Pleasant Street Closure

Between Massachusetts Avenue & Western Avenue

Dear Neighbor,

In association with the Western Avenue Reconstruction Project, the City's Contractor, D'Allessandro Corp., is expected to install a new water main, sewer line, and drain line on Pleasant Street between Massachusetts Avenue and Western Avenue. Weather permitting, **the closure is expected to go into effect during the week of February 17 (after the President's Day Holiday)**. Due to the nature of the work, the street closure will be in effect for 4 weeks. Detour signage will direct motorists to an alternative route. Pleasant Street abutters will maintain access throughout the duration of the street closure.

What to expect during construction

- General work hours will be from 7AM to 4PM, Monday thru Friday.
- Motorists, except for abutters will not be able to access Pleasant Street between Massachusetts Avenue and Western Avenue during general work hours.
- Police officers will be onsite to assist with traffic management.
- "No Parking" signs will be posted at least 24 hours in advance of construction. Please be sure to check posted signs for exact date and times.
- Every effort will be made to limit the amount of noise generated, but excavators, saws and other equipment are required to complete the work.
