LGBT Teacher's Event Report

Event went well. About 20+ people. Bob Parlin spoke & gave some great remarks about LGBT educators, advocacy, and history. Great networking event. Many CRLS educators who did not know each other before had the chance to meet.

Youth Committee report

- We created an email list, **QFEd-Cambridge** (Queer-Friendly Educators in Cambridge) to facilitate organization among the teachers. Everyone who signed in at the event was invited, plus anyone we knew about who was invited but didn't come, plus all Commissioners.
- Bill will post photos of the event on Facebook. If anyone has any better than Bill took, send them to him.
- Future plans: Mostly, we want to encourage the teachers to do more, perhaps regular presentation to each other, etc., but to let them organize & host them. We also want to encourage (but not plan) multi-school gatherings (like inviting all to the CRLS Assembly).
- Once the list is populated, we will ask the list what date works best for the Teacher Appreciation event next year, perhaps Teacher Appreciation Week, perhaps the week just before the students show up. (Jessica added at the Commission meeting that the private schools get out later, and Harvard Square may not be the best location for teachers coming in from other areas.)

Cultural Competency Training and Gender Neutral Bathroom status

John & Aren met with the Aide to the City Manager, Chris Burke, and the City Training Manager and they are committed to city employee LGBTQ cultural competency training. The issue now is how to determine what the curriculum should be, and who will teach it. Several possibilities have been identified

Taha Jennings (City Manager's office) is creating a list of city buildings and their bathroom configurations. John and others will followup.

Senior's Health Care project report

Our intern, Elysia Chandler, is working on a final report. Final report will be distributed by email several weeks before the next meeting, so we can start thinking about what we want to do with the survey data.

Aren, John, and possibly two other Commissioners will be attending a City Manager-sponsored meeting on May 6 of several Commissions to share information and ideas for future collaboration.

Neil suggested that we more systematically review our history and plan our future projects. We formed a Strategic Planning subcommittee of Neil, Steven, John, and Lesley. More Commissioners are welcome to join.
