
How can we support a mix of vibrant, local, and small businesses that serve the everyday needs of nearby residents, workers, and visitors alike?




ground floor spaces on Cambridge Street?



% OF LINEAR FEET


Work to maintain a supply of affordable commercial spaces for local businesses by:

- > leveraging new development to subsidize more affordable storefronts






Support activity throughout the day for a range of users (nearby residents, workers, and visitors) by:



- > exploring ways to provide incentives for landlords to keep rents low



Encourage higher density mixed use development and more housing units along Cambridge Street while maintaining the existing character of the Street by:

- > considering zoning changes such as changing setback, parking, and height requirements
- > favoring mixed use development over single-story commercial
- > exploring programs that incentivize mixed use buildings (active storefronts on the first floor and residential units above)

KEEP IN MIND LESS DENSITY:


 Can result in more expensive housing
Parking minimums further drive up development costs (\$30k/space) - Cannot support subsidy on storefront space pricing

INCREASE HEIGHTS TO SUPPORT MORE DENSITY

KEEP IN MIND MORE DENSITY:

- Can create more middle income housing units - Can better support transit

- Can help subsidize affordable storefront space for local businesses



When new development arises, encourage a mix of unit types that accommodate different household sizes and stages of life, so that families and seniors can continue to call Cambridge Street home by:

- encouraging family friendly units near Cambridge Street (for example first floor 3brs and 1brs for seniors)
- > prioritizing universal accessibility in new construction housing
- > exploring the creation of home retrofit grants









Look for opportunities to enhance the street for people **WALKING** by:


- > ensuring safe crossings at intersections
- > repairing uneven sidewalks and keeping them clear of obstructions
- > enhancing pedestrian comfort through more seating, trees/shade, and community gathering spaces
- > improving walkability and safe crossings to better access the new Union Square Green Line Station.
- > encouraging groundfloor opportunities for open space in new development to create wider sidewalks, where appropriate




Look for opportunities to enhance the street to enable **DELIVERIES** to be made to support local businesses by:


Look for opportunities to enhance the street for visitors **PARKING** private vehicles by:

- > examining the possibility to share the parking garage facility during off hours at the King Open School






Look for opportunities to enhance the street for people **BICYCLING** by:

- incorporating bicycle amenities (parking, etc.) along the length of the street and at key destinations




Look for opportunities to enhance the street for people TAKING TRANSIT & PARATRANSIT by:

- enhancing bus stops to provide comfortable seating and shade
- > considering curb access for paratransit

Maximize all open spaces as community assets to cultivate community interaction by:

- > transforming existing public spaces (like the future Grand Junction Trail Intersection at Cambridge Street, Vellucci Park at the future Grand Junction Trail, Valente Branch Library, the former Lechmere Station, etc.) to be more comfortable and welcoming for people of all ages
- partnering with private property owners to create new temporary public spaces on underutilized spaces or parking lots



WHAT ARE YOUR IDEAS FOR ACTIVATING UNDERUTILIZED SPACES ON CAMBRIDGE STREET?



Integrate measures to adapt Cambridge Street for climate resiliency by:

- supporting urban biodiversity by increasing tree cover, landscaping, and permeability of hard surfaces in the public right of way
- advocating for cool roofs, solar canopies, shade structures, and other climate adaptation measures on existing buildings, as appropriate, and new development to reduce heat impacts
- exploring the feasibility of shared green energy and efficient systems for private property owners
- > mitigating street flooding by incorporating green infrastructure
