2	ELIZABETH LINT: License Commission
3	Decision Making hearing, Thursday, August 5,
4	2010. It's ten a.m. We're in the Michael J.
5	Lombardi Municipal Building, 831 Mass. Ave.
6	basement conference room. Before you the
7	Commissioner Robert Haas and Deputy Chief Dan
8	Turner.
9	From the July 12th agenda, the only
10	outstanding matter was Blue Fin.
11	ROBERT C. HAAS: Do we want to
12	approve the Minutes from the 26th or not? I
13	just saw them, didn't l?
14	ELIZABETH LINT: I didn't get them.
15	But that doesn't mean that I I don't
16	al ways get them.
17	ROBERT HAAS: I thought Chris just
18	sent them out.
19	ELIZABETH LINT: Well, then, yes.
20	He didn't send it to me.
21	ROBERT C. HAAS: You were at the

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1	26th meeting?
2	DANIEL TURNER: Oh, the 26th, yes.
3	ELIZABETH LINT: Then he can vote.
4	ROBERT C. HAAS: So, I make a motion
5	to accept the minutes of the July 26th
6	heari ng.
7	DANIEL TURNER: Seconded.
8	ROBERT C. HAAS: All in favor?
9	DANI EL TURNER: Aye.
10	ROBERT C. HAAS: Aye.
11	* * * *
12	ELIZABETH LINT: Okay. Blue Fin.
13	One of the proposed stockholders I believe
14	had an issue that they needed to address with
15	me. They did. I have no problem with it.
16	ROBERT C. HAAS: You have no problem
17	with it?
18	ELI ZABETH LI NT: No.
19	ROBERT C. HAAS: No, if you're
20	satisfied, I'm satisfied.
21	DANIEL TURNER: Make a motion to

1	approve the Blue Fin license.
2	ROBERT C. HAAS: Second.
3	DANIEL TURNER: All in favor?
4	ROBERT C. HAAS: Aye.
5	* * * *
6	ELIZABETH LINT: And then from July
7	26th we have the Tewodros Bekele.
8	ROBERT C. HAAS: The Hackney
9	license?
10	ELIZABETH LINT: The Hackney
11	license. The refusal of the hearing doc.
12	ROBERT C. HAAS: So here's my
13	dilemma. If he's now made a disclosure that
14	he has severe allergies, I'm just debating or
15	wondering if we should insist that the owner
16	of the cab or owner of the medallion now
17	install a protective cage to render that
18	operator to continue to operate that vehicle.
19	ELIZABETH LINT: I don't think we
20	can mandate that the owner install something
21	because that driver doesn't have to drive

1 that cab. He can drive another cab. 2 ROBERT C. HAAS: But he's going to 3 have the same problem no matter what cab he 4 dri ves. 5 ELIZABETH LINT: That's his problem, it's not the owner's problem. 6 7 ROBERT C. HAAS: I make it the owner's problem. He's going to allow him to 8 9 That's his cab, his medallion. work for him. 10 He knows this individual has now 11 declared that he's got --12 ELIZABETH LINT: He probably has no 13 i dea. 14 ROBERT C. HAAS: Well, I think we 15 have an obligation to let him know that he's 16 declared that. I think in some respect, too, if he continues to do this, then we have to 17 18 go back to the medallion owner and say if you 19 can allow him to continue to do this and he 20 continues to deny fares based on the fact 21 that he has an allergy towards dogs, I think

1	at some point the medallion owner is going to
2	have to decide what he wants to do about
3	that.
4	ELIZABETH LINT: My bigger problem
5	with it is that he never put anything on file
6	with the License Commission.
7	ROBERT C. HAAS: Yes.
8	ELIZABETH LINT: He came in days
9	later
10	ROBERT C. HAAS: Yes.
11	ELIZABETH LINT: with a letter
12	from an ER saying that he had hay fever.
13	ROBERT C. HAAS: Yes. I get all
14	that.
15	ELIZABETH LINT: That's my
16	ROBERT C. HAAS: No, I get all that.
17	And I still consider him responsible because
18	he had an obligation to declare that if in
19	fact he does have an allergy long before this
20	and not after the fact. So, as far as I'm
21	concerned, he's still responsible for the

1 fine as associated with -- I'm just wondering 2 if he's now making this assertion that he has 3 this type of allergy, who now is responsible 4 of making sure that we don't find ourselves 5 in this situation again? 6 ELIZABETH LINT: I think what we can 7 do is mandate that he only operate cabs that 8 have partitions unless if he's not, then he's 9 off the road. 10 ROBERT C. HAAS: That's fine by me. 11 I mean, can we do that to him or do we do 12 that to the medallion owner? 13 ELIZABETH LINT: We can do that to 14 hi m. 15 DANIEL TURNER: It's actually 16 already there under Rule 6. The onus is upon 17 the driver. I mean if he's disclosing an 18 allergy, he knows he can only drive with a 19 petitioned vehicle. 20 ROBERT C. HAAS: Okay. 21 Right. ELI ZABETH LI NT:

1 DANI EL TURNER: There is nothing in 2 Rule 6 that I see that would impose anything 3 upon the owners to, as Elizabeth said, to 4 mandate updating their vehicle. So the onus 5 is on the driver to comply with the Rule 6 6 now that he's disclosed his allergies. 7 With regards to the decision, on the 8 appeal for the decision, I would move to 9 uphold the decision of Elizabeth's decision 10 on the disciplinary. 11 ROBERT C. HAAS: How many decisions 12 would that be? So you're making a motion 13 that you are going to uphold the --14 DANI EL TURNER: \$300 fine. 15 ROBERT C. HAAS: Yes. I'll second 16 that. 17 DANI EL TURNER: \$300 fine. 18 ROBERT C. HAAS: And I would offer 19 as a notice with respect to the driver, 20 telling him that we've upheld the fine, that 21 he's also under now an obligation to, in

1	light of the fact that he's disclosed his
2	allergies after the violation, that he's now
3	going forward, has an obligation to
4	provi de for protecti ve cage any cabs he
5	operates.
6	ELIZABETH LINT: Did you vote that?
7	ROBERT C. HAAS: I just made an
8	amendment to his motion to uphold it. No, I
9	guess it was a separate motion.
10	DANIEL TURNER: So, on the first
11	motion, all in favor?
12	ROBERT C. HAAS: Right. Aye.
13	DANI EL TURNER: Aye.
14	And on the second motion?
15	ROBERT C. HAAS: Make a motion that
16	we advise him of his obligation under Rule
17	No. 6, that he s now has to install a
18	protective cage with any cab he operates in
19	light of the medical condition he's
20	i denti fi ed.
21	DANIEL TURNER: I'll second that.

1	ROBERT C. HAAS: All in favor?
2	DANI EL TURNER: Aye.
3	ROBERT C. HAAS: Aye.
4	* * * *
5	ROBERT C. HAAS: So the only other
6	thing I have is
7	ELI ZABETH LI NT: Bri an Jay's.
8	ROBERT C. HAAS: Bri an Jay's Snack
9	Ti me.
10	So, I'm assuming that the officers
11	never found him operating in other locations
12	that he indicated he was going to, right?
13	ELIZABETH LINT: Well, originally he
14	told us he was in one place. And now he's
15	told us that he's at three others.
16	ROBERT C. HAAS: Three others?
17	ELIZABETH LINT: Yes.
18	ROBERT C. HAAS: This is after we
19	had the hearing?
20	ELIZABETH LINT: That when we told
21	him to come in with the information. So he

1	came in and gave me three stops that he's
2	doing. They have not seen him anywhere else.
3	ROBERT C. HAAS: What's the name of
4	on the side of his truck?
5	ELI ZABETH LI NT: Bri an Jay's.
6	ROBERT C. HAAS: It is Brian Jay's?
7	ELIZABETH LINT: Yes.
8	ROBERT C. HAAS: Okay. Because who
9	is J&J Catering?
10	ELIZABETH LINT: That one's okay.
11	ROBERT C. HAAS: Okay.
12	DANIEL TURNER: I wrote down that if
13	we gave him a temporary license, to issue
14	pending the full license, if operating other
15	than the three areas approved. One was
16	Mobardi's (phonetic), and I didn't catch the
17	other two areas. So I did write the three.
18	So I thought we had discussion it was three.
19	ELIZABETH LINT: He didn't really
20	he gave me 67 Linnaean, 73 Layman (sic) and
21	900 Mem. Drive.

1	ROBERT C. HAAS: He did say three at
2	some point. It went from a couple to three
3	before he left.
4	ELI ZABETH LI NT: Yes.
5	DANIEL TURNER: What was the second
6	street?
7	ELI ZABETH LI NT: Layman?
8	DANI EL TURNER: Layton?
9	ELIZABETH LINT: I don't know.
10	DANIEL TURNER: Which is totally not
11	where Mobardi's is.
12	ELIZABETH LINT: None of these are.
13	DANIEL TURNER: There is no Layman
14	Street.
15	In any event, on the application as he
16	came in this morning to process the paperwork
17	and have our signatures, but he did not have
18	the vehicle for us to inspect and that's due
19	to show up at one o'clock at headquarters.
20	So, I guess would approve pending final
21	i nspecti ons.

1	ELIZABETH LINT: All inspections?
2	DANIEL TURNER: Inspection signoff,
3	the license signoff.
4	ELIZABETH LINT: The other issue was
5	the background check.
6	ROBERT C. HAAS: Yes, I sent you an
7	e-mail with my conversation with the Chief.
8	ELIZABETH LINT: Yes.
9	DANIEL TURNER: Now, we don't have a
10	cap on peddler's licenses for the trucks,
11	canteens, like everything else, we're trying
12	to
13	ELI ZABETH LI NT: No.
14	And the officers haven't really been
15	out looking for this one because they've been
16	on the trail of D&D which is not licensed and
17	has been all over the city.
18	DANIEL TURNER: This is supposedly a
19	brand new, spanking brand new vehicle.
20	ROBERT C. HAAS: Which one?
21	DANI EL TURNER: This Brian Jay's.

1	ROBERT C. HAAS: He claims he
2	invested like \$60,000 in it or something like
3	that.
4	ELIZABETH LINT: It started out at
5	60 and then it went to 40 and then it went to
6	24.
7	ROBERT C. HAAS: There were two
8	parts to it, though, a front and a back.
9	I mean, I don't know.
10	DANIEL TURNER: So, I guess if he
11	shows up and the inspection is fine and the
12	fire signs off on it, where does it go from
13	there once we sign it, sanitary? Who else
14	would have to sign on it?
15	ELIZABETH LINT: Kristen's already
16	seen it I think.
17	DANI EL TURNER: Okay. So we' re the
18	last ones in the loop?
19	ELIZABETH LINT: Yes.
20	DANIEL TURNER: So if the fire
21	department signs off and approves it and

1	comes back to License, do you have any issues
2	on your end? In other words, everybody
3	signed and approved, there's nothing left to
4	not issue?
5	ELIZABETH LINT: Well, I have big
6	issues, but I don't vote.
7	DANIEL TURNER: So is it still in
8	question then, we should continue, maybe
9	continue this pending further
10	ELIZABETH LINT: It's up to you.
11	DANI EL TURNER: What are your issues
12	still remaining?
13	ROBERT C. HAAS: Well, both
14	individuals have I mean, despite the fact
15	that Chief Mazey believes that that's just
16	typical for people in this kind of business
17	to have an extensive background. And I'm not
18	convinced that we're not going to see him
19	vi ol ati ng agai n, so.
20	So what I would offer to do is to
21	follow on Deputy Chief's motion, to make an

1	approval pending the completion of the
2	inspections with a six-month review.
3	DANIEL TURNER: I'll second that.
4	ELIZABETH LINT: Would that be with
5	a background check in six months?
6	ROBERT C. HAAS: I think, yes. It
7	would all be inclusive. We have to look at
8	the whole thing all over again to make sure
9	there are no pending issues. If he has some
10	additional incidence, problems beyond that, l
11	think we'll take that as part of the
12	consideration as part of the six-month
13	revi ew.
14	DANIEL TURNER: I second that.
15	ROBERT C. HAAS: All in favor?
16	DANI EL TURNER: Aye.
17	ROBERT C. HAAS: Aye.
18	So we just voted on your license.
19	BRI AN CULEPHER: Yes, sir.
20	ROBERT C. HAAS: Okay? We're
21	approving your license.

1 BRI AN CULEPHER: Thank you. 2 ROBERT C. HAAS: But we're going to 3 do a six-month review. If we have any issues 4 between the time of the issuance of your 5 license and that six-month review, in light 6 of everything we've been through, we're going 7 to take that into consideration as well. 8 just understand if there's any problems, even 9 if they're relatively minor, you already have 10 a track history for the fact that you've been 11 operating without a license in the city. 12 just caution you is you want to be extra 13 careful these next six months. 14 BRIAN CULEPHER: I appreciate it 15 very much. Thank you all. There won't be no 16 i nci dence. 17 ROBERT C. HAAS: I'm hoping. 18 And we approved the DANI EL TURNER: 19 minutes of all the meetings? 20 ROBERT C. HAAS: Only the ones you 21 can vote on.

1	ELIZABETH LINT: Only the one that
2	you can.
3	DANI EL TURNER: Okay. You're ahead
4	of me.
5	ELIZABETH LINT: And I have nothing
6	el se.
7	ROBERT C. HAAS: So I make a motion
8	to adj ourn.
9	DANIEL TURNER: Second it.
10	ROBERT C. HAAS: All in favor?
11	DANI EL TURNER: Aye.
12	(Whereupon, at 10:10 a.m., the
13	meeti ng adjourned.)
