Youth Involvement Subcommittee Update (5:42 pm)

• YIS has developed a series of interactive workshops for the youth centers to help middle school students feel supported and excited about their transition to high school.

Review and Vote for Community Engagement Team Proposal (5:53 p.m.)

- o Review process
- o Attendees' individually read proposals
 - Proposal number 1 "Increase the number of CET outreach workers":
 - Hire <u>two</u> additional outreach workers (either from new communities or from the communities we currently serve).
 - In addition, \$2,000 to increase the current outreach workers' hours to work on special projects.
 - Each additional outreach worker would engage approximately 50 families a year. If Cambridge Public Schools or other organizations gave the outreach workers parent contact information they could potentially reach many more than the 50 families reached in a typical year by outreach workers.
 - Total: \$17,335
 - Proposal number 2: "Develop city-wide comprehensive training program for outreach workers across city":
 - A comprehensive, high quality, and replicable training program, accessible to all levels including individuals with low English literacy skills, is crucial to the continued success of family engagement and outreach efforts in the city. This coordinated approach to training will enable city, school, and community-based-organizations to efficiently and effectively reach more families and support stronger partnerships between families and the organizations and institutions that serve them.
 - Will increase the capacity of outreach workers across the city to engage underserved families so families can access information and utilize Cambridge services
 - Outreach workers would have increased competence which would prepare them for more responsibilities to provide greater in-depth support for families
 - Collaborating organizations would increase their capacity to engage with families.
 - Total: \$8,726
- o Conversation
 - Outreach workers: Currently CET has two Outreach Workers working with the Haitian communities and can greatly see the benefit of the pair – splitting up geographically, can reach more families, in an even more culturally competent way
 - Training Series: Would be accessible to low English literacy folks and would be open to all. The outcomes include: increased competence in outreach workers, collaborating agencies will have increased capacity to reach their own family networks. A network of outreach workers that can peer support each other would be developed, creating a strong cadre – who have a better understanding of other services offered in the city, saving time and money and doesn't duplicate work
