19th Amendment – 100 Years

The Women's Commission has been part of a group, meeting since April 2019, who are helping to bring a public art piece to Cambridge, commemorating the 100th anniversary. All the City Councilors are in support of this initiative. There is currently an RFQ out to artists. The location of the art has been narrowed down to 3 sites in the area – Joan Lorenz Park, Cambridge Common, and Tubman Square. The goal is the unveil the prototype for the piece in August of 2020.

The Commission is also working with two CRLS History teachers on a project called #hervote. This project will collect women's stories about voting, in a digital archive at Schlesinger.

Mapping Feminist Cambridge

There was considerable enthusiasm for the launch this summer. It was a resounding success! About 70 people attended the tours and Kimm is giving a tour to a class from CRLS next week, as well as three more autumn tours. We are currently working with Gilda Bruckner on business outreach to promote the guide to the Inman Square business community. Phyllis and Pamela will help with this push.
