Inner Mount Auburn Corridor Safety

Improvements

- Substantially complete as of Friday September 25
- Short section of queue jump shared bus-bike lane on Mount **Auburn Street**
- Banks Street to Putnam with far-side "receiving" lane
- Transit signal



Inner Mount Auburn Corridor Safety Improvements

- City staff will be seeking feedback from MBTA bus operations and transit priority teams
- Ongoing implementation of related cycling infrastructure project on Quincy & Bow **Streets**



River Street Reconstruction

- Community event planned for late October virtual "open house"
- Staff will be seeking input from TAC members at November 2020 TAC meeting – November 4, 2020
 - Busway design elements
 - Route 47 change proposal
- Ongoing review by MBTA staff on Carl Barron Plaza/Central Square Busway proposals - Planning, operations, transit priority, systemwide accessibility










Concord Ave. Signal Priority



 - Reflecting desire to improve bus travel times and pedestrian safety while separated cycling infrastructure



 - Review initial application and communicate comments to city staff



325 Binney Street Project

- Planning Board hearing on October 20
 - Developer to fund construction of **Grand Junction MUP**
 - Developer to submit a PTDM plan, currently being finalized
 - Developer submitted TIS, City reviewing to negotiate mitigation measures
- Potential TAC actions
 - Review application and communicate comments to city staff



- MBTA Red Line / Orange Line Transformation
 - New vehicles are delayed as a result of manufacturing slowdowns forecast to be delayed by 1-1.25 years
 - Full fleet of RL vehicles now expected in late 2024
- MBTA Fare Transformation (formerly known as AFC 2.0)
 - To install renewed faregates through December 2020
- MBTA Green Line Extension
 - State hosted "half-way" event on Thursday October 1
