BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS' MEETING MINUTES Wednesday, April 30, 2025, 10:00 a.m. By Remote Participation Via Zoom

This meeting was held remotely in accordance with Chapter 2 of the Acts of 2025 adopted by the Massachusetts General Court and approved by the Governor.

Board Members: Nicole Murati Ferrer (present); Christine A. Elow (absent); and Thomas Cahill, Jr. (present).

Staff Members Present: Chris O'Neil; and Kris Foster.

Decisions: All decisions, unless otherwise stated, were 2-0, and by roll call.

Note as to Recording of Meeting: Matters were called out of order. The Board started with matter #9, then proceeded to #6, #1-5, #17, #6, and then consecutively in remaining order until the end of the agenda.

Public Testimony Matters

Note: Agenda items #1-4 were heard together and voted on separately.

1. Application #1160406 Zachary Viegas, Turner Construction, for a Special Noise Variance at 121 Broadway from 5/1/25 - 3/15/26 (Saturdays and Sundays only) from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. (variance hours 7:00 a.m. -9:00 a.m., and 6:00 p.m. -11:00 p.m.) for a total of 24 weekends, for tower crane and hoist jump installations. The variance is sought in the interest of limiting impacts on pedestrian and vehicular traffic as well as extending the day to accommodate the full scope of work.

Present: Investigator Joseph Kelley; Investigator Tyler Bubenik; Nick Pisanelli and Zach Viegas.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto.

Summary: This application requests a special noise variance for crane and hoist operations to be conducted on weekends to ensure business continuity for abutters and active businesses since there will be 400-450 workers on a daily basis. The applicant does not believe all 24 weekends will be needed but wanted to give the Board the "worst case" scenario. The Board acknowledged that crane operations are difficult and often last minute.

Decision: Granted with conditions: (1) limited to 24 weekends/uses, thereafter the grant is moot and variance is no longer valid; (2) at least 48 hours prior to exercising, must inform the License Commission of the intent to use via email to noise@cambridgema.gov; (3) must obtain Sunday Work Permit; and (4) cannot exercise the variance on 5/24-25,7/5-6, and 11/29-30.

2. Application #1160464, Zachary Viegas, Turner Construction, for a Special Noise Variance at 121 Broadway from 5/3/25 – 7/1/25 (Saturdays and Sundays only) from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. (variance

hours 7:00 a.m. -9:00 a.m., and 6:00 p.m. -11:00 p.m.) for setting up shoring systems using hand tools, trucking, and hoisting equipment. The variance is sought in the interest of limiting impacts on pedestrian and vehicular traffic as well as extending the day to accommodate the full scope of work.

Present: Investigator Joseph Kelley; Investigator Tyler Bubenik; Nick Pisanelli and Zach Viegas.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto.

Summary: This application requests a special noise variance for setting up a shoring system at night because the shoring system needs to be completed as soon as possible to protect workers and pedestrians; a partial system only offers partial safety. This is a total of 9 weekends for installing temporary overhead protection on the West Service Road and East Service Road, more decorative in nature as it will be there for a long time. The West Road will take about 3 weekends to develop, and East Service Road is a larger stretch so expecting it to take 4 weekends. They may not need all the time, but built in some wiggle room in their ask. Board noted public services are stretched on Memorial Day weekend.

Decision: Granted except for on 5/24-25, and with the condition that must obtain Sunday Work Permit.

3. Application #1160427, Zachary Viegas, Turner Construction, for a Special Noise Variance at 121 Broadway from 5/3/25 – 12/31/26 (Monday through Saturday) from 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., for finishing of concrete placements, surveying, and layout of embedded concrete items. Equipment needed to perform these scopes of work includes hand tools, finishing equipment, and surveying equipment. The variance is sought in the interest of limiting impacts on pedestrian and vehicular traffic as well as extending the day to accommodate the full scope of work.

Present: Investigator Joseph Kelley; Investigator Tyler Bubenik; Nick Pisanelli and Zach Viegas.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto.

Summary: This application requests a special noise variance for concrete pouring at night because concrete delivery and pouring is unpredictable, especially in busy daytime traffic and as the weather cools down. The applicant does not plan on going past 6:00 p.m. if it can be avoided. The proposed duration is 5/3/25 to 12/31/25 (not 2026). Board discussed how it usually does not issue variances for longer than three months.

Decision: Granted for three months only (8/2/25 as end date) and for the limited purpose of finishing concrete pours only. All other work must be performed during regular construction hours.

4. Application #1160370, Zachary Viegas, Turner Construction, for a Special Noise Variance at 121 Broadway from 5/1/25 – 12/31/26 (Monday through Friday) from 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m., for the delivery of shakeout and hoisting equipment using hand tools, welding tools, generators, cranes, and trucks. The variance is sought in the interest of limiting impacts on pedestrian and vehicular traffic as well as extending the day to accommodate the full scope of work.

Present: Investigator Joseph Kelley; Investigator Tyler Bubenik; Nick Pisanelli and Zach Viegas.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto.

Summary: This request is for a special noise variance for the delivery of equipment through the life of the project (through 2026). With a project of this magnitude there is a considerable volume of materials that need to be delivered to the site and then hoisted to the necessary floors. This work will be limited to second shift. Board discussed how it usually does not issue variances for longer than three months.

Decision: Granted for three months only (8/1/25 as end date) and for the limited purpose of second shift deliveries and loading of material only; no construction activity allowed during the variance time. All other work must be performed during regular construction hours.

5. Application #1158610 William White, D.W. White Construction, for a Special Noise Variance from 6/1/25 - 6/13/25 (Alt. 6/15/25 - 6/27/25), at the intersection of Land Boulevard and Cambridgeside Place, from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. the following mornings, beginning for the week on Sunday nights and ending on Friday Mornings, to perform roadway paving and striping using a paver, roller, striping truck, powered light towers, and trucking. The variance is sought to minimize impacts to vehicular traffic and for public safety.

Present: Investigator Tyler Bubenik; and Dave Pellegri, Construction Vice President; Peter DeVito, Director of Operations; William ("Bill") White, Project Manager.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; and file.

Summary: The applicant seeks this special noise variance to work overnight for recontouring and overlaying the intersection. There is considerable pedestrian and vehicular traffic due to the Galleria Mall and Sonesta Hotel. Overnight work will dramatically lower the volume of traffic that would have to work around this project. Furthermore, the materials used to pave are delivered hot and there is unpredictability for the trucks to arrive in a timely manner due to daytime traffic from this project. The Board acknowledged the valid safety concerns in performing this work during the day at this intersection.

Decision: Granted with the condition that a Sunday Work Permit is required.

6. Application #1153537 [Continued from March 25, 2025] French Express, LLC d/b/a PRB Boulangerie, 295 Third Street, Common Victualler All Alcohol License #216979, for a Change of Closing Hour to 12:00 a.m. all nights.

Present: Attorney Tyler Hensler Upton; and Loic Le Garrec. Naomi Leeds, resident/abutter.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; file.

Summary: The applicant discussed their morning prep work, which starts at 3:00 a.m. in order to be ready for 7:00 a.m. opening. This early start is because the bakery goods take two to three hours to proof and then need to be baked. They provide a small quantity of baked goods, 50-100 items, to its sister location in Time Out Market, but that location is closing. They have a wholesale license that will permit them to sell their goods to another business in Somerville, which will also be a small quantity of baked goods. These wholesale operations do not affect the prep starting time. The Board acknowledged these start prep times are consistent with other bakery operations within the City. In addition, the Board noted it did not have a rule as to how early the business can start prep work prior to opening, but did not that after closing a business only has 2 hours per Board's Rules.

The Board reminded the applicant that their maximum occupancy is 47, inclusive of staff, because the applicant has made several applications for one-day amendments of closing hour for private events that request to operate over occupancy.

Through counsel the applicant indicated they would accept an 11:00 p.m. closing time, which they argued is statutorily guaranteed. The Board disagreed with this interpretation of the law. The Board also further inquired from the business owner as to what time they would be closed to public and they reiterated what had been communicated in the previous hearing – 7:00 p.m. They would only operate past 7:00 p.m. for private events that they would host (and when having those "bookings" the business would remain closed to the public).

The applicant discussed steps they have taken since the last hearing to mitigate sound concerns, including (1) removing all hand dryers from the bathrooms; (2) eliminating pounding of pastry dough in the baking process; (3) purchasing dollies to move furniture rather than dragging it; and (4) is contracting to install drop ceiling soundproofing tiles.

Naomi Leeds, a resident and neighbor, is still hearing noise from the business and inquired whether any later closing time would be publicly advertised. The applicant responded that any new extended hours would be advertised publicly. They also explained that private events would be two or three times per week, but that summer months dramatically drop in the number of event requests.

Decision: Granted with the modification and condition that the regular business approved closing hour is 7:00 p.m. (includes having Tuesdays open and operating within the business's approved hours of 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.) unless a special/private event is being hosted at which time the closing hour is 11:00 p.m. with the understanding that the business would be closed to the public as of 7:00 p.m.

Note: Agenda Items 7 & 17 were heard together and voted on separately. Also, matter #17 was called before #7.

7. Application #1157523 Barcelona Cambridge, LLC d/b/a Barcelona Wine Bar, 1688 Massachusetts Avenue, Common Victualler All Alcohol License #146333, for a Change of Manager to Lisa Teitelbaum.

Present: Attorney Tyler Henseler; Lisa Teitelbaum; and Elizabeth Sileo.

Summary: Teitelbaum has eight years of experience in the food and beverage industry and has not been a manager of record before. They are familiar with the rules and regulations of the Board, ABCC, and the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with regard to the sale and service or alcohol. Teitelbaum will submit a TIPS certificate as proof of training in the safe service and sale of alcohol.

Decision: Granted.

Application #1160461 2322 Wine Bar Limited d/b/a The Cat's Meow, 2322 Massachusetts 8. Avenue, All Alcohol General On Premises License #283872, for a Change of d/b/a to Zusammen.

Present: Danielle Pattavina.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; file.

Summary: This business recently opened (about a couple of weeks ago). The applicant requested a change of d/b/a because the Cat's Meow is also the name of a popular beer and they are concerned about trademark issues if they were to remain the same name. There will be no changes to the business's operations as represented at the hearing where the license was granted.

Decision: Granted.

9. **Application #1158551** New Mulan Restaurant LLC, d/b/a Mulan Restaurant, 228 Broadway, Common Victualler Wine & Malt License #185250, for a Change of LLC Managers, Change of Stock Interests and Change of Ownership Interests.

Present: Attorney Russell Chin; and Zhichao Shi.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; file.

Summary: One of the members, Lai Fu, passed away holding a 10% share which the LLC acquired from the estate and then sold to Manager and Member, Hong Tan (who was already a member of the LLC). The consideration paid was \$65,000 in both the purchase and re-sale transactions. The Personal Representative of Lai Fu's estate holds no interest nor a position in the LLC as either as a manager or member. There will be no changes to the business's operations. Board noted since this is an LCL no issuance of stock took place, counsel would submit updated ABCC application.

Decision: Granted.

10. Application #1158471 Petrillo Corporation d/b/a Big Cans, for a New Disposal/Waste Hauler License.

Present: Frank Petrillo.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; file.

Summary: The applicant requests this license to provide open-top construction dumpsters in the City. They do not yet have customers in the City but have received requests for them. They are also a licensed business in other municipalities. The business was advised as to proper hours per City Ordinance for dumpsters in residential versus commercial lots, and also those dumpsters within construction sites.

Decision: Granted.

11. Application #1158108 Mount Auburn Gas, Inc. d/b/a Nick's Service Station, 587 Mount Auburn Street for a New Flammables Licenses for 22,000 gallons of Class 1, 500 gallons of Class 2, 250 gallons of Class 3, and 1,030 cubic feet of flammables gases. This is a previously licensed location; change in ownership.

Summary/Decision: Applicant requested the matter be rescheduled.

12. Application #1157716 Resurgence Investment, LLC d/b/a Jersey Mike's Cambridge, 675 Massachusetts Avenue, for a new Common Victualler License with seating for 16 inside, an inside occupancy of 25 and 9 patio seats on private property and proposed hours of 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. all days. David Martin as Manager of a premises described as: In one large room on ground floor (1,780 sq. ft.) including kitchen, storage and prep area; restrooms; 1 entrance/exit. Seasonal outdoor patio on private property (192 sq. ft.).

Present: Attorney Dennis Quilty; Joshua Martin; and David Martin.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; file.

Summary: The applicant requests this license for a currently vacant location. They will operate as a typical Jersey Mike's location. They have already gone through the approval process with CDD staff via onsite and zoom meetings and received support from the Central Square Advisory Board. They have created custom signage for the front of the business to appear more attractive. It was confirmed that the number of seats on the patio is 12, which is what was requested in the submitted application and plan uploaded to it.

Decision: Granted with total number of seats on the outdoor area of 12.

13. Application #1157059 Chef Zhang Cuisine, Inc. d/b/a Chef Zhang Cuisine & Bar, 1105B Massachusetts Avenue, has applied for a new Common Victualler Wine, Malt and Distilled Spirits License with seating for 60 and proposed hours of 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. all days. Jinou Zhang as proposed Manager of Record of a premises described as: Basement and street level commercial property fronting 1105 Massachusetts Avenue containing approximately 2050 sq. ft. and containing 60 seats eat in capacity; Full kitchen located in the back.

Present: Jinou Zhang; Weimei Zhou; and Kurban Hasan (translator).

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; and existing file.

Summary: This is at the Cilantro location, which holds a full liquor license but it is one that restricted by a no value, non-transferrable clause hence an application for a new license needed to be submitted. The applicant applied for a "wine, malt, and distilled spirits" license but it was clarified that it is an all alcohol license. An updated ABCC application will be provided together with Exhibit A-1 mentioned on the lease which was not attached to the copy provided to the Board.

Jinou Zhang has more than 25 years of experience in the food and beverage industry and has been a manager of record before with no prior violations. They are familiar with the rules and regulations of the Board, ABCC, and the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts with regard to the sale and service or alcohol. They will submit a TIPS certificate as proof of training in the safe service and sale of alcohol.

Decision: Granted for all alcohol pending the submission of an updated ABCC application with All Alcohol category listed on it, Exhibit to the lease uploaded, and affidavit from Cilantro regarding the surrender of the license if the application receives final ABCC approval. The application/Board's grant will not be sent to the ABCC for final approval until the noted documents are provided to the Board.

14. Application #1155871 Violette, LLC d/b/a Violette Bakers, 1782 Massachusetts Avenue, Common Victualler License #256659, to extend the premises to an outdoor area on the public sidewalk (curbside) of 162 sq. ft.

Present: Leesteffy ("Lee") Jenkins.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; and file.

Summary: Violette is seeking to add two small tables in front of their bakery to accommodate their customers with disabilities, in particular Celiac disease. These customers cannot use the city-provided tables on the block because they could be contaminated with gluten. They have discussed these tables with their tenant neighbors, who have no complaints about the proposed tables. There was a discussion that the notice to abutters was late. Applicant stated the only abutter is their landlord who is in support of the application.

Decision: Granted, pending review of grant at the Board's next meeting if any public comment is received, otherwise, the grant will be ratified at the next meeting without further review.

15. Application #1155002 Flavor Boom, LLC d/b/a Flavor Boom!, 201 Broadway, for a new Common Victualler License with seating for 36 and proposed hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Jose Gomez "Starling" as proposed manager. This is a previously licensed location and no changes to the premises description.

Summary/Decision: Failed to notify abutters; matter will be rescheduled.

16. Application #1156296 Found in Central Square, LLC d/b/a Found, 5 Columbia Street, has applied for a new Second Hand Goods, Junk Dealers and/or Antiques. Premises described as: within the building commonly known as Market Central at 425 Massachusetts Avenue and 5 Columbia Street within two retail spaces known as Retail 8 and Retail 9 both on the ground floor and adjacent to each other separated by a common building hallway. The Retail 8 space is approximately 804 sq. ft. and has one entrance/exit. The Retail 9 space is approximately 1,075 sq. ft. with one entrance/exit. Rabindra Singh as Manager of Record and Hour of Operation of 12:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. Sunday, Tuesday & Wednesday and 12:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Thursday - Saturday.

Summary/Decision: Failed to notify abutters; matter will be rescheduled.

17. Disciplinary Barcelona Cambridge, LLC d/b/a Barcelona Wine Bar, 1688 Massachusetts Avenue, Common Victualler All Alcohol License #146333, for alleged (1) failure to provide proof of training in the safe service, sale and delivery of alcohol, (2) operation with an unapproved floorplan, and (3) operation over the licensed capacity on March 21, 2025 at approximately 10:15 p.m., in violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §§ 23 and 64; c. 140, § 9, c. 148 §34A, 204 C.M.R. 2.05(2), 527 C.M.R. 1.05 § 10.5.2.1, and Board Rules 2.2-2.6, 5.1, 5B.10, 9.1, 9.2, 9.3, and 14.

Present: Attorney Tyler Henseler; Lisa Teitelbaum; Elizabeth Sileo; and Investigator Tyler Bubenik.

Documents Considered: Hearing notice and documents attached thereto.

Summary: As part of a routine Task Force inspection, on March 21, 2025, Investigator Bubenik, ISD, and the Fire Department went to Barcelona and observed several violations. First, they requested the employees' TIPS certificates, which could not be produced because the prior manager had kept them on their personal device. Barcelona produced all 22 certificates by April 2nd. Eighteen were produced on March 22nd; the remaining four were produced on April 2nd because those employees' certificates had lapsed and needed to be renewed before returning to work. The certificates are now available on the licensee's shared computer system so any manager can access them. Second, there were 116 seats in the front of house but they are only licensed for 91. This was rectified within 20-30 minutes. Third, they were operating over the licensed capacity. Investigator Bubenik counted 98 people in the front of house (did not count the employees in back of house). Barcelona is currently only licensed for 91, including staff. The egresses were clear. The capacity and extra seat issue was rectified within 20-30 minutes.

A follow-up inspection revealed no violations. The Board expressed concern that they were confused as to their capacity despite them being informed of capacity on their application, renewals, and license. The Board informed the licensee the process to increase capacity.

Decision: Under advisement.

18. Disciplinary Horgan Enterprises, Leaf Blower Permit #10700, for alleged violations of CMC 8.16.081.3(9), noise emissions beyond 65 dBA, and 8.16.081.3(10), simultaneous use of blowers, at 950 Massachusetts Avenue on March 27, 2025.

Present: Dillon Horgan; Dan Horgan; and Investigator Tyler Bubenik.

Documents Considered: Hearing notice and documents attached thereto.

Summary: On March 27, 2025, Investigator Bubenik observed two employees of Horgan simultaneously operating two leaf blowers less than 100 feet apart form each other. When the equipment was inspected, Investigator Bubenik noticed one of the blowers was a Redmax EBZ8560, which has a manufacturer's noise emissions rating of 81 dBA (about 16 dBA over the maximum allowed by municipal code, which is 65 dBA). Horgan admitted to the violation and explained that they had started a new contract in Cambridge and were not aware of all the regulations in the City. Horgan requested leniency. The Board reminded Horgan that they have been permitted in Cambridge for eight years and has received multiple copies of the relevant laws in three languages and all updates on changes in the law, and every year Horgan attests that their equipment is compliant.

Decision: Violation (2 counts) \$300 fine per violation for a total fine of \$600.

Documents Considered: Application and documents attached thereto; and correspondence received in support of application.

Summary: We received a lot of correspondence in support of this application and the owner and manager Hannah Nip.

Decision: Granted.
