■ Youth Equity and Inclusion

- Center youth voices, especially youth from historically underserved or marginalized communities,
- Create opportunities for youth to share their perspectives,

experiences, and help make decisions.

■ Individualized Support

- Develop support systems that meet the unique needs of our children and teens.
- Take into account thriving varies among individuals and looks different across cultural and generational lines.

■ Prevention Focus

- Shift from a reactive and penalizing "sick-care" model to a wellness approach.
- Emphasize early intervention and proactive measures.
- Focus on positive youth development, resilience, and strong relationships.

■ Community Engagement and Collective Action

- Create a comprehensive and cohesive support network that includes our entire community.
- Engage and collaborate with community providers, partners, leaders, families, and youth
