

# DHSP Afterschool Programs Comparison Chart

All of DHSP's afterschool programs encourage children and young people to build relationships, connect with peers, learn new skills, and have fun! Below is a chart that shares key similarities and differences between our 4 afterschool models serving Cambridge children.

**Please Note:** families who apply and enroll for **2 days per week must enroll for Tuesday / Thursday** and families who apply and enroll for **3 days per week must enroll for Monday / Wednesday / Friday**.

King Open Extended Day Program (KOED)	K – 5 <i>Must attend King Open for elementary school</i>	September – June	2, 3, or 5 days per week	Based on household size, income, and number of days enrolled each week	Links school-day learning and afterschool experiences for KOED students
Cambridge Youth Programs (CYP)	4 – 8	September – June	2, 3, or 5 days per week	Based on household size, income, and number of days enrolled each week	A variety of activities focused on leadership development, STEAM learning, future planning, and mentorship
