What are the origins of MYNM?

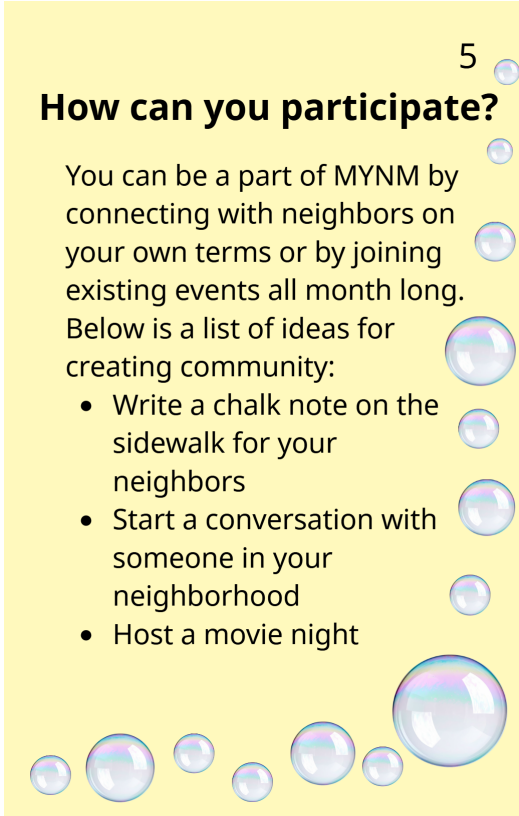

What is Meet Your Neighbor Month?

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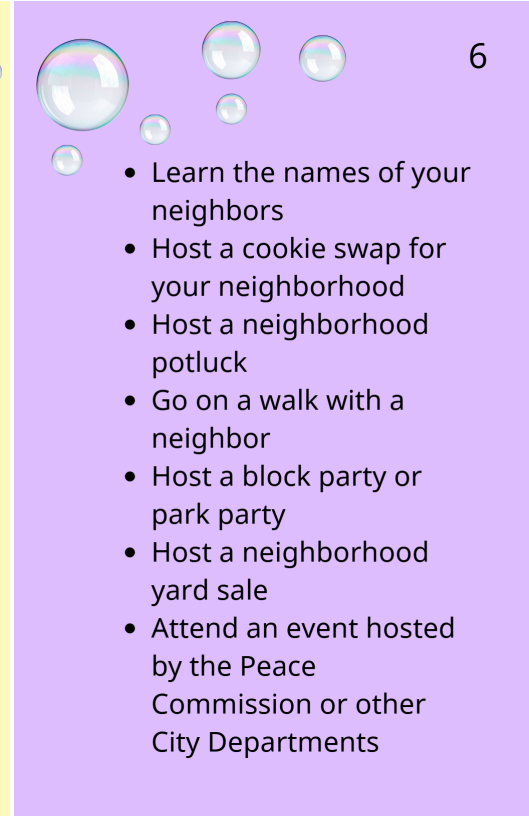
How can you participate?
