FOR CHILDREN GETTING THEIR FIRST LIBRARY CARD

In Cambridge, you must be at least five years old to get a library card. We wait until you are five because all library cards come with the same privileges.

This means you may borrow anything you want with your library card and as many things as you can take care of. We always encourage families to talk together about what works best for them.

It also means that you come into your privacy rights right away. We can never know when children will need their privacy rights for the first time, so we assume everyone needs them immediately. With your privacy rights, no one else may use your card or know what you have checked out without your permission—not your brother, or your friend, or your cousin, or your grownup. You are responsible for whatever is on your card, so you don't want to let anyone else use it.

Try to keep your card in a safe place where you will always know where it is, but if you lose your card, please let us know right away. You aren't in trouble if you lose your card—we just want to replace it so that no one else can find the card and use it.
