#### 21/365 Forum

On November 7, Councilor Decker's 21/365 Cambridge Against Domestic Violence Campaign will host its culminating community event from 5:30-9pm at Cambridge College. The forum hopes to generate deep learning among participants by featuring four speakers who will highlight best practices from work going on outside of Cambridge that will focus on community activism, men's role in domestic violence, as well as national and local trends in prevention. The formal presentations will be followed by a World Café style discussion. Councilor Decker has led a tremendous effort by City Departments, local service providers, and community members to bring up the level of awareness and community involvement in addressing the issues that impact Cambridge. Members of the Commission have signed up attend; all Cambridge residents are encouraged to attend as well.

### Public Health Report/CET Event

The Community Engagement Team (of which the Women's Commission is a member), along with the Cambridge Public Health Department, is hosting a CET Networking event, *Public Health Begins With You! How can providers best use the 2013 Cambridge Community Health Assessment data?* Achieving good health means more than having a doctor and insurance – it is

also about having opportunities for education and employment, feeling safe, having a network of friends and family, and living in a community that supports healthy choices. The event should be a rich discussion about health data and feedback gathered from area residents, students and workers, including the Women's Commissioners who participated in the survey.

# Poster aimed at parents about how to talk to their teens about relationships

We are releasing a poster, along with the Public Health Department, aimed at parents about how to have "the talk" about relationships with their kids. Concurrently, December's Women and Words! discussion is entitled, "How to Talk with Teens about Relationships: what parents and other concerned adults should know." This presentation was produced and presented by Transition House's Youth Action Corps (YAC), a team of Cambridge teens working within the community to promote safe, respectful, and health relationships for everyone.
