Before you are the Commissioners Nicole

Murati Ferrer, City Electrician Stephen

Lenkauskas, and Superintendent of Streets William

Dwyer.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to approve the minutes of the February

16th meeting?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

in favor?

If there are any residents abutters to speak on any petitions?

CONTINUED PETITION

EVERSOURCE - 26 RESERVOIR STREET

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: I don't see any, so the first petition is Eversource for Reservoir Street.

State your name for the record.

JACQUI DUFFY: She knows me.

DOUG HANNA: Doug Hanna, D-O-U-G

H-A-N-N-A. S&H Construction.

ANTHONY LAMPASONA: Anthony Lampasona

A-N-T-H-O-N-Y L-A-M-P-A-S-O-N-A. Lampasona &

Bloomer Electric.

JACQUI DUFFY: This is a revised sketch.

We were going from pole 6 to service 26 Reservoir and we were asked by the city to change it and we came up with a resolution to go to pole 9.

So we have the revised sketch, the revised plans and petition. I think everyone met out at 26 Reservoir.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:
We met with the developer and contractors and
electrician. Plan looks fine.

Just one note I want to make when it comes to the zoning -- that if it comes to the permit, it needs to be minimum of four feet off the face of the curb or as close as we can to do it. If there's a utility line in the way, we'll figure it out on site. It needs to be four feet, as best we can.

That's really the only comment I have for

this after the review.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: The only other question is, communications for that property, I think we had an earlier --

ANTHONY LAMPASONA: Anthony's here from Comcast and I believe he has.

ANTHONY VATALARO: Anthony Vatalaro, V-A-T-A-L-A-R-O.

We applied last season with Pole & Conduit and it was approved.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: You did. And I believe there's a conduit there. Is that the conduit?

ANTHONY LAMPASONA: I thought that duty may have been stubbed and I talked to my partner about it.

And he told me, I told him we could put that conduit in but we had to stub the service, so I believe it got approved and we put that in

but the service is stubbed to the property line.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: So that three inch goes into the property and that's a Comcast conduit that was approved last year, so that's a done deal.

ANTHONY LAMPASONA: It's a done deal.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: And there's no other communication in the property, that's the last dig for the electric?

ANTHONY LAMPASONA: That's it.

Other than all typical conditions, motion to approve.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

Thank you.

NEW PETITION

EVERSOURCE - ALBANY STREET

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: The second petition is also Eversource for Albany Street.

This one is here Albany Street,
northeasterly, from manhole 3502, approximately
180 feet southwest of Portland Street, a distance
of about 265 feet of conduit.

The work is necessary to support a service upgrade to MIT. Additional underground lines are necessary due to MIT load, growth new buildings.

JACQUI DUFFY: And this was taken off the agenda in August of 2015. It was brought back because the gas company is out there now

installing, so we think we could get in there too.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

If memory serves, which I think it will in this

case, we continued this a couple times back two

and a half years ago.

And they had the construction going through a brand-new sidewalk bump-out crosswalk and new curbing and all that good stuff.

 $\label{eq:JACQUI DUFFY: And I think it is still} \\ going the same way.$

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:
Steve reminded me it was the same design as it
was before, so you need to work on that.

JACQUI DUFFY: So change -- get it off the sidewalk?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:
Yes. Absolutely. Yeah.

And that still means the streets are

under the moratorium, or the five year -- you know, guarantied street moratorium.

JACQUI DUFFY: So if they agree, curb to curb.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Probably have a site visit and see what things we
need to work through there and what challenges we
have here because MIT is -- they do have a big
utility project going on.

It's not that we are totally opposed to it but we need to work some things out.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
Motion to continue.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

EVERSOURCE - SUMNER ROAD

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Third petition is also Eversource for Sumner

Road, easterly from pole No. 9 approximately 125

feet south of Kirkland Street, a distance of

about five feet of conduit.

JACQUI DUFFY: This one is overhead to underground. Right now they are being served overhead and want to go underground. It is five feet from pole 9.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: Any comments?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

I don't have any issues with it.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: Motion to approve.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Second.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Second.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye. With all typical conditions.

NEW PETITION

EVERSOURCE - HAWTHORNE STREET

Fourth petition is Eversource for Hawthorne

Street at Acacia Street and westerly of pole 5, a

distance of five feet of conduit.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

This work is necessary to supply power to 23 Hawthorne Street.

JACQUI DUFFY: This is the same, overhead to underground.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: You wouldn't be aware what is happening with communications on these projects?

JACQUI DUFFY: No, I wouldn't.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Anthony, have you heard anything?

ANTHONY VATALARO: I don't recognize either address. I haven't heard from anybody.

When you -- they are doing this work themselves

on both of them it looks like, by customer?

JACQUI DUFFY: Yes.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: So do you notify them that it has been approved and they can go forward?

JACQUI DUFFY: I notify sales and then sales notifies them.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Could you make a note that they are to contact the communication companies?

JACQUI DUFFY: Sure.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Just so they can --

EVERSOURCE - NEW STREET

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Fifth petition. This is also Eversource for New Street, northwesterly side, approximately 501 feet north of Bay State Road, relocate one joint-owned pole approximately 10 feet northeast. Pole 12.

This work is necessary per request of the City of Cambridge to support a new bike path.

And I'm aware of this one.

I believe this is for access to a bike path to that new bike path trail in the back.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Right.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to approve.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All

in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Typical

conditions.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

With typical conditions.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Please.

NEW PETITION

EVERSOURCE - BIRCH STREET

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Also Eversource for Birch Street, westerly side,
approximately 34 feet northeast of Concord

Avenue, relocate four joint-owned poles to
easterly side.

I recently spoke with the engineer.

There may be some miscommunications. These were only supposed to be moved to the curb and not across the street.

JACQUI DUFFY: Do they have it on the plan?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: The plan shows it being -- all these poles being moved across the street.

JACQUI DUFFY: The plan does?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Yeah, and it also says so.

JACQUI DUFFY: On the thing it said so.

Hold on. It was only supposed to be moved 18 inches.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Correct. All to the curb line because of the new sidewalk there.

JACQUI DUFFY: Oh, it does show it?

Okay. They did it wrong. We'll resubmit with the 18 inches.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Right. I think --

JACQUI DUFFY: That's what he called for, install 18 inches off the street, curb.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Correct.

JACQUI DUFFY: Because of the street widening.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: So if you can send a revised sketch, we could

approve this only going to the curb line of the same side.

JACQUI DUFFY: Okay. You want a revised plan?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
Yes.

JACQUI DUFFY: Do I do a petition and send that also?

think just a revised sketch. We'll approve -I'll make a motion to approve to remove poles 2,
4, 6 and 8 to the curb line on the same side of
the street, which is the westerly side of the
street.

JACQUI DUFFY: Okay.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: On that motion?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Don't they also -- it is wrong on the petition as well,

isn't it?

JACQUI DUFFY: It is.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Yeah.

JACQUI DUFFY: When I get the new plan, I can just do it.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Shouldn't they submit that as well so we have a written record?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
Okay.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: So I'm fine with approving it.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: As?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: As

understood here, but not as on the papers.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Okay.

On the motion with all typical conditions?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:
Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: .

NEW PETITION

EVERSOURCE - COOLIDGE HILL

Also Eversource. This is for Coolidge Hill, northerly from manhole 1707, approximately 610 feet east of Coolidge Hill Road, a distance of about 4 feet of conduit. This work is necessary to supply power to 175 Coolidge Hill Road.

JACQUI DUFFY: Right.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: So a new building, it looks like.

JACQUI DUFFY: Yes. It will go off that to feed 177 also, going to go to a hand hole. It is not shown on that, but --

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: On private property?

JACQUI DUFFY: Yes.

Okay. This is -- the manhole is at the property line of 173, 175 and you are taking it into a hand hole --

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

JACQUI DUFFY: Yes.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
-- which will be on private property.

Same with this on communications. It's an underground street but I'm -- I would like them to be aware that if they need communications services also where that should be fed from.

JACQUI DUFFY: Okay.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to approve with all typical conditions?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All

in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

JACQUI DUFFY: Thanks.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Thank you.

This is for Comcast.

ANTHONY VATALARO: Good morning.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Good

morning.

CONTINUED PETITION

COMCAST - CARDINAL MEDEIROS AVENUE

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

This is a first petition, it has been continued,

for Cardinal Medeiros Avenue. I think we were

requesting contact with Verizon, or whoever owns

the existing conduit to the property.

ANTHONY VATALARO: It is Verizon. I know they have a meeting with them tomorrow.

So we haven't received permission to use it as of yet.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: Who has a meeting?

ANTHONY VATALARO: This is the fiber group. Comcast fiber group.

There's no permission as of right now.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: We'll

continue?

ANTHONY VATALARO: Yes.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

You have the meeting scheduled for tomorrow?

ANTHONY VATALARO: When?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

No. You have the meeting scheduled with Verizon?

ANTHONY VATALARO: Yes. The fiber group

does.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Given that --

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to continue?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All

in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

NEW PETITION

COMCAST - BISHOP ALLEN DRIVE

Also Comcast for 515 Mass Ave from existing

Comcast manhole on Bishop Allen Drive. Trench

254 feet southerly to the property line of 515

Mass Ave, installing 1, 4-inch PCV conduit.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

This will include the removal and replacement of one sidewalk panel and one new Comcast sidewalk vault. From new Comcast sidewalk vault, trench westerly 28 feet to the property line of 541 Mass Ave installing 1, 4-inch conduit.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
They are not currently served now.

ANTHONY VATALARO: No. We don't have service on Mass Ave in that area. So Bishop Allen is the closest service we have to that

manhole. Both properties have requested service multiple times for years.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Verizon doesn't have any distinct conduit in that

area?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
That's all underground, this area.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: How far?

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

This end -- there's a pole, but the excavation would be pretty much the same, the first pole is much closer to Bishop Allen. I don't think we would gain anything by that.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Public Works is good with that.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to approve with typical conditions?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All in favor?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Aye.

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

NEW PETITION

COMCAST - CHANNING CIRCLE

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Also Comcast for Channing Circle from existing pole 14, trench of 6 feet easterly in the public way ending at the property of Channing Circle, installing 1, 3-inch conduit.

This will include the removal and replacement of one sidewalk panel.

ANTHONY VATALARO: So --

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: Is there a vault right inside the property?

ANTHONY VATALARO: Yeah.

So this is 4 and 5 Channing Circle are currently served aerially and both of those drops are attached to trees, which, obviously, is not ideal.

And 3 is served over the property at 14 Channing Street, so this is an aerial trespass issue.

And the homeowners are paving Channing

Circle come springtime, and so this would be our

one opportunity to get in there prior to paving

to fix the issues.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Works for Public Works, so to speak.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Sure. The only thing is, has Verizon -- I have

spoken to Verizon on this.

Is there a chance they could share that trench if at some time --

ANTHONY VATALARO: I did talk with Matt and he doesn't have any intentions of doing anything.

That's why I'm putting in a 3-inch because I'm assuming they are going to jump in the same pipe.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: If they jump in the same pipe, do you charge them a lease fee for that space?

ANTHONY VATALARO: Usually not because we don't typically lease conduits.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:
Could be a first time.

ANTHONY VATALARO: We'll see.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER: Business opportunity.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Motion to approve with typical conditions?

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Seconded.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: All

in favor?

CHAIR NICOLE MURATI FERRER: Aye.

SUPERINTENDENT OF STREETS WILLIAM DWYER:

Aye.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Aye.

ANTHONY VATALARO: Thank you.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Mobilitie.

CONTINUED PETITION

MOBILITIE - LAMBERT STREET

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: So this first petition is for Lambert Street, which

has been continued a few times in the past.

ATTY BRIAN GROSSMAN: Brian Grossman,
G-R-O-S-S-M-A-N. Anderson Kreiger,
A-N-D-E-R-S-O-N K-R-E-I-G-E-R.

ROSANNA FERRANTE: Rosanna, and last name is Ferrante F-E-R-R-A-N-T-E.

I'm so excited. It has been -- I won't go into this whole thing. We submitted everything to Dana. All licenses, for all three of the petitions on the agenda today. And we noticed everybody. I actually spoke to a couple of abutters that called. They are curious when the meeting was, and to make sure they knew the details of that and what the application was for.

ATTY BRIAN GROSSMAN: On the specific one in question, this one already had the license, it was whether or not the pole needed to be replaced.

This one and the other two, no poles need to be replaced.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS: I

do have concerns about the Lambert Street one,

that being a riser pole and so close to the

building there.

If there's an issue going forward with the close proximity to that building because I have a feeling that pole, they are either going to change -- I'm not sure. They don't usually allow a riser pole, I see you got licensing.

ROSANNA FERRANTE: We phrased the issue "Are you 100 percent sure we you can do this?"

ATTY BRIAN GROSSMAN: From day one, you raised that and I was aware of it and we've repeatedly raised it and asked, and asked "Look, typically isn't normal. And it is a riser pole, does it need to move?" And the answer has come back on this one for some reason "no" and they

issued the license.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Okay. Repeatedly.

ROSANNA FERRANTE: Maybe they have a plan for it. Maybe Eversource knows something that we don't in terms of what they plan to do with that pole.

CITY ELECTRICIAN STEPHEN LENKAUSKAS:

Maybe remove it and then you'll be stuck with an antenna.
