2016-2017 Proposal:

- Nancy explained the process for developing the proposal (past meetings, consult with Exec. Committee and CYC)
- The Family Policy Council and CYC should continue doing the following:
 - Enhancing Family Policy Council partnerships

- Increase dialogue between Family Policy Council, CYC and the Superintendent and School Committee.
- Family Policy Council and CYC should work together more.
- Continue investigating the feasibility of creating a Find It Network in Cambridge that builds off of the Find It website project.
 - o Find It Cambridge Update will be on Family Policy Council agendas
 - Continue to support the hiring of a Find It Manager.
 - o Identify places to establish a Find It outposts (information hubs) for families.
- Continue supporting the Community Engagement Team
 - o CET updates will be on Family Policy Council agendas.

2. Addressing Opportunity Gaps in Cambridge

- DRAFT Problem Statement: There are disparities between those who have access to academic and extracurricular opportunities in high school, which is evident by the disproportionately lower number of people of color and/or low-income students taking advanced courses. *Is there anything missing or needs to be changed?*
 - o Need to define what we mean by "access".

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- DRAFT Goal: All students should be given adequate support, academic preparation, information and encouragement so that they all have equitable access to the educational and extracurricular opportunities available in high school (especially advanced classes).
 Is there anything missing or needs to be changed?
 - Is advocacy included?
 - Should we use a broader term instead of low income and/or people of color, use the term underprivileged
- DRAFT Summer Action Plan:
 - Draft a policy addressing how the city, school and community organizations can address the problem stated above (make sure equity, race and income issues are included).
 - Begin developing a process for convening stakeholders to address opportunity gaps in Cambridge:
 - Figure out which stakeholders (school, students, families, Agenda for Children, College Success Initiative, Middle School Network, Safetynet, STEAM, CET, 0-8 Council, Cambridge Teacher's Association, etc.) should be included in this work to connect the dots between the many initiatives and cross-collaborative planning efforts in Cambridge.
 - Start identifying current activities and existing efforts that can be enhanced. Then figure out how to communicate these opportunities to students and families.

- Other ideas? Is there anything missing? Does anything need to be changed?
- Need volunteers to help.
 - Family Policy Council and CYC members
 - Others?
 - Pass out sign-up sheet for volunteers.
- Survey Mayor's Youth Summer Employment (MYSEP) youth in order to get a better understanding of the experience of students who are and who are not taking advanced classes.
- Cambridge Youth Council will continue supporting other students.
 - Continue supporting 8th graders.
 - Continue to bring student leaders together to understand what is already being done to reduce Opportunity Gaps and create ways to work together
 - o Continue Cambridge Raw Perspectives Facebook campaign
 - Possible new initiatives start supporting 5th graders.
 - Work with Family Policy Council to create opportunities for students to share their stories with teachers, Upper School leadership, families and others in the community, as well as figure out a way to take action.
 - Work with the Family Policy Council to develop the policy(ies)
