Possible Action

SB62/HB1190-An Act relative to abusive practices to change sexual orientation and gender identity in minors

- Commonly referred to as the Conversion Therapy Ban Bill, it would prohibit state licensed mental health professionals from subjecting minors to conversion therapy practices to change sexual orientation and/or gender identity.
- Kimm will be giving testimony at the State House on June 6 during the hearing, please feel free to go and support them or hand your State Representative or Senator a letter in person, calling your Representatives and Senator is also recommended.
