*\*All registrants must complete the REGISTRATION form, DHSP form, pink Emergency Card and a yearly academic registration fee of \$25.00\**

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:**

Formal registration will be held on Tuesday, September 11<sup>th</sup> from 5:30-7:00pm. Please use the Walker Street entrance of the Graham & Parks School. A lottery system is used in which you pick a number & are called to register in that order. The line moves very quickly. Piano lesson slots are saved. Thereafter, registration is ongoing daily 2:30-5:30pm in the Community Center OR completed forms & checks may be left in the Graham & Parks main office. **NO REGISTRATION FORMS ACCEPTED ON THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES.** A waiting list will be taken for each course. Full payment is expected at the time of registration however, a payment plan may be requested. Make checks, money orders (no cash) payable to "Community Schools." One check for total amount per family. Your check is your receipt. If a class is full, you will be notified. If you are not notified, assume that your child is enrolled. Returned check fee is \$25 and must be paid within 48 hours to avoid disruption in your child's schedule.

- Linnaean Neighborhood Council meeting and supper held on first Tuesdays, bi-monthly at 5:30pm. Everyone welcome!
- Children who need supervision before 3:15 must register for the Afterschool Activities Club (AAC) which meets from 2:25-3:15 (Fee: \$40.00/day covers the entire term). Please note which days your child will attend on his/her registration form.
- Classes will be held on Early Release Days. Special activities are offered from 12:30-3:15. Fee: \$30.00 per day, \$150 for the academic year. Please register in advance; separate registration form available.
- No refunds after the first week, but children may choose another course, space permitting. Partial refunds given for medical reasons. Refunds are not issued for missed classes.
- If a class is not fully enrolled, the class may be cancelled. You will be notified and given a refund, or an alternative class choice.
- Children must remain in the Community School Center while waiting for classes or to be pick-up.
- We are only responsible for children during the class time.
- Pick-up is expected as soon as classes end. Late pick-up fees charged at a rate of \$1.00/minute, and must be paid within 48 hours. Children will only be released to those you have authorized. If there is any change in pick-up arrangements the director should be notified in advance.
- Please notify us by phone if your child will be absent from the program: 617-349-6267.
- It is the parent's responsibility to notify their child's classroom teacher as to their Community School schedule.
- Children with restricted diets/allergies must indicate so on registration form and bring their own snack. Epi-pens must be provided to Community Schools in case of emergency.
- Partial scholarships available to families who qualify. Please request a financial aid form. Income verification via 4 current paystubs from each parent. All information provided kept confidential. Deadline October 5.
- If you have an outstanding balance with any Department of Human Service Program, your child's registration will not be accepted until all payments are made.
- Office hours 2:00-6:00 daily and Mondays & Thursdays until 7:00.
- Classes are not held on city holidays, snow days or on days the Cambridge Public Schools are closed.
