Inman Square Reconstruction - Cambridge Street and Hampshire Street

Reconfigured intersection with:

- new public plaza on the northern/eastern corner
- separate traffic signals instead of 1 single traffic signal
 Street design changes:
- Separated bike lanes through intersection
- "Floating" bus stops
- Peak-hour queue jump on eastbound Cambridge Street

In progress

Inman Square Reconstruction - Cambridge Street and Hampshire Street

Return of two-way Cambridge Street expected later in November. This will result in:

- Route 69 returning to Cambridge Street in both directions serving bus stops on Cambridge Street at:
 - To Harvard: Prospect Street and Springfield Street
 - To Lechmere: Opposite Oak St and at Prospect Street
- Route 83 stops will return to existing locations

MassAve4 Harvard Square Bus Stops

The Cycling Safety Ordinance requires that there be separated bike lanes on all of Mass Ave.

This project will build separated bike lanes throughout Harvard Square. The bike lanes at bus stops must be carefully designed to minimize conflict, provide enough waiting space for bus riders, and create comfortable facility for people walking and biking.

Looking at short sections of dedicated bus lanes.

MBTA Updates

Online applications for reduced fares

The MBTA launched online applications for reduced fare programs in 2022. People can apply, renew, or replace their reduced fare cards. This includes the:

- Blind Access CharlieCard
- Transportation Access Pass
- Senior CharlieCard
- Youth Pass

Discounts include 50% off one-way trips or tickets, \$10 7-day LinkPass, and \$30 monthly LinkPass.

Commuter Rail Fare Gates

The MBTA added fare gates at North Station in October.

All riders must tap, swipe, or scan a ticket to enter the waiting area, food stands, and platforms.

People exiting trains will also need to tap, swipe, or scan a ticket in order to exit.



North Cambridge Carhouse

The MBTA will be converting the North Cambridge Carhouse (2375 Mass Ave.) from an electric trolleybus carhouse to a battery electric bus facility.

MBTA is preparing engineering plans and designs this year. In 2023, the MBTA plans to build and install equipment.

Diesel buses currently run on Routes 71 and 73


Trolleybuses had their last day of service in March 2022.

Silver Line Extension

The project team identified 7 alternative routings to evaluate.

- SL3 Extensions (Group 1)
- SL6 New Route (Group 2)

City staff expect a working group meeting in Nov/Dec and a public meeting in the winter.



Realtime signage

The MBTA communicated that they are working on implementing a municipal program to install elnk signs through the MBTA.

These will be very similar to their pilot signs. We have had challenges with sign vendors in our own pilot.
