Potential NZTP Actions

A few big-picture reminders on why we're making this plan

- 1. If we don't get rid of emissions from transportation and other sources, climate change impacts will make people's lives harder and cost more.
- 2. City of Cambridge is committed to eliminating emissions but we can influence how that happens. We want a plan that is based on your advice.
 - In cases where change is hard, how can we reduce the harm or the discomfort of that shift?
- 3. We want to improve and expand people's transportation options.
 - We believe we can create a plan that allows everyone to contribute in some way. Not every action or option works for every person, so we need a variety of options.
 - "Don't punish me for owning a car. Make it easier for me not to."


Active Transportation

- Reducing Car Trips actions reduce GHG emissions by giving people more travel choices to reduce car trips.
- Buses, Trains, & Shuttles actions reduce GHG emissions by improving bus, subway, and paratransit options.

Aiming for 100% GHG Emissions Reduction



Reducing Car Trips Proposed Actions



RCT-1. Make the Parking and Transportation Demand Management Ordinance apply to more people. Increase the emphasis on parking cash-out options

Assumptions

- 50% of employees and patrons not currently covered by program would be covered by expanded program
- This action would expand PTDM to cover 60% of employees in Cambridge (a 50% increase)

Remove climate pollution from transportation

Improve mobility

Improve economic opportunity and address historic injustices

Supportive Policy

Proposed Actions

RCT-2. Dedicate City budget funding to support community-led initiatives that improve multimodal or low-carbon transportation options that support deepening relationships between the City, residents, employers, and property owners

Assumptions

- Improve communication between the City, community members, and local businesses to find solutions that work better for everyone
- Expand funding for Community Engagement Team Outreach Workers and neighborhood ambassadors
- Dedicate funds and staff resources to relationship-building initiatives and projects that fall outside of typical funding streams

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Reducing Car Trips Proposed Actions



RCT-3. Expand existing coordination with neighboring municipalities to shift commute trips out of cars

Assumptions

- Communicate regularly with neighboring municipalities to develop regional solutions to traffic
 - Example: In 2020, Cambridge began monthly meetings to work on a coordinated PTDM regulation approach with 5 neighbor communities
- Present unified advocacy to state officials on policies needed for the region

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Buses, Trains, & Shuttles

Proposed Actions



BT-1. Enable better bus frequency and reliability by installing bus priority projects on important routes (signal priority, queue jumps, or bus lanes), and collaborate regionally to improve MBTA bus service

Assumptions

- By 2050, bus headways will need to improve 200% on average or 3x as many buses per hour
- This increase will be implemented to 50% of routes, the most heavily used

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Buses, Trains, & Shuttles

Proposed Actions



BT-2. Collaborate regionally to improve service on the Door2Door service and expand eligibility

Assumptions

- Less than 1% emission reduction from congestion pricing
- Provide 25% more rides on the Door2Door service (from 400 to 500 rides a day for Cambridge residents)
- Increase service hours
- Expand the eligible trip types beyond healthcare and food-access trips to include social and family-supportive trips
- Allow people with low incomes living more than a 15-minute walk to transit to ride

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Buses, Trains, & Shuttles

Proposed Actions



BT-3. Offer discounted transit fares for residents who don't own cars

Assumptions

- Provide a 50% reduction in transit fare to non-car owners
- Applicable to 100% of the MBTA system
