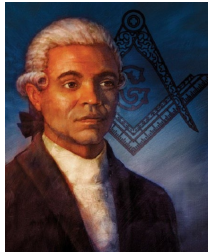




VETERANS' SERVICES HISTORY

PRINCE HALL HISTORY

Prince Hall was an African American abolitionist and one of the most influential free Black leaders in the late 1700s. He was one of the first Black Americans to be made a mason in America on March 6, 1775, in Boston. He also founded the African Lodge of the Honorable Society of Free and Accepted Masons of Boston, the world's first lodge of Black Freemasonry and the first society in American history devoted to social, political, and economic improvement. The African Lodge #1 was established on July 3, 1776, one day before the United States Declaration of Independence was adopted and issued on July 4, 1776.
