

Q12 If you live on Pearl Street or on one of the side streets off of Pearl, do you have a driveway or other private parking space for your car(s)?



Q13 Does your household own (a) bike(s)? If yes, how many?



Q14 Do you have children under age 18 that live in your home?





Q22 What do you identify as your gender?



Q23 As of your most recent birthday, what is your age?


