
# Later this fall, changes are coming to Mt. Auburn Street and Aberdeen Avenue:

- Turn-only lanes from Mt. Auburn Street to Homer Avenue and Aberdeen Avenue
- Better bike infrastructure along Mt. Auburn Street between Brattle Street and the Cambridge-Watertown Greenway
- Extension of the existing eastbound shared bus-bike lane to Homer Avenue

# Street Design in Cambridge

### What guides our street design?


- We design for people of all ages and abilities. This includes:
- People who may not have access to a car
- Safe and accessible facilities, including bike lanes, sidewalks, and crosswalks that can be used by a wide range of people

### Focus is on moving people and goods, not their vehicles

- Biking and riding transit is a more efficient use of limited street space
- Keep access for trucks and local deliveries, but safely

- Cycling Safety Ordinance

### Cambridge Bicycle Network Vision

The Cambridge Bike Network Vision identifies Mt Auburn St and Aberdeen Ave as streets where "greater separation" can improve safety and comfort for people biking.

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


### What will this look like?

#### Check out the roll plan on the table for more details!

#### Mt. Auburn Street between Belmont Street and Homer Avenue:

We'll extend the eastbound shared bus-bike lane to the Homer Avenue bus stop and add a left turn-only lane onto Homer Ave. We'll remove one of the westbound traffic lanes



#### Belmont St to Homer Ave

(toward Watertown). Updated signal timing and new turn lanes will mitigate impacts to traffic.


#### Mt. Auburn Street between Homer Avenue and Aberdeen Avenue:

We'll add a two-way separated bike lane on the north side of the street. We'll remove one of the westbound traffic lanes (toward Watertown). Updated signal timing and new turn lanes will mitigate impacts to traffic.

#### Mt. Auburn Street between Aberdeen Avenue and Brattle Street:

The right lane on Mt Auburn Street at Aberdeen Avenue will become right-turn only. This reduces conflicts between drivers and people crossing the street on foot or by bike.

#### Aberdeen Ave to Brattle St



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
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#### **Traffic Safety Improvements**

**Protected turn signal phasing at Aberdeen Avenue:** Turning traffic gets a green signal at a different time than people crossing Aberdeen Ave on foot or on bike

Leading pedestrian and bike intervals: People walking and biking have a three to five second head start to cross before adjacent traffic gets the green light.

#### At Aberdeen Avenue/Mt. Auburn Street:

- Traffic signals will be overhead, rather than to the side, improving clarity for everyone
- Right and left turns onto Aberdeen Avenue will have dedicated arrows.
- Pedestrian signals will be updated to the latest accessibility standards.
- Bike signals in both directions on Mt Auburn St.

#### At Homer Avenue/Mt Auburn St

- Turning drivers will get a dedicated left turn lane from Mt. Auburn Street Homer Avenue.
- Left turns will access Shopping Center by turning onto Homer Ave.
- Bus lane extended past the intersection.

### **Bus Lane Extension**

We will extend the bus lane to the Homer Avenue bus stop. This creates space for a dedicated left turn lane onto Homer Avenue.

- Allows drivers to continue straight without having to change lanes
- Gives buses space to stop to pick up and drop off riders in a dedicated lane.

### Westbound Lane Reduction

We will reduce the westbound general travel lane from two to one. By adding turn lanes and making changes to signal timing, we're able to do this with minimal changes to travel times.

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
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#### **Improvements to Bike Facilities**

#### **Aberdeen Avenue to Homer Avenue:**

We'll add two-way separated bike lanes (separated from vehicle lanes with white flex posts). This is an upgrade from no bike facilities today

#### Homer Avenue to Belmont Street (westbound, toward Belmont/Watertown): We'll keep the standard bike lane that is there today.

#### **Belmont Street to Homer Avenue** (eastbound, toward Harvard):

We'll extend the shared bus/bike lane. This is an upgrade from having no bike accommodation today.

### **Bicycle Jughandle Across from Homer Avenue** (Planned Construction: 2024)

We will reconstruct the curb across from Homer Avenue, on the same side of the street as Mt. Auburn Cemetery

- We will install a new ramp to give people biking an ulletall-ages-and-abilities connection across Mt. Auburn Street into the two-way bike lane.
- We will widen the existing ramp to improve accessibility ulletand accommodate people both walking and biking.
