Minutes of the Joint Meeting of the Cambridge Historical Commission (acting as a Historic District Study Committee) and the Reservoir Hill Neighborhood Conservation District Study Committee

The members of the study committees met in the parking lot of the Armenian Church (rear of 141 Brattle Street) at 5:00 P.M.

Charles Sullivan led the walking tour of the neighborhood beginning with Brewster Street. The group toured Sparks, Highland, Appleton, Reservoir and Fayerweather streets. Mr. Sullivan remarked on the history of land owners, development, styles of architecture and notable residents.

The committee noted the geography of the area, size of lots, setbacks, and architectural features. Large scale renovations were noted at 77 Sparks Street, 1 Highland Street, 17 Highland Street, 24 Highland Street, 71 Appleton Street, 88 Appleton Street, 89 Appleton Street,

Mr. Sullivan explained his reasoning for excluding the cul de sacs from the study area. He said Clement Circle could have been included but it was so densely developed, very little could be built there without zoning relief. He noted new construction at 2 Hemlock Road and BB&N middle school's addition.

George Mabry of 77 Sparks Street asked how a contemporary house would be treated in a historic district. Mr. Sullivan explained the review process and how a district commission is tasked with determining what is appropriate to the age and style of a particular building or at least what is not incongruous. He noted that there were buildings from a wide time period located in the Old Cambridge Historic District. In a side conversation with Mr. Mabry, Mr. Sullivan indicated that 77 and 80 Sparks could probably be removed from the boundaries of a proposed district since they were on the edge of the study area and retained limited development potential since they had already had extensive modifications and additions.

Mr. Sullivan noted that the large retaining wall at 17 Highland Street appeared out of character with the neighborhood. He also noted that high fences at the front of some properties could have a negative impact on the pedestrian experience of the neighborhood. The grading and fences of the new house at 46 Fayerweather Street were one example.

Several sites were noted where mid twentieth century modern houses had been located but were

since demolished. Mr. Sullivan spoke about the history of the site of the Cambridge Reservoir. He noted

that neither district designation nor landmark status could protect trees or house interiors, as had been the

case at the Weld House of 28 Fayerweather Street. Only a preservation restriction could protect interior

features. A new preservation restriction was being donated by the owner of 50 Fayerweather Street and

included interior features of the house that had originally built as a stable and converted to a dwelling by

Lois Lilley Howe.

Mr. Young moved to adjourn the meeting, which was approved unanimously. The meeting

adjourned at 7:00 P.M.
