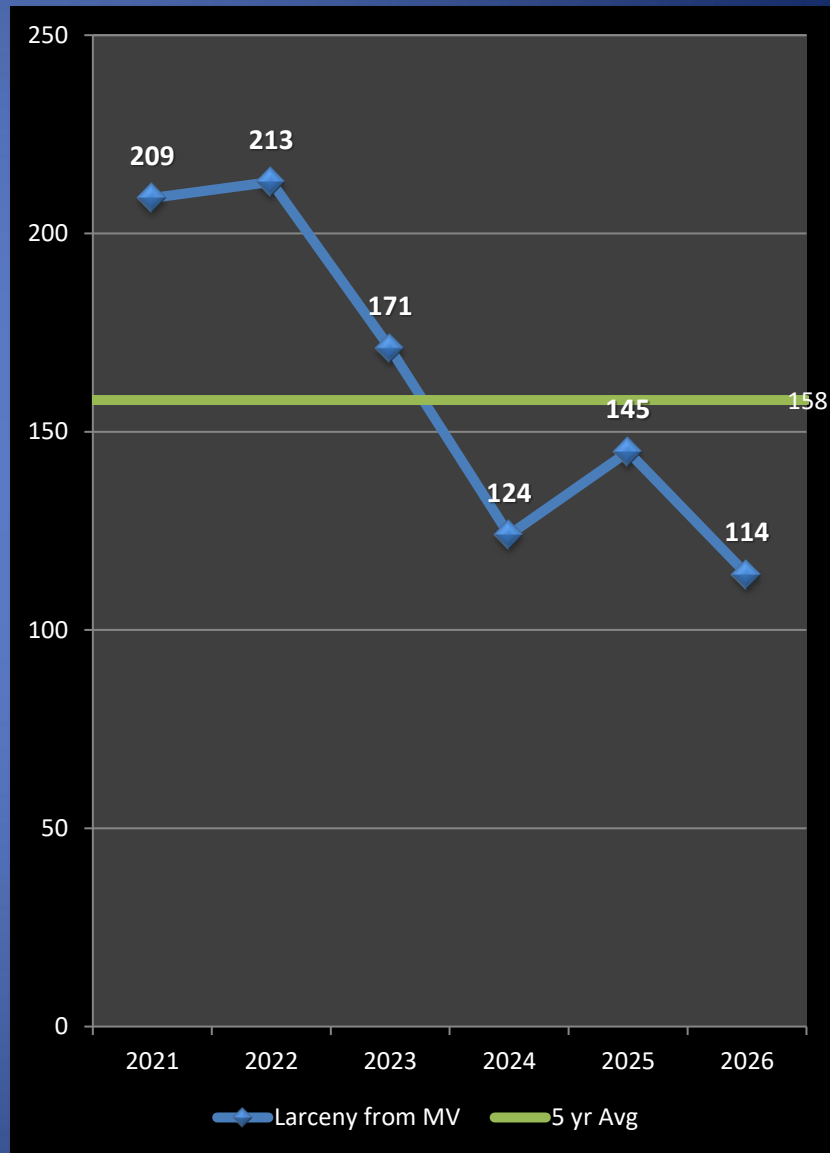

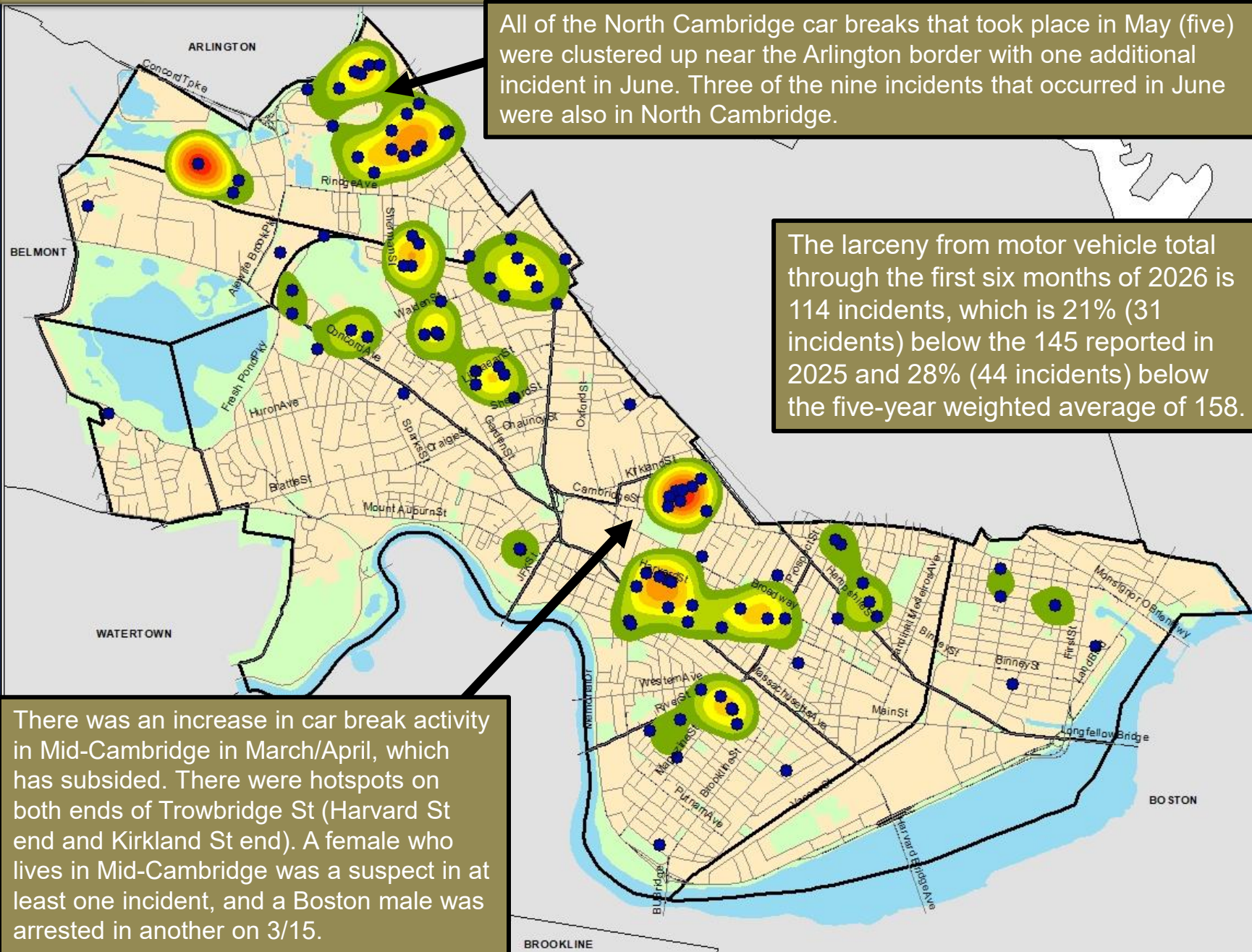

LARCENY of Bicycle

No Patterns

- Likely due at least in part to the colder weather and snow at the beginning of this year, 2026 started off with a sharp decline in bike thefts. However, this trend has reversed with the warmer weather. There have now been 205 bicycle thefts reported citywide so far in 2026, up 15% from the 178 reported during the same time frame in 2025. This increase in incidents also brought bike thefts up one incident above the five-year weighted average of 204.
- The most recent four weeks (June) saw a 24% increase in bike thefts when compared with the previous four weeks (May), with 12 additional thefts reported. This is likely due to the improving weather.
- 104 bike thefts (or 51% of all citywide thefts year-to-date) have occurred north of Harvard Square.
- Of the 205 bike thefts reported so far in 2026, 146 (71%) were reportedly locked at the time of the theft.

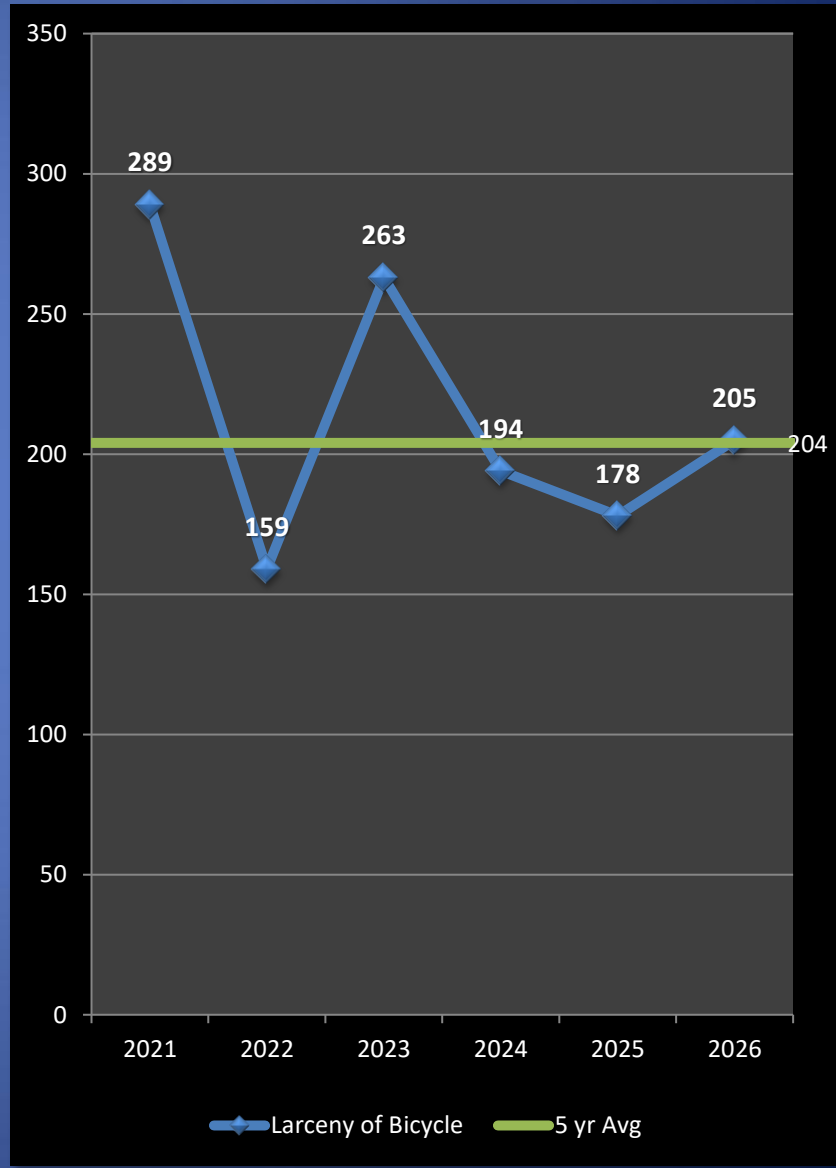

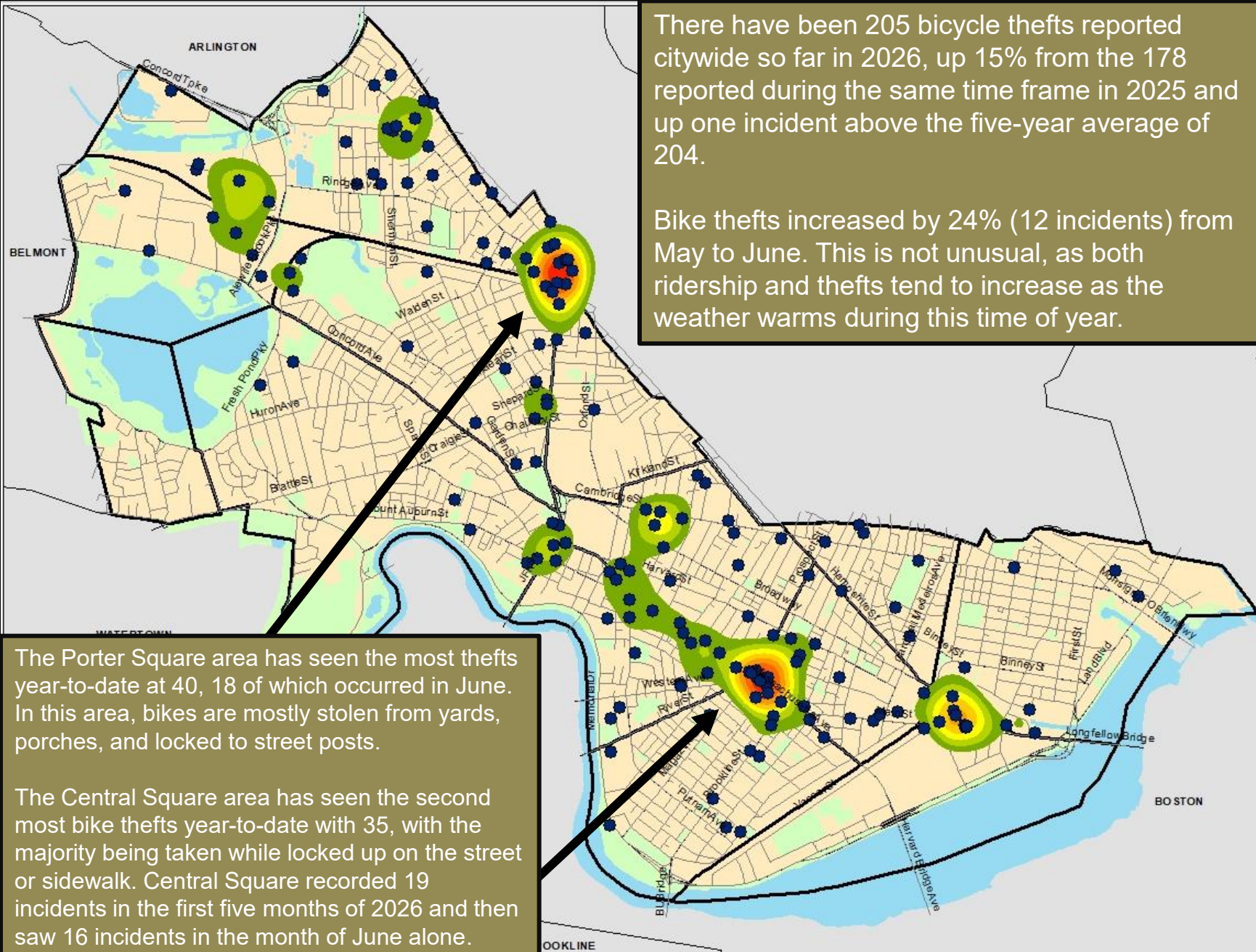




Geographic Breakdown of Bicycle Thefts: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

There have been 205 bicycle thefts reported citywide so far in 2026, up 15% from the 178 reported during the same time frame in 2025 and up one incident above the five-year average of 204.

Bike thefts increased by 24% (12 incidents) from May to June. This is not unusual, as both ridership and thefts tend to increase as the weather warms during this time of year.

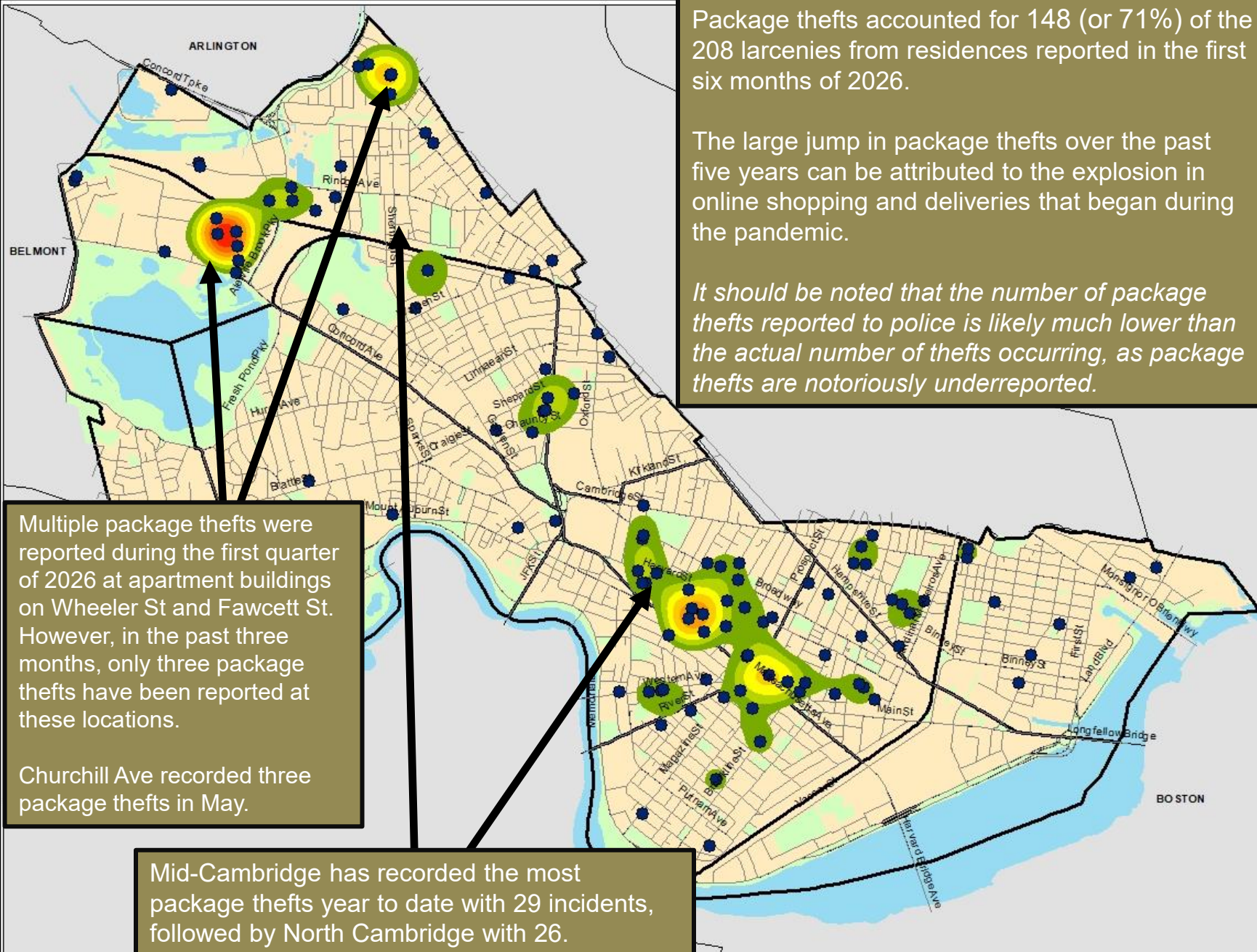
The Porter Square area has seen the most thefts year-to-date at 40, 18 of which occurred in June. In this area, bikes are mostly stolen from yards, porches, and locked to street posts.

The Central Square area has seen the second most bike thefts year-to-date with 35, with the majority being taken while locked up on the street or sidewalk. Central Square recorded 19 incidents in the first five months of 2026 and then saw 16 incidents in the month of June alone.



Geographic Breakdown of Package Thefts: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

Package thefts accounted for 148 (or 71%) of the 208 larcenies from residences reported in the first six months of 2026.

The large jump in package thefts over the past five years can be attributed to the explosion in online shopping and deliveries that began during the pandemic.

It should be noted that the number of package thefts reported to police is likely much lower than the actual number of thefts occurring, as package thefts are notoriously underreported.

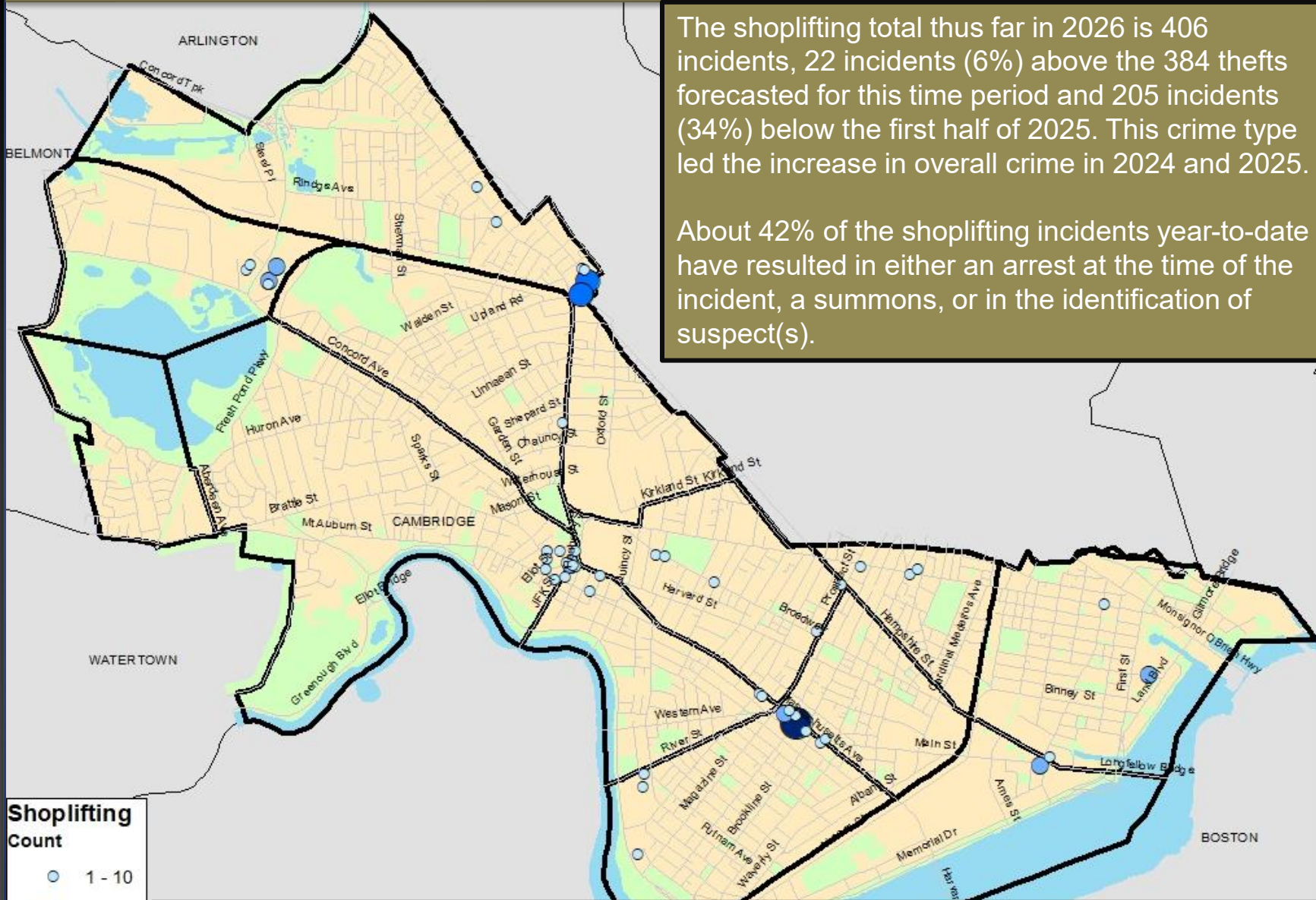
Multiple package thefts were reported during the first quarter of 2026 at apartment buildings on Wheeler St and Fawcett St. However, in the past three months, only three package thefts have been reported at these locations.

Churchill Ave recorded three package thefts in May.

Mid-Cambridge has recorded the most package thefts year to date with 29 incidents, followed by North Cambridge with 26.



Geographic Breakdown of Shoplifting: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26



The shoplifting total thus far in 2026 is 406 incidents, 22 incidents (6%) above the 384 thefts forecasted for this time period and 205 incidents (34%) below the first half of 2025. This crime type led the increase in overall crime in 2024 and 2025.

About 42% of the shoplifting incidents year-to-date have resulted in either an arrest at the time of the incident, a summons, or in the identification of suspect(s).

Year-to-date, the Target in Central Square has seen the most incidents with 75, followed by the CVS in Porter Square with 57, and the Target in Porter Square with 54. Ten locations have seen more than 10 incidents of shoplifting so far this year.



AUTO THEFT

No Patterns

- The five-year weighted average for auto thefts for the first six months of the year is 52 incidents, and with 36 reported so far in 2026, Cambridge has experienced a decrease of 31% below the expected total. Auto thefts also dropped 12% (five incidents) when compared with the first half of 2025.
- The neighborhood breakdown for auto thefts so far in 2026 is as follows: Cambridgeport – 12; North Cambridge and The Port – 6 each; Peabody – 3; Mid-Cambridge, West Cambridge, and riverside – 2 each; Baldwin, Inman Harrington, and Strawberry Hill – 1 each.
- Three of the 36 auto thefts reported so far this year involved a situation where the operator left the vehicle running in order to deliver a package or grab food. When the victim returned, the vehicle was gone.
- 13 of the 36 motor vehicles stolen in 2026 have been recovered to date.

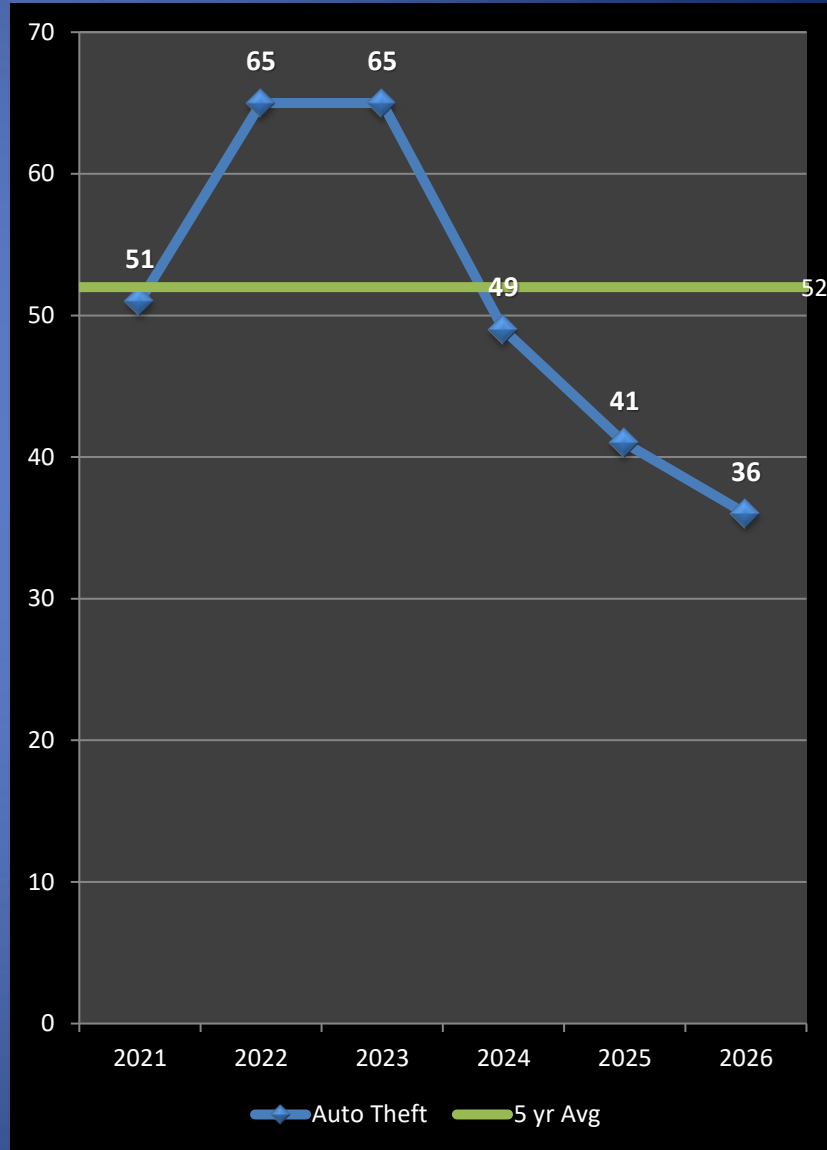

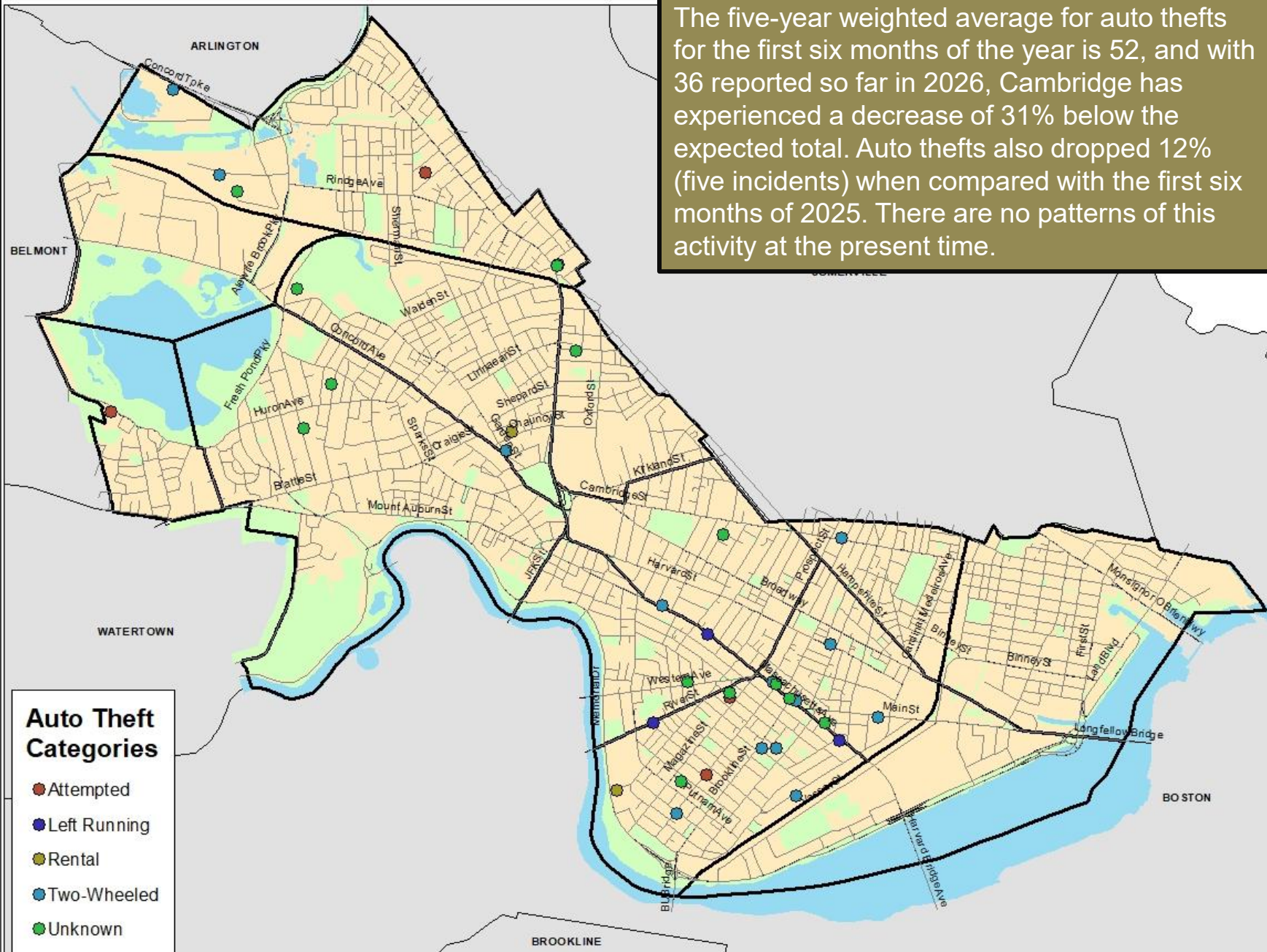


Geographic Breakdown of Auto Theft: 1.1.26 – 6.29.26

The five-year weighted average for auto thefts for the first six months of the year is 52, and with 36 reported so far in 2026, Cambridge has experienced a decrease of 31% below the expected total. Auto thefts also dropped 12% (five incidents) when compared with the first six months of 2025. There are no patterns of this activity at the present time.
