Part I Total Crime

An examination of serious crime statistics for the first seven months of 2020 reveals a minor increase of 2% in the Part One index total for Cambridge when compared with 2019. Over the first 31 weeks of this year, there were 1,347 serious crimes reported in the City. For the same time period in 2019, the combined total for Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny & Auto theft was 1,322 incidents, 25 fewer than this year. When measured against the five-year average, a slight decline of 1% has been registered, with 20 fewer crimes recorded so far this year than the projected total of 1,367 incident

Further analysis of the crime totals for the first seven months of 2020 indicates that violent crimes recorded a modest 6% increase so far this year, while property crimes registered a slight 1% upward trend, with 15 additional crimes reported when compared with the same time frame in 2019.

The slight incline for violent crime (+6%) can be attributed to a series of street robberies (+26% for year) of food delivery drivers during February and the identified trend since the first week of May of homeless-versus-homeless predatory crimes. On April 23rd, Jose Bermudez was arrested for the fatal daylight stabbing of a homeless man in Central Square on April 14. Bermudez is being held without bail. This was the first and only murder in Cambridge since January of 2019.

When monitoring the serious crime totals of July versus the previous month of June of 2020, a 7% dip in the number of index incidents was measured with 15 fewer crimes counted in the seventh month of this year. After 18 weeks of comparative data to analyze the effect that COVID-19 and social distancing are having on the crime rate in our City, the following emerging trends have been identified: larcenies of bicycles (44% over the 5-year average), thefts of packages, psychiatric-related calls, a surging wave of commercial burglaries (90% above 2019 with Harvard Square a hotspot), and the continued increase in domestic-related calls. The explosion in calls for service for fireworks, and a deluge of unemployment frauds that peaked in June, were on the wane over the final two weeks of July.


