

Special Events & Community Education

Census Program

In 2010, Watershed Division staff members developed the Fresh Pond Reservation Census Program to better quantify the number of visitors and to determine the many different user types. Sensors installed around the reservation count people and bikes passing by.

Help us conduct surveys of user type, group size, and travel direction to help supplement and quality check data collected from sensors.

Friends of Fresh Pond Reservation (FFPR)



The Friends of Fresh Pond Reservation is a **volunteer citizens' group** that works to help fulfill the educational and conservation goals of the FPR Master Plan that was

implemented in 2001. FFPR has offered a variety of activity-based programs designed to develop nature observation skills and build community at the Reservation, such as seasonal tree and wildflower ID, photography, and migratory bird workshops.

In addition to organizing weekend programming, FFPR assists with **collecting biodiversity data** and inventories from Fresh Pond, **monitors bird boxes**, assists with **volunteer training** in invasive plant removal, maintains the **Woodland Restoration project**, and **produces maps and informational flyers** for the Ranger Station.

Adopt-a-Habitat
