VI. National Register/Preservation Planning.

1. Orchard Street NRD. This nomination will be finalized as staff becomes available.
2. Harvard 106 agreement. No developments.
3. MIT 106 agreement. No developments.
4. Digitizing Inventory. The Commission's inventory of all 13,000 buildings in Cambridge exists only in paper form and occupies 31 file drawers. We have a \$30,000 CPA appropriation on hand. We are designing a demonstration project with input from Cambridge assessing and GIS departments and digitizing survey files for a single block in East Cambridge. The next step is a beta project to allow us to test the consultant's model.

VII. Publications

1. *Building Old Cambridge*. Four thousand copies were printed; **as of January 15, 2018, 1,797 had left the warehouse, and net sales totaled \$48,002**. The index has been digitized and made available on the internet.

2. Oral history publications. We are considering reprinting *Crossroads: Stories of Central Square* (2001), and *Cambridge City Hall* (1990), which have gone out of print.
3. *Cambridge Street Names*. Volunteer Michael Kenney has updated a catalogue of city streets originally compiled by City Engineer Lewis Hastings in the 19th century. **Michael has finally completed his project and we will soon post it on the CHC website.**
4. *Cambridge Mayors*. Kit and Michael Kenney are preparing longer biographies of the mayors and other city officials whose portraits hang in City Hall. These will be published as a booklet.
5. Out of print publications. The MIT Press is exploring the possibility of digitizing *Report Two: Mid Cambridge* (1967), *Report Five: Northwest Cambridge* (1977), and *East Cambridge* (1988) and releasing them as open access PDFs to be hosted on archive.org.

VIII. Archives and Collections (Emily Gonzalez)

1. **Survey Files Database Project: Updated survey file item types glossary for scanning vendors. Met with consultant Paul Cote, Charles Sullivan, and Meta Partenheimer, Digitization Assistant, to discuss the glossary and Cote's phase 2 proposal. We are now working on revising these project documents for E-Gov funding.**
2. **Library: Archives Assistant Emily Magagnosc continues adding call numbers to our research library books, as well as performing preservation storage and repairs as needed.**
3. **Collections: Meta Partenheimer has been cross-referencing subject headings in the Boston Globe newspaper clippings collection to facilitate researcher discovery. Meta also checked the finding aids on our website against completed finding aids in our collection, to ensure our website is up to date. Former CHC staff member and now volunteer Allison Crump completed entering data from the 1880-1890 building removal files from the City Clerk's office; she is now locating the moved buildings. Volunteer Kathleen Fox continues cataloguing our recently donated E.F. Bowker collection of surveyors' papers and plans.**
4. **Social Media Outreach: Weekly Instagram posts and semi-weekly blog posts, highlighting interesting collections and newly digitized items.**
5. **Additional Activities: The second archives open house for city employees on February 12 will be about candy-making in Cambridge. Applied for a Simmons archive intern and interviewed three Simmons students for a library cataloging internship. The archives staff took a training course in Sitecore, allowing us to upload finding aids and other new archives materials to the website. Began planning Open Archives 2018.**

X. Capital Projects

1. Bronze maintenance. All municipal bronze plaques and statues are repatinated periodically. Weathering has been minimal so we keep postponing from year to year.
2. Old Burying Ground. Fannin\Lehrner Associates resumed work on headstones on May 30, and Dario Fiorentini has completed restoration of the long brick tomb and a table tomb that had to be dismantled several years ago.
